

### Words of Wisdom from our Grand Knight

Growing up in a small town in the 50's and 60's had some advantages; and very few disadvantages. The biggest advantage was our town's size, about 10,000 people and made up of primarily "minorities from Europe". Our town was about 80% Catholic with the Irish attending St Mary's, the Italians attending St Anthony's, the Slovaks attending St Stephen's, and the Polish attending St Casimir's. Our German neighbors attended St Paul's Lutheran Church. In addition to two public Grade schools, we had three Catholic Grade schools and one Lutheran Grade school.

The primary industry in this small town was glass bottles. A typical glass bottle plant in the US at the time had two vats for molten glass. In our town, Owens-Illinois Glass had 32 vats and Thatcher Glass had 24 vats and these two plants employed 75% of the people in town and had 4 rotating shifts. These two plants never closed down; not even for Christmas. The remarkable thing about this town was that it had 47 churches and 47 bars. Most of the other Churches had quite small congregations, but all 47 bars prospered especially the ones across the street from the glass plants.

At St Mary's we had three and sometimes four Priests. My Dad took my brothers and I to the 7:15 AM Mass every Sunday and we sat on the left side about 10 rows back from the front. Even when we were late, the pew was left open. The unique thing about going to Mass then was that every Priest preached "fire and brimstone". We were all going to hell if we did not follow the straight and narrow path that each Priest prescribed. In talking with other kids, their Priests did the same thing at their Churches. But, once a year, there was a reprieve. That was when the Pastor of the Church got up and had "Money Talk Sunday".

Well, my Brothers, that is what we will do this month. Instead of pontificating on some abstract fact or event, I want to give each of you a brief look ahead for some things that our Council needs to do. If you remember about 8 months ago, we started a month late in getting our budget approved. Well, not this year. There are three things which we must do to get our 2025-2026 Program Year off to a smooth start.

We must complete our Council Calendar to best of our ability by the end of March. I just sent out our last updated version for this year, and it was Version 10 or v.10. So, as you can see, changes or corrections are made during the year.

With our Calendar mostly complete, we will need to create our budget for the 2025-2026 Program year. We need to complete this by the end of April as the approval process takes two meetings. With the Budget mostly complete, our final step is to plan the steps necessary to become a Star Council.

The final step of our transition process is for a Nominating Committee to be established which will create a slate of Officers which will be presented to the Membership for their approval. These nominees will be voted upon at the June Membership Meeting along with the final budget approval.

Finally, until I announce the Nominating Committee Chair and Members for this year, please let me know if you are interested in becoming an Officer or Director of our Council, or simply just wanting to change from one position to another. There are openings every year and this year will be no different. If you have any questions about this process, please contact me.



I am writing this brief reflection in the immediate aftermath of our Parish Mission. For those of you who were involved in the Mission, or who attended, you know that it was a blessed Mission.

I'd like to begin by thanking all those who were actively involved in helping the Mission be the success that it was, ESPECIALLY Darwin Reeck who was the parish point person for the Mission and who helped coordinate all the practical elements of the Mission. He worked countless hours arranging the Mission and countless hours the week of the Mission so a huge thank you to Darwin for all his hard work on the Mission; we truly couldn't have done it without him!

And I'd like to thank all the Knights who were actively involved in the Mission in some capacity or another; your help was greatly appreciated. And, for those of you who helped out in the evenings, especially the Wednesday evening, you know how good the attendance was; when the Mission team arrived I told them that we would have less people at the evening service because of our demographic and I am happy to say that I was wrong on all 3 days, with the evening service being significantly bigger on all 3 days.

The Monday Mission talk was a powerful, and very personal, reflection from Fr. Luke Buckles on Divine Providence where he outlined each of the many steps in his journey of faith, of how God led him from being raised as a Lutheran in the mid-West to becoming a Dominican priest, and how God has continued to guide him in each of the stages of his vocation and his life. As I was listening to his talk it, of course, prompted me to reflect on God's guidance and God's providence in my own life and, like Fr. Luke, looking back on the journey I have taken to becoming your pastor, I can clearly see God's hand and God's providence molding me and shaping me into the person I am today. Maybe, in future newsletters, I'll have a multi-part article outlining how God has guided, and continues to guide, me in my journey of faith! Please let me know if you would like me to do that!

The Tuesday Mission talk was, similarly, a powerful personal reflection from Fr. Ben, the Mission leader, on the Divine Indwelling, stressing the way that, through our baptisms, we are all Temples of the Holy Spirit, and that each of us are called to cleanse that Temple especially through the sacrament of Reconciliation. And Fr. Ben reflected on the change and growth in his own life as a result of going to Reconciliation. That reflection prompted me to reflect on my own personal experience of Reconciliation and the change that I have also experienced through the grace of the Sacrament. This week I was hearing Confessions for 3+ hours each day and I, like nearly every priest I know, LOVE hearing Confessions!

The Wednesday Mission talk was a short, but powerful, reflection from Fr. Manuel, on the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. This, of course, is sadly a truth that many of us take for granted and was a personal opportunity for me to reflect on the awesome truth of what happens when I consecrate the gifts of bread and wine; the truth that Jesus is TRULY and FULLY present, in the Eucharist, and in my heart, and we can enter that Temple within us at any time to spend time with the God who loves us infinitely and unconditionally.

