

Brother Knights,

The Florida Division of Elections has reported it has verified 910,946 signatures submitted by Floridians Protecting Freedom, which is nearly 20,000 more than needed, to get a proposed abortion amendment on the 2024 Florida ballot. The Florida Attorney General needs to confirm the signatures before the process can move forward and has until February 1st to respond. The proposal also has to be reviewed by the Florida Supreme Court for clear language before hitting the ballot. The Court has scheduled a hearing for February 7th. The University of North Florida ran a poll Nov 6 - 26th and found 62% of those polled would vote "yes" if the question appears on the ballot. Only 60% of votes are needed for amendment approval. Several other states will have or possibly have similar proposals on their ballots. Surprisingly, many of these states have much lower thresholds for signatures needed. 7000 of the 78,250 recorded abortions in Florida in 2023 were provided to non-residents. They came from surrounding states and the Caribbean.

The JMJ Pregnancy Center continues to receive donations to fund their services. Two recent donations of \$25,000 and \$10,000 have been recently offered. Plans are already underway for this year's Gala event.

A report titled "Hope for a New Generation" surveyed 2750 pregnancy centers in all 50 states. Results showed nearly 975,000 women and families received services in 2022 valued at \$358M. 40 Days for Life reported 30 abortion facilities closed where vigils were held since Roe v Wade was overturned. However, 92,000 women crossed state lines in the first 6 months of 2023 to get abortions. The latest Marist poll reveals that 83% of all Americans are in favor of supporting crisis pregnancy centers.

Planned Parenthood will now provide the means for minors to travel to other states for an abortion. Staff at a facility in Missouri unknowingly told an investigator that they treat 13 year-olds as adults. That facility would provide whatever it took to get the child to another state and no one would have to be notified including parents.

The National March for Life was held on January 19th in Washington D.C. A number of states also held marches. In Florida, there were marches in Tampa and Pensacola. In Tallahassee, Pro Life/Pro Family Days activities were also held. The USCCB January prayer guide focused on the end to abortion and encouraged participation in the "9 Days for Life Novena" held January 16th - 24th.

The 40 Days for Life fall campaign runs from February 14 - March 24. Vigils will be held across the globe in efforts to dissuade abortion minded women to reconsider their decision. Locally a vigil will be held outside the Planned Parenthood facility in Kissimmee. In conjunction, the Orlando Laps for Life is scheduled for March 2nd at Bishop Moore High School. Funds raised will provide ultra sound machines to pregnancy centers.

The chemical abortion drug mifepristone is currently used in 40% of all abortions. The US Supreme Court will be reviewing a lawsuit objecting to FDA changes to the dispensing and prescribing of the drug. The FDA wants to relax current regulations and offer it essentially over the counter without a prescription. Even many doctors who do prescribe the drug are opposed. In the state of Washington pharmacists are taking advantage of a state law that certifies them to prescribe and dispense chemical abortion pills.

The AMA again voted to keep existing policy against euthanasia. Euthanasia, along with Assisted Suicide, are currently illegal in the US. However, medically-assisted or physician-assisted suicide is legal in 10 states. Vermont and Oregon now have laws removing the residency requirement for such assistance. In Oregon, nearly 50% of those who ended their lives cited being a burden on their families as the primary reason. In addition, 10 more statesincluding Florida-have proposed laws to allow the practice. Laws in Nevada Youth Essay Contest



and those proposed in Arizona allow for doctors to withhold food from patients to allow death by starvation even if the patient is asking for food. These patients must have a written directive to withhold food already on file in a living will. In the Netherlands, 700 people a year die by this method.

Euthanasia is legal in several countries around the world with Canada apparently leading the way by removing nearly all restrictions. 4% of all deaths in Canada are the result of euthanasia. Also in Canada, 28% believe being poor or homeless are reasons for assisted suicide. In Australia, there is a proposal to include children to the current assist in dying laws. In Belgium and the Netherlands, doctors are permitted to euthanize children from birth to 18 and the parents' consent is not necessarily required.
