From the Deacon's Bench

How Did these Hopeful Mysteries Come About? This idea of the five (5) Hopeful Mysteries was conceived by a local parishioner in the Diocese of Pensacola-Tallahassee. Proposed to the Diocese, they were received and would undergo prayerful discernment; being honed and checked for theological accuracy.

After much thought, prayer, and review, Bishop William Wack granted his:

Nihil Obstat

(that there are no obstacles to the Faith in the document)

&

Impimatur

(That they are allowed to be Printed and Distributed). As Bishop of the Diocese, he has both the right & authority to grant these.

The Mysteries are:

- 1. Creation
- 2. The Flood
- 3. Abraham's Sacrifice
- 4. Passover or Exodus
- 5. Immaculate Conception

All 5 Deal with the idea of God's great love and desire for **Hope**, especially displayed through various Covenants and events.

1. Creation

Covenant with Adam and Eve, especially through childbirth

2. **The Flood**

Covenant with Noah, the Rainbow as a perpetual sign

- 3. **Abraham's Sacrifice** When the Ram was found, God will provide the Lamb later, Jesus
- 4. **Passover or Exodus** Perpetual Remembrance, and the giving of the Commandments at Mount Sinai
- 5. **Immaculate Conception**

Covenant with King David: his Kingdom will last forever. That his descendant, a King, will sit on his Throne. Mary will be the Mother of that King, Jesus, whose kingdom will last forever

Also, it **IS** Bishop Wack's intention to clarify that the Diocese is **not** promulgating a new set of <u>universal mysteries</u> but proposing the **worthiness** of a devotion that has emerged in the <u>Local Church</u> of Pensacola-Tallahassee. Bishop Wack writes in his Letter:

I am not assigning these mysteries to a particular day, like the other mysteries of the rosary, but I recommend praying them in place of the others occasionally. Certainly, if you pray more than one rosary a day, you might wish to pray the Hopeful Mysteries after praying the ones assigned for the day.



Thus, these are **Optional**, you do **Not** have to use them, but are free to do so, if prompted and led by the Holy Ghost. It may be the case that these Mysteries help with a specific need, or intention or intercession, but not all the time or every time.

In a post-Covid world, fraught with conflicts and division, confusion and uncertainty, so many people are struggling with hopelessness. The prayerful intent is that the Hopeful Mysteries can help restore a sense of **Hope** in the hearts of God's people, who need it; especially during this Jubilee Year of **Hope**, leading to a flourishing of this most joyful theological virtue.

I pray that all have a Fruitful Lent, and, if prompted by the Spirit, that these may become part of your personal Devotion within the Rosary.



and would get their names in the banquet brochure and entrance poster.





Sir Knights,

You always hear people say, "Beware the ides of March! "(from the Shakespeare play, Julius Caesar), but March isn't bad at all. March reminds us that spring is on its way and that it'll start to get warmer outside. March 1st is my birthday and this year, Lent starts on Wednesday, March 5. Saint Patrick's Day, on March 17, is notably March's most famous annual holiday.

Lent is an important observance, as it's a 40-day period in which we prepare for Easter's arrival by prayer, fasting, abstaining from meat on Fridays and giving up one or more vices or indulgences. Some of the more common things sacrificed during Lent are pleasures like coffee, chocolate, sweets, alcohol and soda, among other things.

On Thursday, February 22, 1900, in honor of George Washington's birthday, the Knights of Columbus celebrated the first Exemplification of Patriotism. The ceremony was held in the Lennox Lyceum in New York City with 1,100 candidates in attendance. On Saturday, February 22, 2025, the Knights of Columbus returned to New York City to celebrate the 125th Anniversary of the Fourth Degree within the historic walls of America's parish church – Saint Patrick's Cathedral. Mass followed after the 125th Anniversary Exemplification of Patriotism.

The fourth degree may be known by the distinct uniform, but there is more to being a Fourth Degree than what one wears. Men of the fourth degree have

chosen to embrace Patriotism and embody the fact that one can be a faithful Catholic and faithful citizen. The Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus is available to all third degree members in good standing who are citizens of the country where they reside and wish to grow in their practice of Catholic patriotism.

