Happy New Year! May each of us, along with our families, be blessed with a prosperous new year filled with good health.



On January 3rd each year, the Church celebrates the Optional Memorial of the Most Holy Name of Jesus. The name Jesus was given to Mary by the Archangel Gabriel

at the Annunciation. We can look to scripture to highlight the heavenly emphasis on the name of Jesus:

Then the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." Luke 1:30-33



Field Agent – Larry Kennedy "New Year Resolutions"



Happy New Year! I hope all of you had a joyous and merry Christmas.

All of us start the new year afresh. We make resolutions. Let's plan now to look back at the end of 2024 and be able to say, "I kept those resolutions to improve myself, to improve my relationship with my family and friends, and

relationship with my family and friends, and my relationship with God!" An improved prayer life is the goal of many. I know I've made that resolution almost every year. Some years I do better than others.

But here are few things I've found about making resolutions that helped me.

First, I don't want to make a resolution that is not possible to keep. I've got to be realistic. I can't go to an extreme. For example, to improve my prayer life, I can't go from praying for 15 minutes in the morning to reading a chapter of the Bible, attending daily Mass, reciting the rosary, and saying the Liturgy of the Hours each day. For me, that's too much of a jump. I'm going to follow that for a day or two and then something will get me off track. Myself, I need to take baby steps. Maybe start with saying the rosary each day. I've got to make my resolution achievable.

The same is true of all those other resolutions we make.

I can't go from being a couch potato to running six miles a day...but I could start by walking a mile each day as an achievable step in that direction.

I can't starve myself trying to lose weight...but I could cut out snacks between meals as a start. Again, an achievable step.

I might want to read more, so I can start by reading a chapter a day in a book.

You get the idea. The resolution has to be reasonable, achievable, and specific.

Now here is one resolution that is reasonable, achievable, and specific: Resolve to meet with me to update the information on your family's financial needs analysis. (Or maybe you need to complete a financial needs analysis.) Let's see where you stand. Your financial health is critical to your family's future security. As your field agent I'm charged to meet with each of my members each year. We can take a look at your goals and aspirations and make sure you're on track to keep your family appropriately protected.

I'll contact you soon to see if an appointment should be our next step.





Florida District #17 Councils Distribute 'Coats for Kids'

District Deputy Greg Gully invited all of District #17 councils to participate in the Supreme Council 'Coats for Kids' Program. The 'Coats for Kids' is a featured community

program under the Knight's Faith in Action Model Program. DD Gully announced that the Supreme Council was offering a 'Buy One Get One' (BOGO) promotion in October. The promotion stated that for each case of

24 coats that a council ordered, they would get an additional case of 24 coats at no additional charge. All councils in the district participated, including Notre Dame Council 10514 (Flagler Beach), St. Mary's Council 11961 (Korona), and Mother Seton Council 17480 Mother Seton (Palm Coast). District #17 Warden, Owen Thompson, assisted DD Gully in administering the BOGO program for the district.

Grand Knight Ralph Esposito of Mother Seton Council 17480 and Grand Knight Darren Maloney of St. Mary's Council 11961 teamed up to distribute coats at the St. Elizabeth Parish Hall in Palm Coast. Brothers Mike VanHeusen and Dennis Boucher coordinated the coat distribution. A special \$500 donation was made by Cable Works USA to help fund the local coat program in Palm Coast. The focus of the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton coat distribution were the individuals that come to the parish's outreach mission (see photo at bottom of page).

GK Jerry Chabon and Community Director Dan Wiggens worked with the Flagler County Education Foundation to distribute coats purchased by Notre Dame Council 10514

through their S.T.U.F.F. Bus Initiative. The S.T.U.F.F. Bus, which stands for Supplying Things U Find Fundamental, provides essential supplies and clothing to students and their families experiencing

economic difficulties. Supplies include, but are not limited to: new and gently used clothing, jackets, hygiene products, shoes, undergarments, and school supplies. (Pictured below with S.T.U.F.F. A total of 192 coats were distributed from the councils in District #17 to benefit kids in need.

Since 'Coats for Kids' launched in 2009, Knights have distributed coats in all 50 U.S. states and all 10 Canadian provinces — including on U.S. military bases and Native American and First Nation reservations in the U.S. and Canada. Internationally, Knights of Columbus councils currently distribute approximately 200,000 coats to children in need each year. Coats for Kids exemplifies the Knights of Columbus' mission of charity and providing for the most vulnerable members of society.

Safe Haven Baby Box

DGK Bryant Perszyk joined Palm Coast Fire Chief Kyle Berryhill as they made a formal presentation to the Palm Coast City Council. Brother Perszyk explained to the council

the purpose of the Safe Haven Baby Box and how the funding would be administered. Fire Chief Berryhill outlined the technical aspects of how the Safe Haven Baby Box would be installed and monitored. He explained how it would tie into the current Florida Safe Haven law.



constructing and installing the box will cost \$24,650. Notre Dame Council 10514 will cover 100% of these costs. Bro. Perszyk stressed the fact that all of the Knights of Columbus

councils in Flagler County as well as organizations across the city fundraised for the box. Specifically, the Kiwanis Club and the Belle Terre Elementary School's Kiwanis K-Kids have fundraised for and donated funds to help make the baby box funding possible.

The plan is for the Baby Box to be installed at Fire Station 25, located at 1250 Belle Terre Parkway, since is it is considered to be the most centrally located in Palm Coast. The total cost of the purchase and installation of the box is \$40,956, with an annual fee of \$500. Purchasing and shipping the box to Palm Coast will cost \$16,306 while




