## Two Saints Knights Should Know About

On July 26, we honor two great saints, Saint Joachim and Saint Anne, the parents of Our Blessed Mother and grandparents of Our Lord.

These two saints are particularly important to Knights, as they are the patron saints of grandparents.

Their names are not recorded in the Gospels. Their names come from an apocryphal, or false, document called the Gospel of James.

Although this document was found to be inauthentic, it does not mean that everything in this document is false.

According to tradition, Joachim was a very wealthy and generous elderly man. He and his wife Anne were childless.

One day, before Anne conceived of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Joachim went to the temple to make an offering. The offering was rejected by a man named Rubin, most likely a Levitical priest, because Joachim was childless.

At that time, if you were childless, many believed you were disfavored from Almighty God. Distressed, Joachim left the temple. But remembering Abraham was given a child in his old age, embarked on a 40-day period of fasting and prayer in the desert, beseeching God for a child. Anne also prayed for a child.

Nine months later, Anne bore a daughter, and the couple named her Mary.

Because of the vow they both made if they had a child, Joachim and Anne brought Mary to the Temple at the age of 3, where she took up residence until it was time for her to be married to St. Joseph.

What we know for certain is that the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Immaculate Conception, had parents. They loved her, raise her, and offered her to Almighty God. In fact, on a spiritual level, just as the Blessed Virgin Mary is our spiritual mother, so also Saints Joachim and Anne are our spiritual grandparents in the order of grace.

Pope Francis stated: "Mary grew up in the home of Joachim and Anne; she was surrounded by their love and faith: in their home she learned to listen to the Lord and to follow his will. How precious is the family as the privileged place for transmitting the faith."

I have spoken to many Knights who are grandparents and are worried sick as their children and grandchildren have left the Catholic faith. They have tried everything to bring them back, but are unsuccessful.

The world is full of evil and it is powerful. But so is the powerful intercession of Saints Joachim and Anne. They were not only grandparents of Our Lord, but they are both our spiritual grandparents too. Ask them to assist you in your efforts to bring family members back to the Catholic Faith.

It involved a total of 36 man hours of charity work.




