A KNIGHTS HEAD-START INTO ADVENT

It is hard to believe that Advent is only five (5) weeks away, so how are we living our lives at the current moment? Will it be different when Advent arrives, or will we continue on with a fullness of faith or perhaps just go on like every normal day feeling it doesn't matter?

We, as Knights, should keep a fullness of Faith in our Lord and Savior each and every hour, and each and every day throughout the year. And our "Fullness of Faith" should always be shared with others, especially those in need of our help.

My brothers, let us get a jump on this year's Advent Season, and not wait. Let us fulfill our hearts with an increased feeling of Faith. For Advent (from the Latin adventus meaning "coming") is a liturgical season observed as a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas. Advent marks the beginning of the Church's liturgical year and begins on Advent Sunday, the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day, Dec. 25.

For Catholics, the season of Advent serves as a reminder both of the original waiting by Israelites for the birth of the Messiah, and the waiting by Christians for the return of Christ. The most famous hymn of Advent is "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel." Its lyrics, based on the Prophet Isaiah, articulate the hopeful anticipation of the Advent season:

"O come, O come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, that mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel."

Originally observed as a time of fasting and penitence, the emphasis of the season of Advent is one of expectation and anticipation for the coming Messiah. The season of Advent starts out in a somber tone and for the first two weeks, purple and blue are the primary colors used in church. On the third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday (gaudete means rejoice) pink or rose are the primary colors used. This shift in color symbolizes change in emphasis from expectation to celebration.

This year the Advent season begins on November 30, 2025. The themes of the Advent season are Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. Lighting of candles, especially the circular Advent wreath, with five candles is an important tradition of the Advent season. Each Sunday of Advent, one of four candles is lit – with the final candle, the Christ Candle, being lit on Christmas Eve.

This year let us look deeply into the words, **HOPE**, **PEACE**, **JOY**, **and LOVE**, as Knights and as a community of dedicated men who bring that Hope to many who you serve, that Peace to those you help and assist, that Joy to those who you bring a smile to their faces with a fullness of hope, and that love that is felt in the hearts of many that also gives them peace.

Peace and Grace to all - May our Lord bless all of you, and your families.

Charlie will soon be setting up SignUpGenius for volunteers.