Starting this month in March, we will have our Assembly meeting separate from the council meeting. Our meeting will be on March 20, 2025, at 6:30pm at the Knights Hall which is the third Thursday of the month. Food will be provided by the assembly. We will be inviting the new fourth degree members...Vincent Mauro, Paul Hicks, Michael Gaus, Barry Bergschneider, Joe Pascal and Carl June to welcome them to the Fourth Degree. We will have a special guest join us, Vice Marshall, Tony Jette.

I want to give thanks always for all things unto God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Remember it's a time of renewal and hope. Let this Lenten season become the breath of fresh air in your spiritual walk with Christ. Make a promise to yourself to improve upon who you are today for the person you will become tomorrow...

A RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY COUNCIL 7027 REQUESTING THAT APPLE INC. WITHDRAW ITS SUPPORT FOR AND USE OF THE PREGNANT MAN EMOJI

WHEREAS: We honor and respect truth; and

WHEREAS: We reject deception especially when it is aimed at our children; and

WHEREAS: It is a scientific impossibility for a man to become pregnant: and

WHEREAS: The Pregnant Man Emoji represents otherwise, and it is therefore knowingly and intentionally deceptive; and

WHEREAS: This intentional deception can only be aimed at our children, since adults know the truth: and

WHEREAS: Apple Inc. is cooperating with and actively participating in this deception;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT: We call upon Apple Inc. to publicly denounce this deception aimed at our children and to withdraw its support for and use of the Pregnant Man Emoji.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the foregoing resolution was considered and unanimously approved by the officers and members of Council 7027 attending its regular business meeting at the council hall located at: Milton, Florida, on March 13, 2024: and further, that the Council, on behalf of its members submit this resolution to the State Advocates Office for its consideration and adoption at the 121st Annual Meeting of the Florida State Council to be held in Jacksonville, FL, May 23th-25th, 2025.

On Sunday, February 9, Father Thomas G. Lorigan Council 7027 in Milton served a family breakfast at Saint Rose of Lima Catholic Church. The breakfast was a fundraiser for Majella House, a local non-profit maternity home for homeless pregnant mothers and their children. All of the food and drinks were donated by the Knights of Columbus council. Many thanks go out to all who supported this breakfast fundraiser.

At 6:00 am, the first twelve knights arrived at the parish hall to start setting up the hall and preparing the food. The menu, served cafeteria-style, included scrambled eggs, bacon, sausage, pancakes, grits, and biscuits and gravy, coffee and juice. There is no price for the meal. Donations are welcomed. Table decorations were provided by Debra Stafford and Jean Kimball of the Saint Rose of Lima Ladies Auxiliary.

At about 7:30 am, the second crew of eight knights arrived to serve the food, wash dishes, and bus tables. Breakfast was served between eight and ten A.M.

Bill McDonald, the council's Financial Secretary, manned the donations table at the entrance to the parish hall. Here is Bill's account of one special interaction that day.

On Sunday February 9, 2025, at our monthly breakfast, my wife and Deacon Jeff Massey and I were sitting at our table collecting donations. There was a young Latina lady who came up and gave us a letter size envelope. We were putting it away after we counted it. And I looked up to thank her for such a generous donation

and she disappeared. I saw her dressed in white, my wife saw her dressed in tan with glasses, and Deacon Jeff saw her dressed in rose color.

I got up from my seat and went around asking young ladies dressed in those colors if they had given us the envelope and each of them said no. I continued to scan the room and could not see or find her.

Just as fast as she appeared she had disappeared!

The envelope she gave us contained 16- \$100 dollar bills that were brand new.

My wife, Jim Gaus and I met with Mary Beth Cyr on Sunday February 23, 2025. We presented her with a check for \$2580.00, after the presentation, I inquired if there was a special need for \$1600.00 and she told me that they had just replaced the septic system and that Majella Houses' portion was \$1600.00. We talked about this miracle and Mary Beth told us about a book called the 'Colors of Mary", in this book it tells of the colors that Mary will wear. She will be in White, a rose-tinted tan or pure Rose. These are the exact colors that myself (white), my wife Beth (tan) and Deacon Jeff (rose) saw this young woman wearing.

It is incredible for me to believe that Mother Mary would appear to an ordinary person, however after putting everything together I now know that what each of us saw was an apparition of Mary delivering to us the exact amount that Majella House needed. All three of us were blessed to be the conduit for helping such an important and amazing organization as Majella House.
