

Field Agent – Larry Kennedy "Update Your Beneficiaries"



Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you

originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as beneficiary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named on the policies.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary predeceases the insured. I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.

I look forward to meeting with each of you to discuss your family's needs.





9-11 Memorial Ceremony

Notre Dame Council 10514 held their annual September 11th Remembrance Ceremony at Veteran's Park in honor of the almost 3,000 people killed in the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks. Program Chairman and Master of Ceremonies for the event was Past Grand Knight and Former District Deputy, Kevin Ryan.

Former Air Force Military Chaplain, Fr. Ken Beale, gave the opening Benediction. Fr. Beale is a New York City native and related how he called his parents from this active-duty station in Utah on the morning of September 11th. They gave him a first-hand account of what could be clearly seen of the World Trade Center towers from their apartment balcony. He was on the phone with them when the second plane struck the second tower. He later led the attendees in the 'Prayer of St. Francis' and also offered the closing prayers for the ceremony.

Brother Joseph Palma was this year's guest speaker. On September 11th, he was called from his home in New Jersey to assist the First Responders in setting up lighting, ensuring electrical grids were safe, as well as working to seal off the labyrinth of plumbing lines. He also assisted in the removal of the bodies of the deceased at Ground Zero. He related how there was a sense of reverence that took place as all of those present worked to look for survivors after the tragic event.

The Corpus Christi Assembly 2810 Fourth Degree Color Corp members served as honor guards for the ceremony. The Matanzas High School J.R.O.T.C. Color Guard posted the American Flag and the Florida State Flag at the event. Retired uniformed members of the New York City Police and Fire Departments were present along with a number of First Responders from the Flagler County area. Local dignitaries present included Flagler Beach Mayor Patti King, Commissioners Jane Mealy & Donald O'Brien, and Police Chief Matthew Doughney. Program Chairman Ryan thanked the city officials for their continued support and assistance in setting up the annual event.

A special 'Blue Mass' was celebrated at Santa Maria del Mar Catholic Church after the memorial by Fr. Ken Beale, assisted by Deacon Bob Krol, for all current and past members of the military, police officers, firefighters, and first responders.

Council's Ultrasound Initiative Program. The new ultrasound machine replaces one that was twenty years old.

The new ultrasound machine was blessed by Father Ed Murphy, parochial vicar of Holy Faith Catholic Church. Maureen Shilkunas (Director of the Office of Human Life and Dignity for the Diocese of St. Augustine) led the attendees in thanksgiving for all of those that have

dedicated their time and energies to saving babies.

Lunch was provided by the clinic's Board of Directors. In attendance were Lori Hiebert (Executive Director of the clinic), Filomena Smolenski (President of the Board), Michelle Kenlon (Board Vice President), Janet Schmittgen (Board Secretary). Other board members present included Angela Medyk, Belinda Herring, Maryanne Walker, Frank Kenlon, Jennifer Mullis, Joan Scott, and their spouses and family members.

The funds for the ultrasound machine were provided by an anonymous donor. The donor was a 'snowbird' attending Mass at Santa Maria del Mar Church in Flagler Beach. He was impressed with the many activities of the Notre Dame Council and how well the council and parish worked together. He learned of the Knights of Columbus pro-life



programs and inquired as to what were the past and current pro-life programs of the council. Part of those discussions where the fact that the council was able to fundraise and assist in the placing of eight ultrasound machines in crisis pregnancy centers in the Diocese of St. Augustine since 2017. This led to a commitment to fund an ultrasound machine purchase for 'A Women's Answer'.

> Although this was the ninth ultrasound machine in which Council 10514 fundraised, it was the first one that utilized the Knights of Columbus Charitable Fund (KCCF). The donor stated he preferred to donate monies through a 'Qualified Charitable Distribution' (QCD) from his IRA. Kevin Ryan, PGK, serving as District Deputy, contacted the Supreme Council KCCF office about the process.

The donated funds were able to be transferred directly into the council's KCCF pro-life fund. The necessary funds were later transferred to the Florida State Council's Charitable Fund after the completion all of the proper forms and final approval for the ultrasound machine. The Supreme Council then sent the matching funds for the ultrasound purchase.

AWA staff members pointed out that of the hundreds of ultrasounds they have performed, they have only lost one child to abortion after the mother viewed her ultrasound. They also expressed their gratitude to the Knights of Columbus for the new ultrasound machine. The donation of this very important life-saving equipment eliminated the prospect of diverting limited funds from other needs of the ministry or foregoing the availability of a machine to provide free ultrasounds for women.




Father Flanagan gained influence and admiration over the course of his life from presidents, CEOs, celebrities and more, in the U.S. and as far as Germany and Japan, but none

mattered more to him than that of the children for whom he tirelessly worked. A sobering reminder of this was during World War II, as Flanagan saw droves of former Boys Town citizens go off to war. In fact, so many former Boys Town boys named Father Flanagan as their next of kin that the American War Dads Association named him as America's No. 1 War Dad!

He was named a "Servant of God" by the Archdiocese of Omaha on March 17, 2012, the first step in the canonization process for the Catholic Church to declare him a saint. Father Flanagan was a hero for his times, and for ours, as well: his approach to child welfare remains a top influence in the field, and his frequent outspokenness against injustice showed he was always willing to tell the truth, regardless of risk.

"Father Flanagan was a virtuous man dedicated to serving God and abandoned and orphaned children," said Rob Kaczmark, co-director and executive producer of "Heart of a Servant: The Story of Father Flanagan." "He refused to let any obstacles, including racist laws and institutions, stand in the way of caring for countless youth during his lifetime. We hope our movie shines a light upon the miraculous work of Father Flanagan and furthers his cause of canonization."




