





















#### **BREAKFAST ANYONE?**

Recently, I watched a You Tube video about the top 14 Fast Food Hamburger Restaurant Chains in the US. What caught me by surprise was that McDonald's was #14, Burger King was #13 and Wendy's was #12. The same survey stated that In & Out Burger was #3, Shake Shack was #2, and #1 was Culver's. Obviously, this was not a scientific survey nor were the results. According to the video, the results of this survey was that the three largest restaurant chains were inconsistent, of poor quality, and increasingly poor service. They are probably correct but that does not make them #12, #13 and #14. One thing that is true is that all three had a drop in same store sales, year over year.

For the past four months, the Knights Breakfast has not been able to crack 40 guests. In fact, a portion of the less than forty guests were workers who chose to buy a ticket and eat. I would guess that about 1/3 of the tickets sold were from workers.

We have long been curious as to why our head count for the Knights Breakfast has been decreasing and we have yet to really understand why. There have been a multitude of suggestions ranging from too many events to getting tired of the same old thing, month after month.

Two weeks ago, a Knight made the suggestion about sending a questionnaire to our parishioners. The more I thought about it, the more it made sense. I decided to discuss this with Father Anthony, and he thought that the questionnaire was a great idea. Once the questionnaire is distributed to the congregation, I hope that their feedback will provide some insight and guidance on how to improve our Knights Pancake Breakfast.

If we go back to the beginning of the Pancake Breakfast, the underlying purpose was to provide community for our parishioners. It was an opportunity for them to come together and enjoy each other's company over a meal. I sincerely believe that this is still our purpose, and will continue to be so, as we certainly do not view it as a big fund raiser.

The amazing thing about this function is that very few Knights attend the event beyond the workers. I urge the many Knights that are not attending the Knights Pancake Breakfast to respond to this questionnaire and voice your opinion anonymously.

Your thoughts are most welcome and will be sincerely appreciated.

As we are in August, and have just celebrated the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary I thought that this month I would reflect on this great solemnity, and how it reflects, hopefully, that where Mary has gone, we will follow if we, like her, faithfully follow her Son.

Many of the Catholic teachings about Mary are, despite what some non-Catholics may say, deeply rooted in Scripture. For example, the Catholic doctrine of Mary's Immaculate Conception is rooted in the Old Testament visit of the Ark of the Covenant in a house just outside of Jerusalem (an important event that we often overlook but one that is fundamental to our Catholic belief in the Immaculate Conception; I will reflect more on that in the November or December newsletter).

In the Tradition of the Church belief in the Assumption of Mary is a relatively late development, not appearing before the 6<sup>th</sup> century. But it has been widely held since then, and even Lutherans such as the great psychologist Carl Jung, can declare that the infallible declaration of belief in Mary's Assumption into heaven at the end of her earthly life, "was the most important religious event since the Reformation."

According to Jung the Catholic doctrine of Mary's Assumption is not found in Scripture, a point I would disagree with. But he does acknowledge that "the Papal declaration made a reality of what had long been condoned." The reality is that Mary's Assumption WAS widely held in East and West until the Reformation and Pope Pius XII simply formally defined the faith of the Church. Indeed when, in 1946 Pius XII asked the bishops, clergy and laity for their opinion about possibly formally defining Mary's Assumption, only 6 out of 1181 had concerns about such a declaration, showing the widespread belief in Mary's Assumption.

In defining the Dogma of the Assumption, Pope Pius XII gave four theological reasons to support this traditional belief. Firstly, the decaying of our bodies after death is because of Original Sin but Mary, because she was conceived without Original Sin by virtue of her Immaculate Conception, was not subject to that decaying of our bodies. Secondly, because Mary was full of grace, as Elizabeth had declared to her, it made sense that she should be already with her Son in glory in heaven. Thirdly, because of her unique role working alongside her Son in his saving work, it was appropriate that Mary should share with her Son's glory in heaven. And, finally, there is a biblical precedent for Mary's Assumption in the way that the prophet Elijah was raised to heaven in a fiery chariot at the end of his earthly life and so, implicitly, it's not inappropriate to say that something like that couldn't happen to Mary.

The Church, in her infinite wisdom, never declares whether Mary died and was assumed into heaven, or whether she never died and was simply assumed into heaven. But Pope St. John Paul II did point out, and I think correctly, that, as her Son had died in his human flesh, so it is more appropriate to think that Mary would have followed suit. As Pope St. John Paul II said, "The Mother is not superior to the Son who underwent death."

So, ultimately, Pope Pius XII declared in 1950, in the last infallible declaration, that Mary, "at the end of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory." There are at least three important points in that brief statement. Firstly, "at the end of her earthly life", making clear, as I said earlier, that it doesn't define whether Mary died or not. Secondly, she was assumed, meaning she was taken up to heaven. Mary, as a creature could not ASCEND to heaven like her Son did, but needed to be taken up to heaven, emphasizing that it wasn't something she could merit. Thirdly, she was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory. She is the first fruits of her Son's Resurrection; she has joined him in heavenly glory and we, as followers of Christ, are destined to join her in glory at the end of time; where Jesus and Mary have gone, we are called to follow. And that is why it is good to celebrate Mary's Assumption!

