The Catholic Church's traditional monthly devotion for September is dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows, also known as the Sorrowful Mother, whose memorial is celebrated on September 15th. This devotion focuses on the Virgin Mary's seven sorrows, the pains she endured for the salvation of humanity, and her role as a model of suffering and intercession. It is a time to reflect on Mary's grief at the loss of her Son, her sorrow at the crucifixion, and her compassion for the suffering of the faithful.

A great way to live the Devotion is to offer daily prayers to Our Lady of Sorrows, especially the Seven Sorrows Rosary or the Sorrowful Mother prayer. A good reflection is to meditate on Mary's sorrows as a reminder of Christ's suffering and the call to imitate His love and humility. Acts of Charity can be works of mercy and



compassion, mirroring Mary's role as a mother and protector.

An important date in September is the 'Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross' on September 14th. This feast commemorates the discovery of the True Cross by St. Helena in 320 AD, its exaltation for public veneration in 335 AD, and the recovery of the Cross from the Persians in 628 AD by Emperor Heraclius.

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "*Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me.*" **Matthew 16:24**

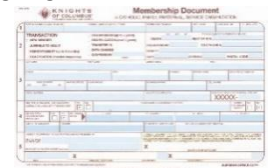

 - Free time (hobbies)
- How would the grant monies be used



Submit your essay along with two letters of recommendation; one from the parish and one from a friend or relative over the age of 18. Submission should be received by December 1, 2026.

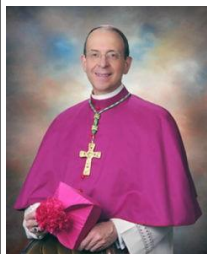

Supreme Chaplain's Challenge (September 2026)

A monthly reflection and practical challenge from Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori



Then Peter approaching asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times." (Gospel for Sept. 13, Mt 18:21-22)

To forgive others can be very difficult at times, especially when someone repeatedly offends us. Jesus tells us there is no magic number that limits our obligation — our desire to forgive and show mercy to others must be boundless, just as God's mercy toward us is infinite. We pray in the Our Father, "Forgive us our trespasses *as we forgive those who trespass*

against us." Our very salvation depends on our willingness to forgive, for God will forgive us in the measure that we forgive others (cf. Mt 6:14-15).

This month, I challenge you to make a list of the people in your life — past and present — whom you find or have found difficult to forgive, and to sincerely pray for them each day.

Questions for Reflection:

- Are there people in your life whom you find difficult to forgive for past offenses?
- Do you sometimes find yourself saying the words "I forgive you," but holding on to the hurt like a grudge?
- What steps can you take to move to true forgiveness?

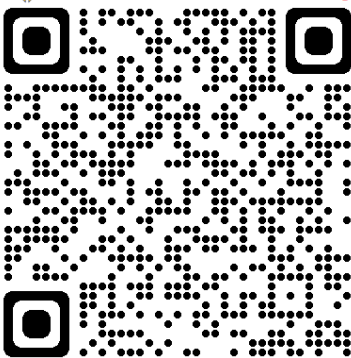