My prayer for all of you, especially those who were able to attend the Mission, is that you may all know God's providence and guidance, know that you truly are a Temple of the Holy Spirit, and know God's presence in your heart and in the Eucharist. May God bless you all.

#### **Lecturer's Minute**

#### TIME FOR GOD

The following was taken from an article written in 2009 under the title "What are we doing here?" While this article was written about the gift of time in relation to God, you may also consider the time you give to your wife, children, fiancé, parents, etc.

In Matthew's Gospel, it is written:

Jesus came with them to a place called Gethsemane, and said to his disciples, "Sit here while I go over there to pray." He took along Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and began to feel sorrow and distress. The he said to them, "My soul is sorrowful even to death. Remain here and keep watch with me." He advanced a little and fell prostrate in prayer, saying, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet, not as I will, but as you will." When he returned to his disciples he found them asleep. He said to Peter, "So you could not keep watch with me for one hour? Watch and pray that you may not undergo the test. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."

There are 168 total hours in a week. The average person sleeps about 8 hours each day or 56 hours each week; that leaves 112 waking hours in that same week. For us working stiffs, 40 hours of those 112 are spent in pursuit of a paycheck. The remaining 72 hours in our week are often filled with TV, visiting friends and family, laundry, grocery shopping, etc. There is never enough time.

But where do we fit in time for prayer, silence, and scripture? If we were to give God the first fruits of our time, say 10%, then the total number of hours we would spend in the presence of the Lord would be 16.8 hours per week or 2.5 hours per day. But wait, only 112 of those hours are we awake! That leaves only 11.2 or 1.6 hours each day for prayer. But wait, if we subtract the 40 hours we are at work there are only 72 hours left. That makes 7.2 hours per week, or a little over 1 hour per day of quality time devoted to the one who created us, the one who died for us.

Do we approach one hour of prayer each day in silence, reading the scriptures? Do we keep a scheduled holy hour each week in the silent presence of the Blessed Sacrament? When we are at Sunday Mass do we talk to our friends, read the bulletin, or allow our minds to wander?

According to a recent survey, the average American watches 28 hours of TV each week; that's 4 hours each day of mindless, inactive viewing. How many channels are on our TV's? Who is our God? When we consider the stewardship of time, how much is spent in prayer and how much is spent following reality shows? Do we know more about the lives of the saints or the sports and movie stars? Which is nearer, the Bible or the remote? Too often "our spirit is willing" but our flesh is parked in front of the TV. Perhaps we have some things to think about as we approach the season of Lent.

In searching the web for the history of Valentine's Day, I stumbled across a number of very interesting articles written about Valentines Day. The legend of St Valentine has a few twists. Evidently the Roman Emperor Claudius II executed a priest on February 14th named Valentine for defying his decree that forbad soldiers to marry. In continuing to perform marriages, Valentine sealed his fate. There was also a St Valentine who was the Bishop of Terni, Italy. He also was executed by Claudius II, allegedly for helping Christians escape Roman prisons. Another legend claims that a prisoner named Valentine who befriended his jailer's daughter and cured her blindness, wrote her a letter signed "from your Valentine" before he was put to death.

Pope Gelasius I is said to have started the celebration of St Valentine's Day to replace the Roman fertility festival of Lupercalia in the 5th century. Literature scholars believe the holiday became associated with romance in the 14th century with Geoffrey's Chaucer's poem The Parlement of Foules that refers to birds choosing their mates on St. Valentine's Day. During the 19th century, with advances in printing technology, people began to exchange Valentine's Days cards. An enterprising chocolate maker, Richard Cadbury, seized the moment to design a heart shaped box filled with chocolates. Not to be outdone, NECCO – New England Confectionary Company (remember Necco wafers?) created the Conversation Hearts that are still sold today. In 1913, Hallmark Card seized the moment to mass produces cards that most of us buy on the 13th of February to stay out of trouble.

Regardless of whether its truth or legend, St Valentine's Day allows us to take a moment to connect with those we love. Don't forget the chocolates!

#### **IMMOKALEE REPORT**


I am pleased to report that the Food for Families Program has again broken new records for February 2025 and for the 2024 calendar year.


Due to the overwhelming generosity of our parishioners, this month our Knights collected and delivered 3300 pounds of food with a monetary value of \$8250. In addition, over \$1400 in monetary donations were received. Many thanks to all who donated their time, treasure and talent to this worthy cause.

For the 2024 calendar year, over 24,000 pounds of food (12 tons) were delivered to Our Lady of Guadalupe Social Services in Immokalee. This food is presently valued at over \$50,000. Monetary donations of over \$18,000 were also generously given by OLMC parishioners for a total value of over \$68,000.

It must be remembered that the Giving Tree received over \$20,000 worth of toys, Pack & Plays and bicycles which were categorized, loaded and delivered by our dedicated Knights.

For the year, the total value of donations to the people of Immokalee were just shy of \$90,000. This serves as a testament to the unfailing generosity of the OLMC community and the selfless service of our Knights of Columbus Council 15821.
