














Words of Wisdom from our Grand Knight



Lecture's Minute

THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS EMBLEM

The emblem of the order dates from the Second Supreme Council on May 12, 1883, when it was designed by James T. Mullen, who was then Supreme Knight.

A quick glance at the emblem indicates a shield mounted upon the Formee Cross. A Formee Cross is one that narrows at the center and flares to be broader at the perimeter. The shield is that associated with a medieval Knight. The Formee Cross is the representation of a traditionally artistic design of the Cross of Christ through which all graces of redemption were procured for mankind. This then represents the Catholic spirit of the order.

Mounted on the shield are four objects: a fasces (which is a bound bundle of wooden rods); an axe standing vertically; and, crossed behind it an anchor; and a dagger or short sword.

The fasces from Roman days is symbolic of authority which must exist in any tightly-bonded and efficiently operating organization. It symbolizes teamwork, the strength inherent in unity and fraternity.

The battle axe, placed on the shield, symbolizes action taken to overcome obstacles or ambushes on the road to accomplishing one's objectives.

The anchor is the mariner's symbol for Columbus, patron of the Order. It is an instrument designed to hold a ship in place, representing that which stabilizes.

The short sword or dagger was the weapon of the Knight when engaged upon an errand of mercy. It symbolizes honor, distinction, bravery, and courage. Thus, the shield expresses Catholic Knighthood in organized merciful action, and the letters K of C, proclaims this specific form of activity.

The red, white, and blue in the background of the shield and the foreground of the Cross are the colors of our country.

As such, red symbolizes giving of one's self, courage, valor, and heroism in the fight for one's faith, one's language, and one's rights.

White represents innocence, frankness, and purity of intention.

Blue represents the sky, that is, God who watches over the world. It is the symbol of hope, peace, and confidence.

The other color contained within the emblem is Gold (or yellow). This color denotes the richness that comes with hard work.

There is also the ecclesiastical symbolism of the colors red, white, and blue.

Red becomes the reflection of the drips of Christ's redemptive blood shed upon Calvary, and of the martyr's blood shed in defense of faith. Red, then, is the symbol of faith, of belief in Christ.

White is the color of the Eucharistic Bread; a symbol of the infinite love God has for man. White, then, denotes Christ-like charity.

Blue is the color of our Lady's mantle, in which she wrapped her beloved Son, through whom came salvation to a sinful world. Blue is then the symbol of hope.

Perhaps now we can all have a better understanding and a deeper appreciation for the emblem we all proudly display on the shirts we wear.

Prayer for the Canonization of Blessed Michael J. McGivney




