




Words of Wisdom from our Grand Knight

After spending the last month in the UK, Ireland and Norway, my bride and I are very thankful to be home. While it was an extremely interesting trip, it made us value our everyday life even more. This was our first, and could be our last, trip outside of the US. This decision is based wholly on whether our oldest daughter can convince my bride that we need to accompany them to Rome and other parts of Italy next year.

On our flight from Stavanger, Norway to Oslo, we had a mere 45 minutes between flights. Our travel agent told me that the Oslo airport is not that big. What the travel agent did not do was allow for us to be sitting in the last row of the airplane. When we finally emerged from the airplane, we had a short 20 minutes to make our next flight. With my wife's limited mobility, I figured that I would simply get on a later flight from Oslo to London Heathrow. After exiting the airplane and turning left, there was a lone wheelchair sitting in the middle of the concourse, ... unused. My bride took a seat in the wheelchair and we were off to our next gate which was on the exact opposite end of the airport. We made the flight as we were the last two passengers to arrive just prior to the door closing. The airport in Oslo is, in fact, very big.

In each case, Divine Providence played a role. You gotta' believe. Things happen for a reason.

I look forward to joining each of you as we implement our Program Plan for 2025-2026. We again should strive to attain the Star Council Award status and attain every planned objective of our Council. I do appreciate the role each of you play in making our Council successful and enjoyable.

When Sandy I were married we were married at Holy Cross Catholic Church In Chicago, Sandy's family has always been a very devote Catholic family. Our boys Eric & Tim were baptized, made their 1st Communion, & were confirmed Catholic. For at least 25 years I was fine with attending church with Sandy as a Lutheran guest in the Catholic churches we were members of as we moved around the US. After we moved here to Osprey Florida things started to change, I had retired, life slowed down a bit & found time to relax a bit & enjoy life. The boys were off on their own lives, my time in Boy Scouts now as an adult leader had wrapped up, now what?

The third event was with Sir Knight Warren Augenthaler, Warren & Susan sit by Sandy and myself at most Sat afternoon masses. He poked from time to time to see if I wanted to be a Knight, I tap danced for a longtime (Months & Months) knowing I had to be Catholic to join. One Sat Warren asked again & I answered: "I can't join I am Lutheran ". With out missing a beat Warren said "We can fix that." These first 3 events real had me questioning if I should become Catholic & fully join OLMC. The last event was one that would overwhelm me & fill my hole. While my mind & heart pondered change Sandy & I were on a cruise to the NE. We stopped in Quebec, one of our shore tours was to the Cathedral of St. Ann's. It is a wonderful place, please consider visiting if you are that way. You all know how I like to take pictures & I was doing so at St. Ann's when a lady approached me. She handed me a small plastic bag, It had a small hard dough ball & a note in French in it. She said to me "Here, this has the answers to what you are looking for. "What? What did she say? I was overwhelmed with emotion, was I just reached out to by the Holy Spirit?

4 Times I was sent a message by the Jesus himself, this is the way to go. After returning to Florida I went to see Father Richard, me connecting with him provided a safe place to go, A way to move forward. Deacon Tom's friendship reassured me that this is the right place to move forward & Warren's offer to join the Knights gave me a new purpose with my time. Google Groups Emails




The Council is trying something NEW, Using Google Groups email for our email lists.

4 Principles, 4 Reasons


All the good works we do are informed by our four core principles:





The Origin of Rosary Beads

When my mother was reaching the end of her life, I visited her and brought my rosary beads. We prayed the rosary together for the first time since I was in second grade when I made my first holy communion, so it was a special moment for both of us. I prayed the rosary with confidence resulting from the practice I received before each council and assembly meeting. I wondered how the rosary became a part of the Catholic heritage which prompted me to conduct some research into the origins of the rosary beads. The rosary can be prayed for any special reason, whether it's for special intentions, a way to deepen your faith or something that you do on a daily basis. Brother Joe Schulte said he prayed the rosary from memory while getting an MRI, which also helped pass the time.

Using beads in prayer was a means of keeping track of the number of prayers said, dating way before the Catholic religion was formed. Many faiths such as Hindus, Greeks, Buddhists and other religions had used and still use some type of beads to pray. In the third century, Christian monks used stones and prayer ropes to keep track of praying. In the early 1100s, Saint Alvery would recite 150 repetitive Hail Mary prayers each day. In 1214, Saint Dominic, the founder of the Dominican Order, started praying with rosary beads similar to the ones used today. In the late 1400s, Alan de Rupe of Brittany discovered the rosary and thought it would be a good idea to produce rosaries for the common man for their use to enhance their spiritual growth. In the early 1700s, Saint Louis de Montfort was a catholic priest who felt that praying to Jesus through Mary was a great way to show devotion to Mary. In 1917 in Portugal, the rosary was encouraged to be said daily requesting world peace during WWI. At this time the "O my Jesus..." was added and is the called "The Fatima Prayer." In 2002, Pope John Paul II started the "Luminous Mysteries," and called October 2002-October 2003 "The Year of the Rosary" which was meant to spread devotion throughout the world.

Flag Day is a holiday celebrated on June 14 in the United States. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777 by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. The Flag Resolution stated "That the flag of the thirteen United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

Flag Day was first proposed in 1861 to rally support for the Union side of the American Civil War. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a presidential proclamation that designated June 14 as Flag Day. On August 3, 1949, National Flag Day was officially established by an Act of Congress. On June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday, beginning in the town of Rennerdale. New York Consolidated Laws designate the second Sunday in June as Flag Day, a state holiday.

Flag Day is not an official federal holiday. Federal law leaves it to the discretion of president to officially proclaim the observance. Title 36 of the United States Code, Subtitle I, Part A, Chapter 1, Section 110 is the official statute on Flag Day. The United States Army also celebrates its birthday on this date.



5 Flag Trivia Questions

Quiz your friends and family with these five flag questions and answers:


- 1. **Is it ever appropriate to fly the flag upside down?** Answer: Yes, but only in an emergency. It means "Help Me! It's an emergency! Call the police! I am in dire trouble and need immediate help!"
- 2. **How many versions of the American flag have been designed?** There have been 27 versions of the American Flag. However, the current flag—designed by a high school boy—has lasted the longest as no states have been added since 1959.
- 3. **Can the flag touch the ground?** Despite the myths, the flag can touch the ground and still be washed and used. However, if the flag is torn or damaged beyond repair, the tradition is to burn it with dignity. Most U.S. localities offer this service at no fee.
- 4. **How many U.S. flags made it to the Moon?** The U.S. flag has been placed on the Moon by an astronaut during six Apollo missions (11, 12, 14, 15, 16, and 17).
- 5. Why must Old Glory be folded in such a specific way? The U.S. flag is folded into a small triangle made of 13 folds. Each fold has a special meaning and symbolism. For example, the first fold represents life, while the third honors the veteran who has departed, and the fifth is a tribute to our country.

The Continental Congress left no record as to why it chose these colors. However, in 1782, the Congress of the Articles of Confederation chose the colors for the Great Seal of the United States with these meanings:


- White for purity and innocence
- Red for valor and hardiness
- Blue for vigilance, perseverance, and justice
