Brother Knights,

I just completed our Council's Annual Survey of Fraternal Activities. This report captures all of the Hours of Service and Charitable Disbursements our Council provided in all of 2024. It covers all of the Faith in Action Programs and Activities, Meetings and Other Fraternal Commitments such as Visits to the Sick, Bereaved, etc... I am humbled by the results and I am so proud of our council's commitments to our principals of Charity, Unity and Fraternity.

We expended over 9,000 service hours and donated over \$93,000 to the various charitable causes we support. Way to go Brothers!! We also have some very generous parishioners whose donations had significant impact of what we were able to accomplish in 2024. Thanks to all Brothers who continue to be active in all of our causes.

I believe we can do even more in 2025 if we have more Brothers actively involved in our Faith in Action Programs. So, to that, I am "borrowing" some of PGK Bob Conochalla's February 2024 report. His words are as appropriate today as they were a year ago.

"Think back to when you were asked to join the Knights of Columbus. What made you say yes to whoever popped the question? Did you join because you felt pressured? Did you join because your wife said you needed to do something to get out of the house? Or, did you join because you wanted to give back to your parish, your parish family, and other Catholic men and to your family?"

I challenge all Brothers to answer the question of why did you join the Knights of Columbus? Is there a more active role you can play in our Council? It seems as though the 80/20 rule applies to our council. Where 80% or more of the work is being done by 20% or less of the members.

I want to remind everyone that the first and foremost principle of our Order is Charity, the greatest of all virtues and the crowning glory of a Christian life. But the true meaning of charity is often lost today. It is not merely a feeling, nor is it solely a gift of time, talent or treasure. It is more than almsgiving. It is more than good works. The greatest act of charity the world has ever known is the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, who freely and willingly offered Himself for us on the Cross. Christ's redeeming love is the

true measure of charity. Charity is a heart that sees Christ in our neighbor. And through the power of the Holy Spirit, we can, like Christ, make a sincere gift of ourselves to others.

Charity is that priceless gift placed by God in the human soul to measure man's allegiance to his Creator. Charity is a duty, not a courtesy. It is an obligation imposed by Heaven upon rich and poor alike. Charity moves the heart to comfort and console, advise and instruct, bear and forgive. In God and with God, we love even those we do not know. This is the charity that evangelizes. This is the charity that gladdens the heart.

As PGK Conochalla stated last year, **"when you said yes to becoming a Knight, you wanted to get involved with something special. You wanted to give back. I feel that being a Knight of Columbus should not be interference in life. It should be a part of your life."**

There is a role that each of us can play in our Council that will gladden the heart of those we serve and of ourselves. I can't think of a better way to give back for all the blessings our Lord and God has bestowed on us all. Listen to your heart... what is it telling you?



The following organizations benefited from the funds collected during last fall's campaign:


The Trail Transition Program is a part of the Flagler County School system that works to transition young adults with



Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." (Gospel for Feb. 9, Lk 5:5)

St. Peter describes an experience to which many of us can relate. Sometimes, we work tirelessly at something but come up empty, failing at our task and seemingly accomplishing nothing. But Peter here

finds overwhelming success when he listens to the Lord and tries again. It may remind us of the psalmist's words: "Unless the Lord build the house, they labor in vain who build" (Ps 127:1a). 
