Words of Wisdom from our Grand Knight

Bah, Humbug !!!

On December 19, 1843, a novella written by Charles Dickens entitled A Christmas Carol was first published. By Christmas Eve, just days later, the novella was sold out. In 1844 thirteen additional editions of this novella were published, each selling out quickly.

I am sure that all of us remember the story of A Christmas Carol. The novella begins on Christmas Eve in London seven years after the death of Ebenezer Scrooge's business partner, Jacob Marley. Scrooge was an elderly miser whose frugality knew no limits. If it were not for local custom, he would not allow his overworked, underpaid clerk the day off on Christmas.

That night, Scrooge was visited by the ghost of his former partner who now wanders Earth wrapped in heavy chains and money boxes resulting from a lifetime of greed and selfishness. Marley warns Scrooge that he has one chance to avoid the same fate and that he would be visited by three spirits and he must listen to them or be cursed forever.

The first spirit, the Ghost of Christmas Past, takes Scrooge back to his boyhood and shows him a time of his young innocence. He is taken to the home of Marley's daughter where he hears a very unflattering description of himself. Upon hearing this, he demands to leave. On the second night, the second spirit, the Ghost of Christmas Present, takes Scrooge to a festive market with people purchasing the makings for their Christmas dinner. He also visits Bob Cratchit's family and is introduced to his youngest son, Tiny Tim who is seriously ill. The second spirit tells Scrooge that Tiny Tim will die unless certain things change. Finally, before disappearing, the spirit mocks Scrooge for his attitude towards two emaciated children named Ignorance and Want.

The third spirit, the Ghost of Christmas Yet to Come, shows Scrooge on Christmas Day in the future. The ghost shows him scenes of the most disliked person's funeral and is attended by locals only if lunch is provided. Scrooge asks the spirit to see tenderness connected with any death; the ghost shows him Bob Cratchit and his family mourning the death of Tiny Tim. The spirit then allows Scrooge to see his own tombstone which has been severely neglected over time. Sobbing, Scrooge pledges to change his ways.

Scrooge awakens on Christmas morning a changed man. He sends a large turkey to Bob Cratchit's home and spends the afternoon at his nephew's Christmas Party. The following day he gives Cratchit an increase in pay and shows more interest in Tiny Tim's welfare. From then on, Scrooge treats everyone with kindness, generosity and compassion, embodying the spirit of Christmas.

This novella has also been described as a Christian allegory. An allegory is a story or picture that can be interpreted to reveal a hidden meaning, typically a moral one. I would suggest that the story of Scrooge is strangely similar to how Advent prepares within us the way for the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. What do you think?




Chaplain's Minute










A Story of Cashews

A young priest, recently assigned to a large parish, was preparing for his first Christmas since being ordained. The Monsignor, his boss, explained to him that he would learn valuable lessons in understanding what it takes to run a parish.

The closer Christmas got, the more “glad tidings” showed up at the parish office for the two priests to share. One day a beautiful tin of mixed nuts arrived. The Monsignor took it back to the Rectory and placed it on the coffee table in the living room that both priests shared. The temptation was too great to ignore so, as often as they could, the two thought of every conceivable excuse to walk by the tin to complete a menial task. Of course, they had to dip into the tin to grab a handful of nuts. “Waste not, want not”! Occasionally, when Monsignor wasn’t around, the young priest would stop and hand-sort out a few extra cashews and wolf them down.

After a few days of this the young priest noticed that the remaining nuts were dramatically lacking the adequate number of cashews necessary to balance the mix. Guilt came over him and he began to worry that the Monsignor would notice and lecture him about his self-indulgence. He immediately drove to the local grocery store and proceeded to peruse every aisle until he found the baking section. And there he was, face-to-face with the “holy grail” of the nut family. He picked up a large bag of cashews and looked at the price tag. His eyebrows raised and he swallowed hard. He raced to the checkout where two elderly ladies were in front of him. They zeroed in on his purchase, looked at each other with raised eyebrows, and one whispered to the other, “I thought they had to take a vow of poverty!” The college-aged checkout grabbed the bag, flipped it over to find the bar code and commented, “Wow, Father, big day in the collection basket? Party on dude!”

