From the Deacon's Bench

To get to **Easter Sunday** we must first pass through the Garden.

Brothers, Greetings as we end April, and begin May.

May opens with both the Feast of Saint Joseph and the first of not one, but two, Full Moons! The **Flower Moon**, reaches its peak on Friday, 1 May, while the second Moon, the Blue Moon, which is also a Micromoon, peaks on Sunday, 31 May.

Micromoon: occurs when a moon is at or near reaching apogee, which in this case is actually on 1 June. **Apogee:** refers to the point when the Moon is farthest from Earth. When the Full Moon occurs near this point, it's classified as a "micromoon"—the opposite of a supermoon, so it will appear slightly smaller and dimmer than usual. The name "Flower Moon" has been attributed to Algonquin peoples.

IF the name Algonquin rings a bell, it is because Saint Kateri Tekakwitha, was a Mohawk/Algonquin maiden, the daughter of Kenneronkwa, a Mohawk chief, and Kahenta, an Algonquin woman, who had been captured in a raid and then adopted and assimilated into the tribe.

Saint Joseph of the Tribe of David is honored on 1 May as **Saint Joseph the Worker**. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XII in 1955 to emphasize the dignity of work and to coincide with International Workers' Day, also known as May Day, a secular celebration of labor and workers' rights. It was in the 1950's, during the "Cold War" that the Soviet Union proclaimed themselves as the defender of workers and utilized May Day as an opportunity to exalt Communism and parade its military prowess. Pope Pius XII chose the date specifically to ensure that workers did not lose the Christian understanding of work.

The Apostles would also go to work, especially Saint Peter, after the descent of the Holy Spirit. Saint Luke, in Acts Chapter One, gives us the most details. At the Ascension, 40 days after **Easter**, Jesus first told them to wait in Jerusalem for the coming of the **Holy Spirit**. **9 days later...**

Pentecost!

Pentecost's date depends on **Easter**, which follows the lunar calendar:

Easter falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the Spring Equinox. (you all know that). **Pentecost** is **always** 50 days (7 weeks + 1 day) **after Easter**. Because Easter moves between 22 March and 25 April, Pentecost can fall anywhere from 10 May to 13 June. This year is it 24 May.

SO...

As we approach **Pentecost**, the Birthday of the Church, I encourage everyone to pray **The Novena to the Holy Spirit.**

Nine days of prayer, from the Friday after Ascension Thursday to the Saturday before Pentecost, focusing on the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

We all need those gifts:

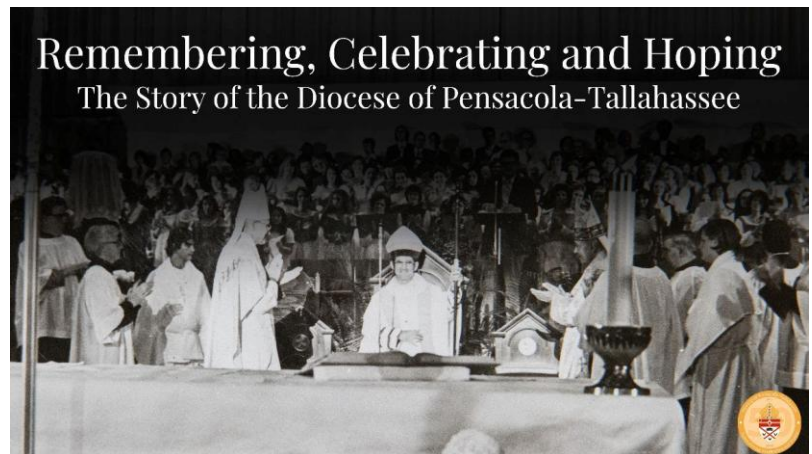

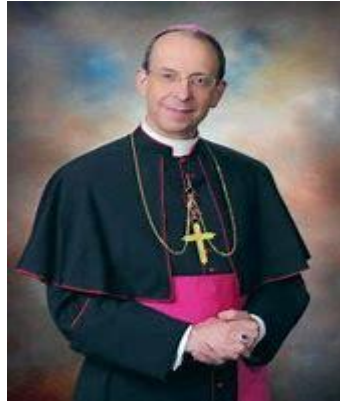
Let us pray:

Supreme Chaplain's Challenge

Then the two recounted what had taken place on the way and how he was made known to them in the breaking of the bread. (Gospel for April 19, Lk 24:35)

The disciples on the road to Emmaus did not recognize Jesus until the breaking of the bread. Jesus promised he would be with us always, and the Eucharist is his fulfillment of that promise. We encounter his presence most profoundly in the Eucharist, where he is truly present — body, blood, soul, and divinity — under the appearance of bread and wine. The disciples' experience on the road to Emmaus was no ordinary meal, but an encounter with Christ, who invites us, too, to enter into communion with him through the Eucharist.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to remain in prayer and adoration for several minutes after Mass to grow in awareness of Christ's true presence in the Eucharist.

Questions for Reflection:

Do you fully realize it is the true body and blood of Christ that you receive in the Eucharist? Do you habitually pray in thanksgiving after Communion for this immeasurable gift? Do you consistently participate in Mass on Sundays and holy days? Do you make an effort to attend more frequently, so that you might avail yourself of the graces of this great sacrament?
