The earnings came from commissions – 10 percent of net sales – and tips. The commissions totaled \$15,609. However, the big revenue source was credit card tips, which totaled \$16,235. In addition, the Councils received \$1,532 in cash tips. After deducting expenses, Incarnation Council's share was \$15.412.
