




CONSECRATION TO JESUS THROUGH MARY

St. Louis de Montfort (1673-1716), who popularized this powerful devotion during his lifetime and through his book "True Devotion to Mary," explains that, because Jesus chooses to come to us through Mary, we also return to Him through her. He assures us that going to Jesus through Mary is "the easiest, shortest, most perfect and secure way of obtaining union with our Lord." He continues and says, "Since she is the sure means, the direct and



immaculate way to Jesus and the perfect guide to him, it is through her that souls who are to shine forth in sanctity must find him." St. John Paul II read St. Louis' book while in his early 20s and said it was "a decisive turning point in my life ..." This 'perfect devotion' is indispensable to anyone who means to give himself without reserve to Christ and to the work of redemption." The Saints and the long history of the Church



teach us that consecration to Jesus through Mary is a powerful act with great consequences for our holiness and spiritual growth.

Traditionally, a Consecration to Jesus through Mary is preceded by 33 days of preparation, in which the participant learns more deeply about what it means to consecrate oneself to Our Lady and enters into a deeper spirit of prayer. During the 33 days, the person says specific prayers and reads daily reflections, for the purpose of doing the Consecration more perfectly. As well, these meditations will help the participant to understand better what Consecration to Jesus through Mary really means.

People can participate by beginning the preparation on April 28, the feast of St. Louis de Montfort and ending on the May 31st, the feast of the Visitation. It can also be done and scheduled to end on any Marian holi-

day. There are various resources one can use for the 33 days of preparation including "True Devotion to Mary" by St. Louis de Montfort, "33 Days to Morning Glory" by Fr. Michael Gaitley, or "The Fruit of Her Womb" by Fr. Boniface Hicks. There are apps, websites and pamphlets as well.

May we all unite in this spiritually powerful practice and bring a torrent of grace upon our lives.



Constitutional Amendments on Abortion

Florida – The fate of the proposed amendment to the state's constitution, that will add a right to abortion before the point of "viability," has been decided. The validity of the amendment (overly vague, broad, and misleading) was challenged, and the Florida Supreme Court recently ruled that the proposed abortion amendment will be allowed to be on the ballot this November. At the same time, the Florida Supreme Court handed down a ruling on a separate case regarding abortion, in which Planned




Parenthood and the ACLU challenged the constitutionality of the state's 15-week abortion limit. The Court ruled that the 15-week gestational limitation abortion law is constitutional and does not violate the right to privacy. This ruling likely paves the way for other legislation that protects mothers and their children.

The abortion amendment that will be voted on by the citizens of Florida in November will erase current pro-life protections, could eliminate parental consent and safety protocols for women and girls, and allow for abortions later in pregnancy if a woman's doctor deems it necessary to end the life of her child. An article in the *Tallahassee Democrat* suggests that this amendment is intended to enshrine unregulated abortion in the state constitution. Abortion facilities should be licensed and meet medically appropriate health and safety standards. Yet, according to Americans United for Life, Florida's abortion facilities have a history of deficiencies and substandard abortion care. "Women will suffer under the proliferation of unregulated abortion in Florida if the amendment is adopted. As Justice Francis noted, the amendment seeks to eliminate 'any meaningful, future participation by the Legislature,' which would be prohibited from enacting new laws to respond to growing evidence of abortion's medical harms."

The initiative will require at least 60% approval from voters.








Jonathan Albano

Food Handlers Licensing:

We are requesting that all bothers that are helping in any of the different activities that we do that involve food preparation, cooking, or kitchen work please get a "Food Handler" license. We have tried 2 different online courses, each of them took about one and a half to two



hours to complete the training and the finial test. Once the test is passed you will be able to print out a certificate for the training. The training is good for 3 years. The finial exam was about 50% common sense, and the balance of the questions were of information in the training. If we passed the test, we are sure that you could pass it also. If you take the training and provide us with a copy of your certificate and receipt, the council will cover the cost! Please help us to make sure that we protect the people that we serve and they enjoy the food that we provide for these events.