The young priest, embarrassed beyond limits, picked up his brown grocery bag and headed for the parking lot like he was going to a fire. “Father, forgive me”, he muttered. “When will this nightmare end?” As he pulled into the parking lot at the Rectory, the Monsignor was there to meet him. “Busted!” he thought to himself as the driver’s side back door opened. “What have you got there, son?” Sweat was running down the forehead of the young priest as the Monsignor opened the bag. “Oh, bless your heart, son. I’ve been eating all the cashews out of the tin all week and feeling guilty about it. Thank you for thinking of me. I would never have the guts to be seen in public buying a bag of these. I’m so glad you did. Let’s go in and sample the loot!” After opening the bag and sharing its contents, the two simultaneously realized that the cashews were not all that special and they began to laugh. The Monsignor said. “I’ve got an idea.” He proceeded to take from the tin a Brazil nut, a walnut, an almond, a hazel nut, four Spanish peanuts, and mixed in a new cashew. He shook them around in his hand like casino dice and flung the whole works down the hatch. He crunched and swallowed, clasped his palms together and said, “It’s the mixture of all the different nuts together that makes it all taste so good!”







2025 CITIZENS WITH DISABILITIES DRIVE

Brothers, our **Citizens with Disabilities Drive** will be here before we know it. We will be donning our bright yellow aprons and passing out Tootsie Rolls and Tootsie Pops and of course asking for donations after all the masses at O.L.M.C on Saturday February 1 and Sunday February 2, 2025. Our PUBLIX drive will be held on Friday, Saturday and Sunday February 7th, 8th and 9th, 2025. On Friday and Saturday there will be 2-hour shifts from 9:00 am until 7:00 pm. On Sunday we will have 3 shifts from 9:00 am until 3:00 pm. Please sign up to work a mass and a shift at Publix at our January 2025 officers and council meetings.

The “Citizens with Disabilities Drive” was started in the early 1970s and has grown to include the majority of councils in the country. It has collected and distributed more than 390 million dollars since then. Various councils hold the drive at different times throughout the year. Our council participates the weekend before and the weekend of the Superbowl.

Council 15821 has taken part in the “Tootsie Roll Drive” since its beginning. We had a rocky start not having a suitable location in “our parish” and we inadvertently infringed on the locations of councils in other parishes. Publix helped us out greatly by building the store in the plaza at the corner of U.S. 41 and Blackburn Point (Old Venice Rd.) We have used that location since then.

For many years we had to send the total collection, less the cost of the candy, to the State Council. State would take 10 % to distribute to charities at the State level and then cut checks to our selected charities and mail them to our council for distribution. Then the rules changed, and State Council cut the checks and mailed them directly to our selected charities. Then the rules changed again and now we keep all our collection. We cut the checks and distribute them to our charities. Our charities this year are **Venice Special Olympics, Venice Challenger Baseball and Dreams are Free** which is the Autism program at St. Marthas School in Sarasota.

REMEMBER – please sign up at our meetings in January 2025 so I don’t have to make a bunch of phone calls to fill the roster. Feel free to take a shift with your spouse or significant other, especially if she is a member of the Ladies Auxiliary.



Monthly McGivney Message – Happy Jubilee!

With the Church's Jubilee Year launching this month, it is a good time for the Father McGivney Guild to start reaching out regularly to members. Together, Guild members form a prayerful community of more than 180,000 devotees of Blessed Michael McGivney. Please know that you are remembered in a weekly Mass offered for your intentions, which you may submit to the fathermcgivney.org website.

But what does a holy priest of the 19th century have to do with Jubilee 2025? Quite a lot, when you consider how many themes of the Jubilee coincide with the ministry of Father McGivney. The overall theme for the Jubilee – Peregrinantes in Spem (Pilgrims in Hope) could sum up Father McGivney's priestly life as he cared for and brought hope to a downtrodden Catholic population, many of them poor immigrants and all of them targets of anti-Catholic prejudice.

Also, on Dec. 26 – two days after the start of the Jubilee – Pope Francis will open the Holy doors at a Rome prison as a “tangible sign of the message of hope” for prisoners. We can recall Father McGivney's heroic ministry to a man on death row. Father McGivney regularly visited convicted killer Chip Smith, who reclaimed his Catholic faith and went repentant to the gallows.

Today, Blessed Michael McGivney continues his prayerful presence through his heavenly intercession, as we can witness in the Guild's [Favors](#) section.

I look forward to our future Messages, as we pray for one another and for the day we will be able to say “Saint” Michael McGivney, Diocesan Priest and Founder of the Knights of Columbus!


