The Catholic Church devotes the month of September to the 'Seven Dolors of Mary'. The word, dolors, is a Middle English word meaning suffering or grief that comes from Old French.

It in turn comes from the Latin word dolor, meaning pain.

The 'Seven Dolors of Mary' refer to specific events in the life of the Blessed Mother that were filled with sorrow. These events include:

- The Prophecy of Simeon (Luke 2:22-38)
- The Flight into Egypt (Matt 2:13-23)
- The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple (Luke2:41-52)
- The Meeting of Mary and Jesus on the Way to Calvary (Luke 23:27-31; John 19:17)
- The Crucifixion and Death of Jesus (John 19:17-30; Mark 15:33-41)
- Jesus Taken Down from the Cross (John 19:38-39, Mark 15:40-47)
- Jesus Laid in the Tomb (Luke 23:50-56; Mark 15:42-47)

The first sorrow took place when Mary and Joseph presented the child Jesus in the Temple shortly after His birth. This was a foreshadowing of the major sorrows she would encounter in her life as a mother. Scripture says: "... and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted (and you yourself a sword will pierce) so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." Luke 2:34-35

During the month of September, make a special effort to reflect on the 'Seven Dolors of Mary'. Read the applicable Bible passages for each of the seven sorrows and contemplate the mysteries they hold. May the Holy Spirit bless and guide you on your journey of faith.




Applicant must be a member of Santa Maria del Mar Parish

2024-25 Officer Installation Ceremony

District Deputy Greg Gully, aided by District Warden Owen Thompson, installed the newly elected officers of Notre Dame Council 10514 and St. Mary's Council 11961. A votive Mass in honor of Blessed Fr. Michael J. McGivney was

celebrated prior to the installation ceremonies by SMdM Pastor Manny Lopez. Deacon Bob Krol & Deacon Manny Almeida assisted Fr. Manny. Assembly 2810 provided the Color Corp for the Mass & officer installation ceremony.



'VOTE NO on 4' Educational Presentation



Members and guests of Notre Dame Council 10514 in Flagler Beach attended an informative presentation on the proposed Amendment 4 to the Florida State Constitution. The presentation was conducted by the Life Director in the Office of Human Life & Dignity for the Diocese of St. Augustine, Maureen Shilkunas.

Life Director Shilkunas pointed out that the extreme consequences should the amendment pass this fall. She read the actual wording of Amendment 4 and pointed out the following extreme measures that would be implemented should the amendment pass. She specifically highlighted three of the areas that would affect current Florida State abortions:

- (1) **No Medical Doctor Needed** the amendment would allow any health care provider to approve an abortion. The term health care provider is loosely defined in Florida State law. It could be almost anyone from a nurse, dentist, or abortion provider staff member. Current Florida State law requires two medical doctors to approve an abortion.
- (2) No Parental Consent the amendment would remove the requirement of parental consent for an abortion that would be performed on their child. The language would be changed to only require parental notification. A cell phone text message could satisfy that requirement.

(3) No Limit or Timeline on When an Abortion Can Take Place — the amendment would nullify the recently enacted 'Heartbeat Protection Act'. Current Florida State Law prohibits an abortion after an unborn child's heartbeat can be detected. This is typically around the sixth week of pregnancy (there are exceptions for rape, incest, and to save the life of the mother). Should Amendment 4 pass, abortion would be allowed through all 9 months of pregnancy with no protections for the unborn child.

Maureen stated that the Florida State Conference of Catholic Bishops has issued a pastoral letter opposing extreme Amendment 4. The Florida Catholic Bishops have formally launched its multilingual campaign to defeat Amendment 4 on the upcoming November ballot. They have launched a new website with a video entitled "Not What it Seems". The video exposes the deceptive nature and extreme ramifications of Amendment 4. She encouraged everyone to visit the website and view the posted video: https://votenoon4florida.com/

At the conclusion of the presentation, Life Director Shilkunas asked everyone to get involved with defeating Amendment 4. She asked attendees to speak to their friends, family, and neighbors and let them know the extreme consequences of the passage of Amendment 4. Most importantly she asked persons of faith to pray to our Blessed Mother for her intercession and to the Holy Spirit for the guidance to defeat this constitutional amendment.

A monthly reflection and practical challenge from Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori



And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said to him in reply, "You are the Messiah." (Gospel for Sept. 15, Mk 8:29)

Peter was the first of the apostles to openly profess Jesus as the awaited Messiah, the Christ or anointed one. Today, every Christian is called to proclaim in word and deed that Jesus is

the Christ. We must never lose the awe and wonder of recognizing Jesus as the Messiah and Savior, especially when we encounter him in the sacrament of penance and in the Mass.

This month, I challenge you to make Peter's profession of faith — "You are the Messiah" — a frequent aspiration, or short prayer, you recite throughout each day, perhaps writing it down some place you will see it regularly to remind yourself.

Questions for Reflection:

- When you say the name of Jesus Christ, are you mindful of what this truly means?
- When you approach a priest for confession, are you fully cognizant that the absolution you receive through the priest comes from Christ himself?
- When you approach holy Communion, do you recognize and contemplate Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist you receive?




