Why is the Holy Eucharist important to us as Knights, as Catholic Men? 

Prayer for the Canonization of Blessed Michael McGivney



Deacon's Teaching By Deacon Chris Christopher Bread of Life Discourse John 6:30ff

In John 6, Jesus leads his listeners to the reality of the Eucharist. In particular:

- a. In verse 35, He gently opens his dialogue, "I am the bread of life; he who comes to me shall not hunger, and he who believes in
- b. me shall never thirst."
- c. In verse 41 He ups the ante when the Jews murmur against what he said about being *the bread of life*. He bluntly tells them, "... *if anyone*
- d. eats of this bread, he will live forever, and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh."
- e. In verses 54-57 He lays it on the line, "... He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him.
- f. Non-Catholic Christians say Jesus was using symbolism in this Discourse. Their reasoning is:
- g. A literal interpretation would make Christians cannibals.
- h. Jesus claims to be a "door" in John 10:9 and a "vine" in John 15:5. Do Catholics believe they must pluck a leaf from Jesus the vine or oil the
- i. hinges on Jesus the door to get into heaven? Therefore, this whole Discourse is just another metaphor as He uses elsewhere.
- j. The charge of cannibalism does not hold water for at least two reasons:
- k. Catholics do not receive our Lord in a cannibalistic form; they receive him in the form of bread and wine. The cannibal kills his victim; Jesus does not die when he is consumed in Communion. The cannibal eats part of his victim, in Communion the entire

- Christ is consumed body, blood, soul, and divinity. The cannibal sheds the blood of his victim; in Communion, our Lord gives himself to us in a non-bloody way.
- I. Even symbolically teaching such an immoral act is immoral!

Regarding the symbolism argument, no one listening to Jesus understood this Discourse as such. When Jesus said he was a "door" or a "vine," no listeners asked, "How can this man be a door made out of wood?" or "How can this man claim to be a plant?" When Jesus spoke in metaphors, people were aware of it.


In verse 53 the verb *eats* is not the classical Greek verb for human eating at a dinner table but that of an animal eating: "munching" and "gnawing". Jesus wanted to make sure that He was not speaking metaphorically or symbolically to his audience,

If Jesus was speaking symbolically, in verse 67 He would have cleared up the difficulty with his apostles. Instead, He reiterates what he just said. He doesn't say, "Hey guys, I was misleading the multitudes, but now I am going to let you in on the simple truth, I was speaking symbolically." Rather, he said to them, "Do you also want to leave?"

Verse 63 is understood that without accepting the urgings of the Holy Spirit, one cannot come to accept Jesus' teaching in this Bread of Life Discourse. It is the spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. After all, even Jesus couldn't work miracles in a town where there was no faith.






Programs

Florida Bishops Oppose Extreme Abortion Amendment Vote No on Amendment 4

Florida Amendment 4, which will appear on Florida's November 2024 ballot, is an extreme proposal that legalizes fullterm abortion with no protections for the preborn child, including when the child is capable of feeling pain. This proposed amendment to our state constitution would prohibit all restrictions on abortion before viability and create a broad exception that any healthcare provider could exploit to allow abortion up to birth.

Furthermore, the amendment would effectively overturn or seriously jeopardize common-sense state laws that have regulated abortion for years. These include basic health and safety requirements for clinics where abortions are performed, requiring a physician to perform abortions, informed consent requirements, laws limiting public funding of abortion, and parental consent requirements before a minor's abortion. These risks demonstrate the extreme nature of the amendment.

We urge all Floridians of goodwill to stand against the legalization of late-term abortion and oppose the abortion amendment. In doing so, we will not only protect the weakest, most innocent, and defenseless of human life among us but also countless women throughout the state from the harms of abortion.

Human life is sacred. The dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision of society. Direct attacks on innocent persons are never morally acceptable, at any stage or in any condition. In our state, human life is repeatedly being destroyed by abortion. Over 84,000 vulnerable and voiceless children were aborted in Florida in 2023.

This matter concerning the respect for human dignity and the fundamental value of human life is of grave importance to both our Church and our state. The threat of abortion remains our pre-eminent public policy priority. Therefore, we support a coordinated campaign to mobilize against the proposed amendment. To this end, we offer this prayer to defeat Amendment 4:

Ever-living God, you give life and desire a future for all your children. Take hold of our nation, state and community and awaken in every heart awe for the gift of life. Send your Spirit to strengthen us with wisdom and fortitude as we defend mothers and children in Florida from laws that disregard their health and safety.

Mary and Joseph trusted in you and welcomed Jesus into our broken world. God Almighty, we ask their intercession to protect the preborn and their mothers, and to guide all parents in raising their children. May they help us build a civilization of love by upholding the sacredness of life and accompanying pregnant women in need.

We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.