# **2025 Supreme Convention**




Dear Brother Knight,



"But don't most freshwater turtles live their whole lives with algae and scum hanging from their shells?" he asked.


"Yep, sadly, they do," she replied.

We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever.



#### **Catholicism is Cool Again!**

This Easter, the University of Notre Dame saw a <u>record</u> number of students enter the Catholic Church. This trend is happening not just at Notre Dame but around the country. Los Angeles welcomed <u>more than 5,500</u> new Catholics. The *New York*Post ran <u>an essay</u> entitled "Young people are converting to Catholicism en masse [. . .]" As reporter Matthew McDonald wrote in another article, "Dioceses are reporting increases of 30%, 40%, 50% and even more than 70%."

Not just in the United States but around the world, a growing number of adults—mostly young adults—joined the Church. In Austria, there was an 85 percent increase in the number of adult baptisms. In his essay "Adult Baptisms: What's Driving the Rise?," Luke Coppen reports large increases in Belgium, Canada, and Mongolia. Catholic conversions are also rising in Kosovo. In Sweden, the Catholic Church is growing, again with young adult converts. The Washington Times reported, "France sees a record surge in conversions to Catholicism." In England, another article noted that it is "the young converts leading Catholicism's UK comeback."

As recent convert Sydney Johnston <u>put it</u>, "There's just something so beautiful and transcendent about the rituals and the ancient history in the Catholic Mass that's been preserved. . . . The church really communicates a degree of reverence that I didn't find in the more liberal, laissez-faire approach of nondenominational churches." Although many people begin their journey to the Church online, the destination is personal, concrete, and incarnational.

Her first exposure to Mass came as a music major at Penn State, where she studied—and loved—the settings of the Requiem Mass, by Mozart and Verdi. Then she learned about <u>Gregorian chant</u>, which she connected with on a spiritual level. "It was just hearing how simple and exposed it was."

These days, it's not unusual for an interest in the divine to be piqued by aesthetics. Bishop Robert Barron, a popular Catholic media personality, has said that in the individualistic, materialistic world of modern America—a world where talking about morality is passé and theology is dull—"the best way to evangelize" is to start with what's <u>beautiful about Catholicism</u>. Then you move to what's good, then to what's true. In other words, for many people, it is more effective to begin by appealing to their eyes or their ears than their hearts or minds.

The Church is in a prime position to supply what is lacking in today's culture. As Professor Jeffrey Pojanowski a leading legal scholar at Notre Dame <u>pointed out</u>:

In a disembodied time, [the Church] is resolutely concrete: the splash of holy water, the smear of oil, the pinch of exorcising salt, the smell of incense, the quiet voice of absolution in your ear, the gentle slap of confirmation, Blaise's candles on your throat, the laying on—or grasp—of hands, the gentle ache of the knees at consecration, the weird, withered relic of a saint, and, of course, the taste of bread and wine that are, mysteriously, His flesh and blood—suffering embraced and given loving meaning. This revolution will not be digitized.

As so many young people around the world have recently discovered, the Church offers what cannot be found anywhere else.

Isn't it just the ritual and the pageantry and the history that are bringing in the crowds." Really? Why not just say His Name? Jesus Christ is drawing people to Himself. Our purpose as a Church, from the Pope down to the newest baptized Catholic is to point the Way toward Him. "The fields are ripe and ready for harvest...."





# What Are You Doing This Summer ???

#### Chuck & Nancy Donelson's Ancestral Homelands

The most enjoyable part of our trip to Ireland, the UK and Norway this summer was to go to our ancestral homelands. The picture below is that of Sissinghurst Manor. This is my bride's ancestral home dating back to the 1300s. What started as a farm near Cranbrook, Kent, England evolved into a huge estate during the reign of King Henry VIII and his three children who were the next King and Queens of England.

Nancy's ancestor was Sir John Baker, the Chancellor to King Henry VIII, his son King Edward VI, and King Henry's two daughters, Queen Mary I and Queen Elizabeth I. During this time, Sir John Baker amassed huge real estate holdings, vast additions to Sissinghurst Manor, but also holdings in Kent and Essex Counties. This was also the time of great religious unrest as King Henry VIII started the Church of England as a response to the Pope's refusal to allow him to divorce is wife, or have his marriage annulled.





After visiting my wife's ancestral homeland, we traveled to Norway to visit my ancestral home. My ancestral homeland is in Tysvaer, Rogaland, Norway which is about 20 miles north of Stavenger, Norway on the southwest coast of Norway. My 3Great Grandfather was born on the Hersdal farm in Tysvaer on July 4, 1800. He was born in the house pictured here.

This final picture shows my fourth cousins Odd Hersdal and Inger-Lise Wegner. Odd and his two sisters are the current owners of the Hersdal farm which has been in the family for over 500 years. The family still owns it. The property still consists of two houses, both rebuilt since the 1800s, a summer kitchen which is now a cottage, and a chicken coop which has also been converted into a cottage. The farm still consists of two valleys and one mountain. Currently, there are four windmills on the mountain and both valleys have been rented out to other farmers.


