"ALL OF US"

On January 6, 2025, I watched a YouTube video from PragerU about "Girling the Boy Scouts". This video claims to chart the downfall of the traditionally male youth program which used to be referred to as the Boy Scouts of America. The video claims that their downfall has been caused by the repeated attempt by outside forces, mostly feminist, to emasculate the organization. The emasculation was done under the pretense of "inclusivity".

In 2015 the Boy Scouts of America, a Youth Program in the United States that was 100% male oriented, under pressure of its lack of inclusivity, allowed openly gay Scoutmasters or Adult Leaders to be accepted. Shortly after that, the BSA opened its doors to boys claiming to be trans Scouts. In 2019 the organization added girls to its program as the boys siblings accompanied the boys on some weekend family campouts. Last year they changed their name to Scouting America.

Having been an Adult Leader in the Boy Scouts of America for over 43 years, I saw all of this happen. Here in Southwest Florida, we did not have this issue and it was not even remotely considered. My role at the time was to lead and train other, mostly new, Adult leaders. If these new Adult Leaders were properly trained, then they would be able to properly create an interesting program for the male youth that they served. It worked for a very long time; more than 100 years.


The Knights of Columbus shares a much different story. While it is 100% male, and the organization has been very active for much more than 100 years, 143 years in fact, it is in no way affected by the outside influences demanding greater "inclusivity". As we attempt to compare the two organizations, I know that the twelfth point of the Scout law states that "A Scout is Reverent". When a boy was being reviewed upon his application to become an Eagle Scout, if he could not tell us that he believed in God, then he would fail. Later in my Scouting career, that was changed to an Eagle Scout applicant must believe in a Supreme Being. On one occasion, I was on a review team which was confronted by a Scout's belief in a celestial being controlling the universe. While he did not believe in God or in any god, he had a belief that satisfied the updated rule.

As we all know, the Knights have a profound moral compass. To maintain the Knights original founding principles, they are fully intertwined in what we do and why we do it. In 143 years, history has had a profound affect on the Knights as it has with many other fraternal organizations. There have been many laws passed by both the federal and state governments to correct many of the original reasons to form these fraternal organizations. However, the core principles of the Knights remain unchanged:

- Charity Our Catholic faith teaches us to "Love thy neighbor as thyself."
- Unity None of us is as good as all of us.
- Fraternity Blessed Michael J. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus, in large part, to provide assistance to the widows and children left behind when the family breadwinner died often prematurely. The Knight's top-rated insurance program continues to do this today.
- Patriotism Members of the Knights are patriotic citizens and are proud of their devotion to God and country, and believe in standing up for both.

I am very proud to be a member of the Knights and of Council 15821, and especially to be part of "all of us".

Is The Jar Full?



A philosophy professor once stood up before his class with a large empty mayonnaise jar. He filled the jar to the top with large rocks and asked his students if the jar was full.

The pebbles represent the things in your life that matter, but that you could live without.

The pebbles are certainly things that give your life meaning (such as your job, house, hobbies, and friendships), but they are not critical for you to have a meaningful life.

These things often come and go, and are not permanent or essential to your overall well-being.


Finally, the sand represents the remaining filler things in your life, and material possessions. This could be small things such as <u>watching television</u>, browsing through your favorite <u>social media site</u>, or running errands.


These things don't mean much to your life as a whole, and are likely only done to waste time or get small tasks accomplished. The Moral:

The metaphor here is that if you start with putting sand into the jar, you will not have room for rocks or pebbles.

This holds true with the things you let into your life. If you spend all of your time on the small and insignificant things, you will run out of room for the things that are actually important.

In order to have a more effective and efficient life, pay attention to the "rocks," because they are critical to your <u>long-term well-being</u>.













Dear Brother Knights,

I wanted, in this bulletin, to share a bit more about our upcoming Lenten Mission, which will take place here from Monday 17th February until Wednesday 19th February. This is the first Mission that we have held in the parish for a number of years and should be a blessed few days in the life of the parish. The Mission will be led by 3 Dominican priests from the Angelicum college in Rome.

The theme of the Mission is "The Presence of God" and is focused very much on the power of God's presence with us in the Eucharist. The three Dominicans will preach at all the masses the weekend before the Mission starts to explain more but I wanted to share a few things with you first.

