Dear brothers, Happy New Year!

May Emmanuel, God with us, be present in your homes filling them with his light and may the thanksgiving for the New Year be an open door to the Holy Family, inspiring our own families to advance on the path of holiness.

As we stand on the threshold of 2026, let us burst forth with unshakable joy and fervent hope! The ordinary Jubilee Year 2025 "Pilgrims of Hope" has renewed us in the grace of recognizing that God's mercy is always near and has also given impetus to our ongoing mission.

Pope Leo XIV reminds us of this in his Christmas blessing: In a few days' time, the Jubilee Year will come to an end.

The Holy Doors will close, but Christ our hope remains with us always! He is the Door that is always open, leading us into divine life. This is the joyful proclamation of this day: the Child who was born is God made man; he comes not to condemn but to save; his is not a fleeting appearance, for he comes to stay and to give himself. In him, every wound is healed and every heart finds rest and peace. "The Lord's birth is the birth of peace". 1 On the first day of the Year, the church is summoned on the World Day of Peace. In our pursuit of holiness, as faithful men, we know that working tirelessly for peace identifies us as children of God: "blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God" (Matthew 5,9). There are many ways in which we can become true agents of peace, but for our actions to be effective, we need to act moved by the transformative power of faith. In this year's message the church encourages us with these words: Peace is more than just a goal; it is a presence and a journey.

Even when it is endangered within us and around us, like a small flame threatened by a storm, we must protect it, never forgetting the names and stories of those who have borne witness to it. Peace is a principle that guides and defines our choices. Even in places where only rubble remains, and despair seems inevitable, we still find people who have not forgotten peace. Just as on the evening of Easter Jesus entered the place where his disciples were gathered in fear and discouragement, so too the peace of the risen Christ continues to pass through doors and barriers in the voices and faces of his witnesses. This gift enables us to remember goodness, to recognize it as victorious, to choose it again, and to do so together. 2 Brother Knights, we are called to be unrelenting signs of hope. This is a mandate inherent to our Order's charism.

The Knights have always been tangible signs of hope for those who experience hardships: supporting families in need, defending the unborn, welcoming migrants, protecting creation, and fostering universal fraternity amid wars. Thanks be to God for choosing us to be part of His work.

The overall goal for Laps this year is \$125,000. As of this writing, we are budgeting for another 8-10 ultrasound machines with a replacement already requested for JMJ.

From our Faith Director

My Brothers in Faith,

From the December 21 Word Among Us meditation. St. Joseph is a role model for many of us men, especially us Knights. He is a powerful person in the bible, yet as we all know, he never speaks a word.

He is especially important to me as I chose his name as my Confirmation name.

I pray to St. Joseph daily and I'm thankful for his example of what it means to live as a faithful man; especially when he believed in the Angel of God and obeyed the messages he received regardless of the difficulties that he had to go through. When we hear a message from God that is pulling or pushing us to follow God's will, we need to obey and say yes, just as Joseph and Mary did when they were called into a deeper relationship with Him.

Matthew 1:18-24 He was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame. (Matthew 1:19) What an interesting thing to say about Joseph: he was "righteous" yet "unwilling to expose" Mary "to shame" (Matthew 1:19).

It seemed as if there were two different impulses in Joseph as he struggled to decide how to respond to Mary's pregnancy.

Today's Gospel tells us that Joseph was a righteous man and a devout observer of the Mosaic law. He was just in his intention to break his union with Mary—she seemed to have violated their betrothal, after all. But still, he didn't want Mary to become an object of ridicule and shame. So, he was merciful in his desire to find a quiet solution that avoided public scandal.

Justice and mercy: these two noble instincts revealed the depth of Joseph's holiness. And yet God had something better in mind. He wanted to bring Joseph even further along the path of righteousness. When the angel appeared to him in a dream, he reassured Joseph that he didn't need to divorce Mary. The child she carried was part of God's plan to redeem the world.

He was Emmanuel, God-with-us, who would fulfill both justice and mercy in himself. Joseph accepted the angel's words. He came to see that God's plans were bigger and better than his own, righteous though they were. So, Joseph let the Lord redirect his ideas and strategies. This is a lesson for us. God is always calling us into a deeper relationship with him. He might ask us to set aside our plans or take a step in a direction we don't understand.

But he leads the way for us. Joseph's yes to the Lord not only protected Mary and Jesus, but it also transformed his own life. Even though Joseph didn't understand, he was willing to obey. It made all the difference for Joseph, and it can do the same for you! "Lord, help me to trust in the goodness of your plan so that I can grow closer to you!"

You can then print it or you can save it and attach it to an email and send it to [Joe Pocius](#) (click on his name to open an email) on or before **Monday, January 12**.

NOTE: Enter your hours on the left side of the form – within the **Council Hours** column. Sum the hours manually or if you are completing the form electronically, the hours will automatically sum at the bottom. There is no place to enter your name on the form. If you are completing it manually, please print your name on the bottom of the form. If you are completing it online, save the form and change the file name so that it contains your name, for example, individual_survey1728a **Tom Simpson**.pdf. Send or provide your form to [Joe Pocius](#) (click on his name to open an email) on or before **Monday, January 12**.

2. You can open the [2025 annual survey of fraternal activities](#) Excel document. Click on the document name to open the Excel document.

There are two worksheets in this document (when the document is open, see the bottom of your screen for the Individual Membership Worksheet and the Monthly Details Worksheet). This Excel document can be used to type in your hours by month in the Monthly Details Worksheet and the totals will automatically calculate and be inserted into the Individual Membership Worksheet in the proper reporting categories for the year (this worksheet is the same as the Supreme form Individual_survey1728a). 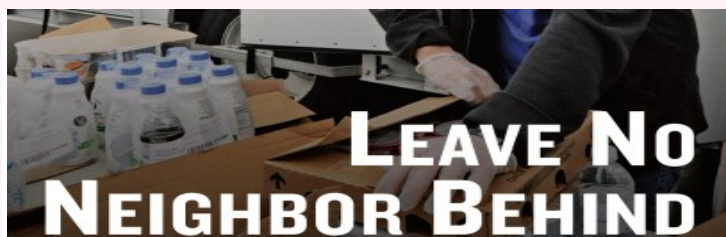

Her FEMA money ran out but she still had kitchen work that needed to be completed, requiring new countertops and appliances that needed to be installed. She is a visually impaired senior citizen on a tightly fixed income. Tom Poppell and Tom Weninger installed a temporary wash tub in her kitchen in November. Just before Christmas, John Felter, Angelo Chiodo, Mike Dodane and John's brother-in-law, Dan Hale purchased and installed countertops, a sink, and the other appliances into her kitchen.

These Christmas angels brought a joyous Christmas present to this woman, allowing her to live in a functioning kitchen again. A small group of men donated the money to purchase the supplies for this project.
