Brothers in Christ,

The Church dedicates the month of August to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Catholics venerate (not adored as we do with the Sacred Heart of Jesus) the physical heart of

Mary. This is because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life.

Scripture references the heart of Mary when the shepherds visit baby Jesus in the gospel of Luke: "And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart" (Luke 2:19). Most images of the Immaculate Heart of Mary show one or more swords piercing the Heart of Mary. The fourth Joyful Mystery of the rosary is 'The Presentation of the Lord in the Temple'. It was here that Simeon foretold to the Blessed Mother: "(and you yourself a sword will pierce) so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." (Luke 2:35).

The Servant of God Lúcia de Jesus Rosa dos Santos, one of the Fátima visionaries, said, "The work of our redemption began at the moment when the Word descended from Heaven in order to assume a human body in the womb of Mary. From that moment, and for the next nine months, the Blood of Christ was the Blood of Mary, taken from Her Immaculate Heart; the Heart of Christ was beating in unison with the Heart of Mary."

On October 31, 1942, Pope Pius XII made a solemn Act of Consecration of the Church and the whole world to the Immaculate Heart. Living a consecration could be described as following three attitudes or spirits:

- Union Imitation of Jesus and Mary, so as to become like them, and trying to develop as constant as possible a realization of His and her presence.
- Dependence Give to Jesus and Mary the right to dispose of everything we have, temporal and spiritual.
- Obedience Jesus and Mary have the right to ask us to do anything at all, even without reward. In consecration, we recognize that right, give it on a basis of love, and plan to carry it out with fullest generosity.


# Warrior for Christ: The Life of Joe Reali





#### **Knight of the Month**

Factors to consider in their search for a 'Knight of the Month':

- ✓ Has the member made significant contributions to the Church, community and/or council?
- ✓ Does the member have a robust prayer-life that goes beyond weekly Mass attendance?
- ✓ Is the member a true Catholic gentleman?
- ✓ Does the member exemplify the virtues of Knighthood?
- ✓ Does he serve as a model man to his brothers?
- √ The 'Knight of the Month' nominated doesn't need to be a "super Knight". The nominated member should be a Knight that lives traditional Christian values according to his state in life (single or married) and deserves recognition for doing so.

#### **Nomination Sources**

- Nominations can be made from any council member for 'Knight of the Month'.
- Sources of member nominations can come from parish priests, council members, SMdM ministry leaders with active Knights serving their ministry, etc. These sources can also be used to get additional background information on their church, community, or ministry activities.
- Provide justification for your nomination when submitting. Submit to Grand Knight.

#### Family of the Month

Factors to consider in their search for a 'Family of the Month':

- ✓ Has the family made significant contributions to the Church, community and/or council?
- ✓ Is the family tight knit?
- ✓ Does the family spend quality time together?
- ✓ Does the family attend weekly Mass together?
- ✓ Does the family pray together outside of Mass?
- ✓ Does the family serve as a model of Catholic family values?
- ✓ The "Family of the Month" nominated family doesn't need to be a "super family". The nominated family should be a family that lives traditional Christian family values and deserves recognition for doing so.
- ✓ It is not required that the catholic gentlemen be a Knight to be eligible for the Family of the Month.

#### **Nomination Sources**

- Nominations can be made from any council member who knows of council member families or Santa Maria del Mar parish families that support family life.
- Sources of nominations can come from parish priests, neighbors, council members, SMdM ministry leaders, etc. They
  can be used to get recommendations, references and evaluations concerning council families. They can also speak
  directly to the families being considered.
- Provide justification for your nomination when submitting. Submit to Grand Knight.

### Florida Bishops Oppose Extreme Abortion Amendment Vote No on Amendment 4

Florida Amendment 4, which will appear on Florida's November 2024 ballot, is an extreme proposal that legalizes fullterm abortion with no protections for the preborn child, including when the child is capable of feeling pain. This proposed amendment to our state constitution would prohibit all restrictions on abortion before viability and create a broad exception that any healthcare provider could exploit to allow abortion up to birth.

Furthermore, the amendment would effectively overturn or seriously jeopardize common-sense state laws that have regulated abortion for years. These include basic health and safety requirements for clinics where abortions are performed, requiring a physician to perform abortions, informed consent requirements, laws limiting public funding of abortion, and parental consent requirements before a minor's abortion. These risks demonstrate the extreme nature of the amendment.

We urge all Floridians of goodwill to stand against the legalization of late-term abortion and oppose the abortion amendment. In doing so, we will not only protect the weakest, most innocent, and defenseless of human life among us but also countless women throughout the state from the harms of abortion.

Human life is sacred. The dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision of society. Direct attacks on innocent persons are never morally acceptable, at any stage or in any condition. In our state, human life is repeatedly being destroyed by abortion. Over 84,000 vulnerable and voiceless children were aborted in Florida in 2023.

This matter concerning the respect for human dignity and the fundamental value of human life is of grave importance to both our Church and our state. The threat of abortion remains our pre-eminent public policy priority. Therefore, we support a coordinated campaign to mobilize against the proposed amendment. To this end, we offer this prayer to defeat Amendment 4:

Ever-living God, you give life and desire a future for all your children. Take hold of our nation, state and community and awaken in every heart awe for the gift of life. Send your Spirit to strengthen us with wisdom and fortitude as we defend mothers and children in Florida from laws that disregard their health and safety.

Mary and Joseph trusted in you and welcomed Jesus into our broken world. God Almighty, we ask their intercession to protect the preborn and their mothers, and to quide all parents in raising their children. May they help us build a civilization of love by upholding the sacredness of life and accompanying pregnant women in need.

We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.