Firstly, this Mission team has celebrated this Mission in many different dioceses throughout the US and have, in recent years, celebrated Missions in this Diocese at Epiphany Cathedral and at Incarnation, both of which were very well received. Secondly, a word about the format of the Mission. On all three days of the Mission the talks will start at 8.30am (after the regular 8am morning mass) and at 7pm. The talk will be the same morning and evening so it's fine to, say, come to the Monday morning talk and then Tuesday and Wednesday evening; the input will be the same.

Thirdly, the Wednesday will be the climax of the Mission, and will be an early pre--Lenten Reconciliation service. As at our usual Reconciliation services, there will be a number of priests available to hear confessions both at the morning and evening service. Also, on the Wednesday, there will be a Eucharistic healing service, which is truly a powerful and intimate encounter with the Lord.

The whole Mission, but especially the Eucharistic healing service will, I hope and pray, lead everyone attending closer and closer to the Lord, especially through knowing and experiencing his presence in the Eucharist. I would warmly encourage everyone to consider attending what I am sure will be a powerful and lifechanging experience.

When you think about the Knights of Columbus, the first image you may have is the 4th Degree Knight wearing their distinct uniform at church functions, acting as ushers for the Pope and showing their respect at funerals. Each degree within the Knights of Columbus represents a core principle, the 1st degree represents charity, the 2nd degree represents unity, the 3rd degree represents fraternity, and the 4th degree represents patriotism. The 4th degree patriotism was added in 1900 to show that the Knights are loyal to both God and country. Knights becoming a member of the 4th degree, hold the title of "Sir Knight," and volunteer to participate in the color and honor guard ceremonies which is the group that wears the uniform.

The primary function of the 4th degree assembly is to serve veterans programs, active duty catholic programs including funding for seminarians preparing to become Catholic Chaplains in the Armed Forces, and other military programs. The 4th degree assemblies make contributions to many veterans programs including disabled veterans programs, veteran recovery programs, and many more. The 4th degree Sir Knights helps keep patriotism alive in their councils and church by setting a good example by reminding everyone that patriotism is part of the Knights of Columbus, as demonstrated by saying the pledge of allegiance in addition to prayers before each council and assembly meeting.

On a personal note: I decided to become a 4th degree knight because I wanted to learn and understand the full order of the Knights of Columbus. I have also served in the military and I have a high level of patriotism. You may ask yourself, what happens once I become a 4th degree knight? Once you become a 4th degree Sir Knight, you will belong to an assembly which is similar to a council, except that all assembly members are 4th degree knights and guests are not permitted to attend. You will be a member of a council at your church and an assembly member which includes all 4th degree knights from several councils. You will have a separate membership card for the 4th degree which also includes annual dues. The assembly has leadership similar to a council, but in comparison, the assembly head is called Faithful Navigator while the head of a council, is called the grand knight. One of the monthly activities I find to be very moving is attending the No Veterans Forgotten ceremony at the Sarasota National Cemetery. A full military funeral is rendered to those that passed during that month and had no one attend their funeral. Consider joining the 4th degree. You have a lot to gain and nothing to lose.

IMMOKALEE REPORT

Happy New Year and many thanks to all who helped make both the Knight's Immokalee Food Drive and the Christmas Giving Tree huge successes!

For December, the Immokalee Food Drive for Our Lady of Guadalupe collected over \$1800 in monetary donations and 3100 pounds of food valued at \$7750 for a total value of over \$9500.

As this is December, the 6 month half-fiscal year report follows. In the past 6 months, our Knights have collected 13,452 pounds of food (6.7 tons) generously donated by our parishioners and valued at \$30,002. In addition, parishioners donated \$8589 for a total value of \$38,591 in food and monetary donations.

These are staggering figures, and they represent the selfless commitment of our Knights of Columbus and the incredible generosity of our parishioners. It solidifies OLMC's standing as the largest donator of food and money to Our Lady of Guadalupe in Immokalee, Florida.

Let us not forget that our Knights also worked diligently to collect and load thousands of children's gifts into a 26' truck, and drove it to Immokalee, after spending many hours bagging and categorizing the toys for distribution. In addition, about 50 new bicycles were delivered.

Although it is difficult to place a monetary value on a truckload of expensive new toys, categorized and delivered 100 miles away, an estimate of over \$30,000 is not unrealistic.

I take this opportunity to personally thank all the Knights of Columbus Council 15821 for their tireless efforts in making these programs enormously successful, and a special thanks to all the parishioners who generously donated food, money and gifts. You all made Christmas special for hundreds of children who otherwise would have had little to celebrate. THANK YOU ALL!
