

Words of Wisdom from our Grand Knight REPETITION

Brothers of Council 15821, Greetings and Blessings to Each of You,

I have had quite a few Brothers stop and comment about my remarks which I made at our last Council Membership Meeting. Surprisingly, it has all been positive. So, since repetition is definitely an aid to positive reinforcement, let me state a few things again.

First, and most importantly, I am very proud of what we do for the size of the Council which we are. None of us should take a back seat to our two larger brother Councils in the Venice area. We currently have 107 members and they provide an inordinate amount of assistance to our parish. Our goal for growth this year is six (6) new members. We have met that goal with a couple to spare. We will continue with our final Church recruiting weekends in April 5-6. As an old United States Marine commercial stated, we "are looking for a few good men".

Typically, most of our new members, new Brothers, are recruited by current members. I trust the judgment of our members in bringing their friends and acquaintances to become Knights. In addition to the friends of our members, we need to recruit from men who attend weekend Mass. That is a very strong trait to use in searching for new members. I think that we have the ability to find a few good men yet this year and a few more next year.

Our main purpose in recruiting new members is to share the benefits of belonging to the Knights of Columbus and Council 15821, and for fraternity. As I stated earlier, our Council does a lot of good work for Father Anthony and for our OLMC Parish. During our last Exemplification, many of our new Brothers told me that one of the reasons that they joined was how helpful we are to the parish. I think that is a great reason; that being charity of time. The "We" in the former sentence, I guess, is also defined as unity.

While we typically have more help that we need at events involving food, there are other times that we never have enough help ... specifically selling tickets to all of these events involving food. And, there are a few other things where we need a bit more help from time to time. That is specifically why I asked each of you who is not already very, very busy, to consider doing one more thing to help our Council and parish with your time. Again, this is a request for TIME; not money.

I do want to thank you for what you do to help. If you are doing all that you can, I accept that, and thank you. If you can help with one more thing at some time during the year, please consider volunteering. The adage that many hands make for light work certainly applies to us.

The Moral:


Aside from making wise decisions, you always need to

Commander Susan Leary earned a Bachelor of Science Degree at Xavier University and received her Doctorate in Dental Surgery from the Ohio State University School of Dentistry. CDR Leary holds a Certificate in Pediatric Dentistry from the Children's Hospital of Michigan. She was commissioned as a Lieutenant in the United States Navy Dental Corps in March of 1982.

She attended Officer Indoctrination School in Newport, Rhode Island in April of 1982. Upon graduation, she was assigned to the United States Navy Dental Center, Okinawa, Japan as the Department Head of Pediatric Dentistry. Following that assignment, she transferred to Naval Dental Center, Norfolk, VA as the Pediatric Dentistry Department Head and as an instructor in the Advanced Clinical Program for General Dentistry. While stationed in Norfolk, she regularly traveled to subordinate clinics at the Naval Air Station, Keflavik, Iceland, Naval Air Station, Bermuda and Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. Upon completion of her tour in Norfolk, CDR Leary transferred to the United States Navy Dental Clinic, Yokosuka Japan, again as the consultant in Pediatric Dentistry for three years. During that tour, CDR Leary would travel to Naval Base, Sasebo Japan and Marine Corps Air Station, Iwakuni, Japan to care for military dependents. She then transferred Naval Dental Center San Diego. CA where she served as the Pediatric Dentistry Department Head and as an instructor in their Advanced Clinical Program in General Dentistry. CDR Leary then transferred to the Naval Medical Center, San Diego. She served as the Pediatric Dentistry Department Head and also an instructor in the General Practice Dental Residency. During her time in the Navy, Commander Leary spent many hours in the main operating room treating special needs patients. She retired in June of 2005 and continued working in Pediatric Dentistry as an associate in a private practice and as mentor in the Rady Children's Hospital Pediatric Dentistry Residency Program.

Captain Terrance Leary earned a Bachelor of Science Degree at the University of Notre Dame and a Doctorate in Dental Surgery at the University of Detroit School of Dentistry. Captain Leary received his commission as a Lieutenant in 1982. He reported to 22nd Dental Company at Camp Lejeune NC. During this tour he deployed with Marine Service Support Group 26 to the eastern Mediterranean and Beirut, Lebanon. In 1985, he transferred to 3nd Dental Company Okinawa, Japan as an Assistant Dental Officer. Following his tour in Okinawa, Lieutenant Leary completed Advanced Clinical Program in General Dentistry training at the Naval Dental Center Norfolk, VA then served for three years there as an Assistant Dental Officer. In 1992, LCDR Leary transferred to the USS Blue Ridge (LCC19) in Yokosuka Japan, to serve as the Dental Department Head and was designated as a Surface Warfare Medical Department Dental Officer. At the end of his Department Head tour, he was promoted to Commander and transferred to the US Navy Dental Clinic, Yokosuka.

On completion of his tour in Yokosuka, he reported to the Naval Dental Center, Southwest (San Diego, CA) where he was the Clinic Director at the Naval Amphibious Base Coronado and the NDC Total Quality Leadership Coordinator. While serving as Clinic Director, he was promoted to the rank of Captain. After four years at the San Diego command, Captain Leary transferred to 13th Dental Company at Marine Corps Air Station, Miramar where he earned the designation as a Fleet Marine Force Warfare Officer and served as a staff dentist. Captain Leary returned to the Naval Dental Center, Southwest in 2002 where he remained until 2006. During this time, he deployed to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba as a member of Joint Task Force – Guantanamo Bay. In 2006, he returned to 13th Dental Company, MCAS Miramar as a staff dentist. During his three year tour at Miramar, he deployed to the southwest Pacific on the USNS MERCY (T-AH-19) as a member of Pacific Partnership 2008. In 2009, Captain Leary moved back to Naval Medical Center San Diego and completed his career at Naval Air Station, North Island. He retired in June of 2012 after 30 years of honorable

After retiring, Captain Leary worked as an instructor at Concord Career College Registered Dental Hygiene training program in San Diego until 2019. He moved to Venice, Florida in 2020.

In addition, the Knights received \$1413 in monetary donations for a combined value of \$9660. These figures are a testament to our unfailing parishioners and their selfless generosity. Our annual donations were just shy of \$90,000 worth of food, toys and monetary donations.





Founder of the Knights of Columbus



Today, more than 2 million members throughout the world are still fulfilling the mission set out by Blessed Michael McGivney, who continues to care for his Knights.


