


Reminder: No Holy Hour or Spaghetti Dinner this month. We will start again in May.

Deacon's Teaching By Deacon Chris Christopher Easter Tide

The resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead is the "Feast of feasts" and the "Solemnity of solemnities," because it is the greatest feast of the entire liturgical year. (CCC, 1168) It illuminates all our worship, "...if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain, and your faith is in vain." (1 Corinthians: 15-14)

Easter Octave: The celebration of Easter reaches its pinnacle at the dramatic Easter vigil, but a feast this momentous cannot be confined to a single day. The Octave of Easter lasts for eight days until the Second Sunday of Easter.

However, we continue the celebration for a full 50 days until the feast of Pentecost. Why these fifty days of Easter Tide? After his resurrection, Jesus spent forty days on earth before he ascended,

and then there were ten more days after that before the descent of the Holy Spirit on the apostles on Pentecost.

"The 50 days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost are celebrated in joyful exultation as one feast day, or better yet, as one 'Great Sunday.'" (Congregation for Divine Worship, General)

Keep in mind that God doesn't need these 50 days of celebration - we do. He lives in the eternal present - no yesterday or tomorrow for him. Therefore, since He is celebrating His Son's victory right along with us, we should join our happiness with his.


We are the ones who need these liturgical reminders to help keep our faith and devotion strong by delving more deeply into the Church's seasons. Let God join us in our happiness.

While there are many opportunities where a knight can get involved in the council, one of the easiest ways to start is through the Shining Armor Award.



The Shining Armor Award is presented to those members who exemplify a true Knight of Columbus and is designed to help you actively get involved with council programs and

activities. To qualify for the Shining Armor Award, during the fraternal year, you must:

- Be involved in at least three council Faith in Action programs.
- Attend at least three council meetings.
- Attend an Exemplification of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity.
- Meet with your council's insurance representative or attend a fraternal benefits night.
- Sponsor at least one man who becomes a member of the Order.

For our new members, the "Attend an Exemplification..." requirement has already been met. Meeting with our insurance representative, SK Jeff Fischer, or attending a fraternal benefits night is also an easy requirement to complete. As a Shining Amor Award recipient myself, I can attest this achievement is easily obtainable.

COMMITTEE ON CHARTERS GUIDELINES FOR SELECTING NAMES FOR COUNCILS

Sections 97 and 98 of the Charter Constitution & Laws of the Order outline the general rules regarding the naming of Knights of Columbus councils. A council shall not bear the name of a living person and the approval of the name of the council rests with the Committee on Charters.

To assist in the selection of a council name, these guidelines are provided for your consideration.

RECOMMENDED PRIORITY FOR THE SELECTION OF COUNCIL NAMES:

Religious Names:

ex: Holy Family, Sacred Heart of Jesus, Holy Trinity, All Saints

Saints or Parish Names:

ex: St. Mary's, St. Patrick's, St. Stanislaus, St. Aedan's, St. Francis

Hierarchy or Clergy Names:

ex: Cardinal O'Connor, Pope Paul IV, Father Michael McGivney, Father John Doe

(Names proposed in this category require the approval of the Ordinary of the Diocese and a biography submitted with the request to the Supreme Secretary.)

Deceased Knights, Prominent Catholic Laymen Names:

ex: Luke E. Hart, John H. Reddin, Al Smith, R. Sargent Shriver

Council Location Names:

ex: Harrisburg, New Haven, Denver, Whispering Pines

GUIDELINES FOR COUNCIL NAME CHANGES

The Committee on Charters considers the changing of the name of the council an important action and should not be taken lightly, especially considering the historical significance to the council. Maintaining a religious name is generally preferred to a secular name. Each request will be handled on an individual basis.

The process for requesting council name changes includes:

- Draft a resolution calling for the name change;
- Read the resolution at one (1) council business meeting;
- Publish the resolution to all council members;
- Vote on and approve the resolution at the following council business meeting;
- Forward the resolution to the State Deputy for his consideration. The request should explain the rationale for the name change and the biography, if applicable. If the individual is a priest, the approval of the Bishop is required with the request.
- If the State Deputy approves the request, he will forward it to the Supreme Secretary with his endorsement *(The Board of Directors will not consider a name change request unless endorsed by the State Deputy.)*

- If the request meets the guidelines established by the Committee on Charters, the Supreme Secretary will present the request to the Board of Directors for their consideration, approval or rejection at the next available business meeting.

Whereas, the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus granted the charter to Knights of Columbus Council 7027 at Saint Rose of Lima Catholic Church, in Milton, Florida, on January 26, 1978, with the name Milton Council, and

Whereas, Father Thomas G. Lorigan served as the pastor of Saint Rose of Lima Catholic Church in Milton, Florida, from June 1970 until January 1982 and was a charter member of Milton Council 7027, and

Whereas, Father Lorigan remained a member of Council 7027 even after his retirement and provided spiritual guidance to its members and their families until his death on September 8, 1997, and

Whereas, Father Lorigan inspired many people by his life and virtue, leading them to a more devout life, and

Whereas, at some point after Father Lorigan’s death, Milton Council 7027 came to be known as Father Thomas G. Lorigan Council 7027 locally and by the Florida State council but, for reasons unknown, the council name was not changed with the Supreme Council of the Knights of Columbus, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the members of Council 7027, by majority vote at the regular meeting on May 9, 2024, hereby indicate their desire that the name of Council 7027 be officially changed to **Father Thomas G. Lorigan Council 7027** with its location remaining at Saint Rose of Lima Catholic Church in Milton, Florida.

At each Mass "we stand before the **Conquering Christ**. He rises from behind the altar here at Saint Rose, the conquering or victorious Christ is contrasted with the Conquistadors of South America and Peru. They came in the 16th century to South America not only with their Christian Catholic faith, but also with their weapons of conquest. They brought with them spears and shields and armor and swords, their horses and dogs. They even brought diseases like smallpox and measles. This homeland of our patron saint, Saint Rose, would also see men and women of great faith who would come forth into this new land. Here the Conquering Christ, the greatest of all conquistadors, has no weapons. He has no sword. There's no spear, no armor, no shield, no horses, no disease. Our Jesus offers himself, His great unconditional love, fulfilling his mission to save and redeem us."

The Image of The Divine Mercy

In 1931, our Lord appeared to St. Faustina in a vision. She saw Jesus clothed in a white garment with His right hand raised in blessing. His left hand was touching His garment in the area of the Heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale. She gazed intently at the Lord in silence, her soul filled with awe, but also with great joy. Jesus said to her:

Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over [its] enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself will defend it as My own glory (*Diary*, 47, 48). I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You (327). I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and [then] throughout the world (47).



At the request of her spiritual director, St. Faustina asked the Lord about the meaning of the rays in the image. She heard these words in reply:

The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him (299). By means of this image I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works (742).

These words indicate that the Image represents the graces of Divine Mercy poured out upon the world, especially through Baptism and the Eucharist.

Many different versions of this image have been painted, but our Lord made it clear that the painting itself is not what is important. When St. Faustina first saw the original image that was being painted under her direction, she wept in disappointment and complained to Jesus: "Who will paint You as beautiful as You are?" (313).

In answer, she heard these words: "**Not in the beauty of the color, nor of the brush lies the greatness of this image, but in My grace**" (313).

So, no matter which version of the image we prefer, we can be assured that it is a vehicle of God's grace if it is revered with trust in His mercy.
