Brothers in Christ,

The Feast of Corpus Christi will be celebrated this year on Sunday, June 2nd. This special feast day is set aside by the Catholic Church to honor Christ's Presence in the Holy

Eucharist. We believe that Jesus Christ's Trescrice in the Eucharist. This Presence happens during Mass at the consecration when the priest says the words which Christ Himself pronounced over ordinary bread and wine, "This is My Body," "This is the chalice of My Blood," "Do this in remembrance of Me."

A study conducted in 2023 and published by Georgetown's Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) and commissioned by the University of Notre Dame's McGrath Institute for Church Life found that 64% of Catholics believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. While this study provided a substantial increase in the number of Catholics that believe in the real presence vs. a previous 'Pew Survey', it is somewhat astounding that it is not 100%. This belief and doctrine is the core of our Catholic faith. Many of our protestant brothers and sisters do not share this belief, but the Bible makes it quite clear: Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him." John **6:53-56**. Then many of his disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" John 6:60. As a result of this, many [of] his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. Jesus then said to the Twelve, "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. John 6:66-68.

I would ask that all of my fellow Knights make a special effort to attend the Sunday, June 2nd 9:00 AM Mass preceded by a Eucharistic Procession to honor Corpus Christi Sunday. (see flyer, page 7)



Prayer for the Healing of Loved Ones


