

From the Deacon's Bench

Greeting brothers as we begin the Month of November.

Turning the clock back we also turn our attention to:

All Hallows Eve or Halloween The word Halloween or Hallowe'en ('Saints' evening) is of Christian origin; a term equivalent to 'All Hallows Eve' as attested in Old Enalish.

The word hallowe[']en comes from the Scots

(not to be confused with Scottish Gaelic)

form of All Hallows' Eve (the evening before All Hallows' Day):

"even" is the Scots term for 'eve' or 'evening',

contracted to e'en or een; (All) Hallow(s) E(v)en became Hallowè'én.

Now with that out of the way, it is important for us to understand how all this flows together.

All Hollows Eve, is night **before** the Feasts of All Hollows or Saints, also known as Solemnity of All Saints...

Which is then followed All Souls day: Halloween □ All Saint's □ All Soul's Got it!

Historically, from the 4th century, feasts commemorating all Christian martyrs were held in various places, often on various dates near Easter and Pentecost. At some point in the 9th century, some churches in the British Isles began holding the commemoration of all saints on 1 November. Then, Pope Gregory IV, also in the 9th century, extended

the Feast to the Universal Catholic Church.

Thus, for us, in the Roman Rite, the liturgical celebration begins with Vespers on the evening of 31 October.

All Hallows' Eve (All Saints' Eve or "Halloween"), ends with Compline on 1 November. All of which happens the day **before** All Souls' Day which commemorates the faithful departed. Why???? Because...

From our Catholic Teaching and **T**radition the celebration of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day stems from the knowledge that there is a Divinely powerful spiritual bond between the three states that make up the Church; as part of the Mystical Body of Christ. (CCC954)

Church Triumphant -- Latin: Ecclesia Triumphans

(those Souls in Heaven)

2. Church Militant -- Latin: Ecclesia Militans

(those still living here on Earth, fighting against sin)

3. Church Penitent -- Latin:

Ecclesia Poenitens

(those faithful departed Souls in Purgatory) Keeping all of this in mind, I encourage all who can, please attend Saint Rose's Mass of Remembrance, 6 November, 2025 at 6pm and with a reception to follow in the Parish Hall.

Also, remember that Individual Mass intentions are **not** taken during the month of November. We remember



and pray for <u>ALL</u> deceased loved ones throughout the month of November.





Supreme Chaplain's Challenge by Archbishop William E. Lori

"You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

(Gospel for Nov. 16, Lk 21:17-19)

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to learn more about the lives of the saints by selecting one or more martyrs to read about and then reflecting on how you can imitate his or her perseverance and hope.

Jesus promised his faithful disciples many things — that he will always be with us, that we will receive if we ask, and that he would give us rest. He also promised that we would be hated and that we would be persecuted for the sake of his name. We must persevere and remain faithful despite the hardships we suffer for our faith. May we always put into action St. Paul's admonition: "Rejoice in hope, endure in affliction, persevere in prayer" (Rom 12:12).

Questions for Reflection:

Have you ever struggled with hope when life has brought challenges? Have you ever experienced bigotry, rejection, hostility or hatred on account of your Catholic faith? What are some concrete ways you can seek to grow in perseverance to face life's difficulties?
