Brothers in Christ,

FAITH - How often the Bible compels us to meditate on the meaning of faith! We might say that the Scriptures rest upon faith as one of the major cornerstones of what we are as Christians. We all remain moved at every turn

by the spirit of faith in Christ.

Bishop Robert Barron describes faith as: "Faith is an attitude

of trust in the presence of God. Faith is openness to what God will reveal, do, and invite. It should be obvious that, in dealing with the infinite, all-powerful person who is God, we are never in control."

One of the most fundamental statements of faith is this: your life is not about you. You're not in control. This is the reality, and the sooner we realize this, the deeper our FAITH in Christ will become. Let us realize,

we all are part of God's great loving, salvific design. **To believe this in our bones and to act accordingly is to have faith.** When we operate out of this faith-filled vision, amazing things can happen in our lives, for we have surrendered to "him who is able to accomplish far more than all we ask or imagine." Even a small amount of faith makes an extraordinary difference.

The New Testament is full of examples of FAITH. Here are some:

Luke 7:1–10 says that Jesus was amazed at a Roman centurion's faith: "I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith."

Matthew 8: 5-10 states: "When he entered Capernaum,* a centurion approached him and appealed to him, saying, "Lord, my servant is lying at home paralyzed, suffering dreadfully." He said to him, "I will come and cure him." The centurion said in reply,* "Lord, I am not worthy to have you enter under my roof; only say the word and my servant will be healed. For I too am a person subject to authority, with soldiers subject to me. And I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes; and to another, 'Come here,' and he comes; and to my slave, 'Do this,' and he does it." When Jesus heard this, he was amazed and said to those

following him, "Amen, I say to you, in no one in Israel* have I found such faith."

Both in Luke (Luke 7:9) and Matthew (Matthew 8:10) use the Greek word thaumazo (thou-mad'-zo) which we translate "marveled" or "amazed" to describe Jesus' response to the centurion's faith.

Hebrews 12:2 says "while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of faith" (NAB)

The story of the Faith of the woman with the woman with the hemorrhage, and Jesus' answer to her deep faith appears in the Gospels of Matthew 9:20-22, Mark 5:25-34, Luke 8:43-48. The answer of Jesus to the woman was the same: "Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace."

We need to ask ourselves one question: How deep is my faith in Christ, and what is keeping me from achieving that FAITH?







Diocese of St. Augustine Updates

The Holy Fathers' New Encyclical Letter

Pope Francis' new encyclical, *Dilexit Nos*, calls the faithful to open their hearts to the love of Christ through devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, emphasizes that this devotion offers a "simple and powerful cure" for modern society's challenges. The encyclical, released from the Vatican Oct. 23, invites prayerful reflection and encourages sharing Christ's light through service.

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception

This is notification that the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception - observed this year on December 9 – IS a Holy Day of Obligation.

In a memorandum received from the Holy See last week, the Dicastery for Legislative Texts responded to the question posed by the USCCB concerning when a holy day of obligation occurs on a Sunday in Advent,

Lent, or Easter and the observance is transferred to Monday, does the obligation to participate in Mass also transfer?

The Dicastery responded "the feast must be observed as a day of obligation to which it is transferred."

Therefore, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (Monday, Dec. 9, 2024) is to be observed as a holy day of obligation.


