

Council 10514 New Member Procedure

The Supreme Council has requested that councils no longer submit a copy of the Supreme Council Form 100 when a new member joins a council. Notre Dame Council 10514 will use a modified Council 10514 Form 100 to start the new member processing for council membership.

The first step in the membership process is to give the new member prospect the new Council 10514 Membership Application. Ask him to scan the QR Code on the back of the form or go to <u>www.kofc.org/joinus</u> to join online. Once the new member prospect has joined online, he is a Knights of Columbus MEMBER! However, he does not have a council affiliation and is <u>not</u> an official member of Notre Dame Council 10514. The new online member will be contacted, answer any additional questions, and make arrangements for him to attend an exemplification. The council will need a completed copy of the new Council 10514 Membership Application prior to the exemplification in order to complete the processing for council membership.


