We performed the following tasks as directed by the Food Pantry manager:

- 1. Emptied one pallet of non-perishable food items and placed them in designated locations on the storage shelves.
- 2. Opened and removed from boxes various non-perishable food items and placed them on shelves by specific food item category (ie. fruit, vegetables, pasta, beans, soup, etc.).
- 3. Emptied 50 pound bag of pinto beans, placed them into separate 2 pound plastic bags and sealed the bags with mechanical device.

Having completed all of the aforementioned tasks by 10:30, and given no further tasks to perform, we left the Food Pantry at 10:30 AM.
