From the Deacon's Bench

The Road from Emmaus to Pentecost



"He is risen!"

"He is risen, indeed!" (Response)

This, a traditional Easter greeting in the Western church, is **both** the exclamation and the traditional response we recognize as the great joyous mystery of Easter.

We are Blessed with God's great Mercy especially noted on the Second Sunday of Easter "Divine Mercy Sunday" which closes the **Octave** of Easter. (Octave 8 Days). The first recorded Christian octave took place in the fourth century with the dedications of churches at Tyre and Jerusalem under Constantine. These octaves intentionally imitated Solomon's eight-day dedication of the First Temple. From this point in church history, the practice of octaves began to organically spread across the Christian world with as many as 15 octaves on the liturgical calendar by the 16th Century. Successive Popes reduced these octaves over time until Pope Pius XII eliminated all **but** Christmas **and** Easter.

Even with the Octave behind us, by the time you read this, the Church is still in the Easter Season (also known as Eastertide, Paschaltide, Paschaltine or the Paschal season). This 50-day period in the Christian liturgical calendar begins on Easter Sunday and ends on Pentecost; the Descending of the Holy Ghost (Sacrament of Confirmation) and the Birthday of the Church.

Within it, ON the day of the Resurrection, Easter Sunday, we find Jesus celebrating the First Mass, with those two Disciples traveling to Emmaus. We see **both** the Liturgy of the word; where Jesus will recount the Scriptures (readings) then open/explaining them (Homily), **and** immediately followed by recognizing Jesus in the Breaking of the Bread, the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

For us, **this** particular Easter Season, is even more a time for prayers, as the Church, both mourns the passing of the Holy Father, and guided by the same Holy Ghost, gathers to choose a new Bishop of Rome.

Yes, the Easter season continues on for 50 days, through the Ascension of Our Lord to Pentecost Sunday, seven full weeks after Easter Sunday!

We should also pay special attention to the fact that following Ascension Thursday, we have the Novena to the Holy Spirit. (Novena=9 Days) (Friday after Ascension Thursday thru Saturday, the Vigil of Pentecost) This is the prototype of **all** novenas. It commemorates the **Nine Days** between the Ascension of Our Lord and the descent of the Holy Ghost on that First Pentecost Sunday. During this time, commanded by Jesus at his Ascension, Our Lady, the Twelve Apostles, and others, (we do not know the exact number), prayed in the upper room for the coming of the Holy Ghost, the Paraclete. (**Paraclete!** NOT parakeet).

So I encourage you to pray this Novena. Guides are readily available and, yes, there is even an App for that.

With the main intention, through prayer, receiving in greater abundance, according to our individual needs and circumstances, the Seven gifts of the Holy Ghost: Wisdom, Understanding, Knowledge, Counsel (right judgment) Fortitude, Piety, and Fear of the Lord as well as the courage to allow them to shape our lives in accordance with the Divine will of God.

I pray that all have a prayerful, reflective, and joyous Easter Season



Kolbe Prison Ministries

"Remember those who are in prison, as though in prison with them...." (Hebrews 13: 3)

Sacrificial responses come in many forms. Money to buy the books on the Catholic Faith, hours spent in the kitchen cooking delicious meals for the inmates and prayers for return of the lost sheep. Without the sacrifice of the clergy and those volunteers who enter the prison to serve, no retreat would happen. From the first Kolbe retreat in 2023 to three in 2024, we plan to have at least six Kolbe Retreats during 2025 in the PT Diocese. We have already

had Century #4 in February, with 3 Kolbe Retreats planned for this summer:

Santa Rosa #2 Retreat June 12-14

Holmes Mission Retreat July 17-19

Century #5 Retreat August 13-15.

To pull this off, we need about 20 male volunteers to enter the prison for each retreat. We do not expect volunteers to make all three retreats. So, here is the plan: recruit and mentor more volunteers. If you are interested contact

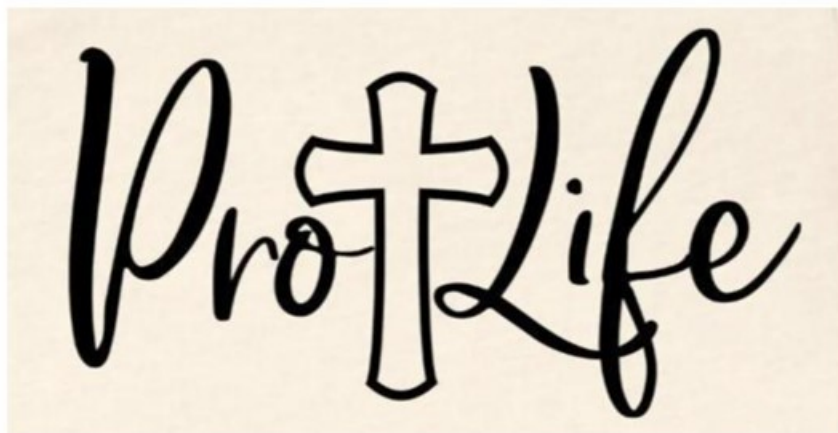

The goals are (1) to defend the inviolable right to life of all human beings, preborn and born and (2) to foster a culture of life both in our homes and in the surrounding community.

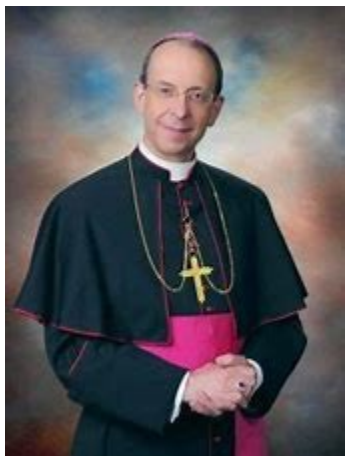
We will advocate for the right to life of the preborn through respectful, non-judgmental conversation.

Supreme Chaplain's Challenge

He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" (Gospel for May 4, Jn 21:17a)

When, following the Resurrection, Jesus revealed himself to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias, why did he ask Peter three times whether he loved him? It has often been seen as a penance for Peter's earlier threefold denial of Christ. But perhaps there's something more — perhaps Jesus was pushing Peter to reflect more deeply on what it means to love him. Sometimes, we speak the words "I love you" by rote, without grasping their true meaning. May we always be mindful of what it means to truly love someone and to love as Christ taught us.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to identify one way you can demonstrate true love of God and neighbor. Then pray about how to concretely undertake that sacrificial act of love — and put it into action.

Questions for Reflection:

What does it mean for you to truly love Jesus? Do you know anyone — or is there a particular saint — who has shown you what true love looks like? What are some specific ways you can grow in your ability to truly love?
