## KNIGHT'S MEMBERSHIP DIRECTORY

For the past five months, I have watched our Deputy Grand Knight postpone his Membership Directory photography sessions month, after month. From my perspective, I do not know if it is because we are so busy on meeting nights, or if it has to do with lack of coordination, or even some other reason. I did not spend too much time evaluating this phenomena because this was Rob's "baby" and I have my own list of things to do.

However, after the last Officers Meeting, Rob once again said that he was going to schedule another photo shoot in November. This made sense as many of our winter Brothers would be back in South Florida. I started thinking to myself about what kind of turnout Rob was expecting and what would really happen. I guess that is just how my mind works at times.

My first decision was to count the number of pictures that we currently have in our Membership Directory. That total is 55 members plus two deceased members. Of the 55 current members, one has moved to Wisconsin and is transferring his membership. So, lets say that we have 54 members in our Membership Directory. ## Dilexi Te: A Call to Love with Courage and Compassion

Pope Leo XIV's first apostolic exhortation, Dilexi Te—Latin for "I Have Loved You"—is a powerful invitation to rediscover the radical love of Christ and to embody that love in our personal lives, communities, and society. Released on October 9, 2025, the document builds upon the legacy of Pope Francis, especially his final encyclical Dilexit Nos ("He Loved Us"), and continues the Church's mission of mercy, justice, and solidarity with the poor.

At its heart, Dilexi Te is a meditation on divine love—love that is not abstract or sentimental, but incarnate, sacrificial, and liberating. Pope Leo reminds us that Christ's love is not merely a theological concept; it is a force that transforms lives, heals wounds, and calls us to action. He writes, "The condition of the poor is a cry that, throughout human history, constantly challenges our lives, societies, political and economic systems, and, not least, the Church".

This exhortation is deeply rooted in Scripture, particularly the prophetic tradition and the Gospel mandate to care for the least among us. Pope Leo draws attention to the suffering of the poor, the marginalized, and the forgotten, urging the faithful to see in their wounded faces the suffering of Christ himself. He challenges us to move beyond charity as mere almsgiving and embrace a love that seeks justice, dignity, and systemic change.

For us as Knights, Dilexi Te offers a powerful summons to spiritual maturity and moral courage. It calls us to examine our lives not only in terms of personal holiness but also in how we respond to the cries of the poor and the demands of justice. Pope Leo speaks directly to the temptation of indifference, warning that comfort and complacency can dull our spiritual senses and distance us from the Gospel.

He writes, "To love as Christ loves is to be attentive to suffering, to be moved by injustice, and to be willing to share in the work of liberation that flows from His love." This is not a passive love—it is active, engaged, and often uncomfortable. It requires humility, sacrifice, and a willingness to confront the structures that perpetuate poverty and exclusion.

The document also emphasizes the continuity of the Church's social teaching. Pope Leo affirms the principles of Catholic Social Doctrine—human dignity, solidarity, subsidiarity, and the preferential option for the poor—and urges their application in today's complex world. He encourages lay men to be leaders in their families, parishes, and workplaces, modeling Christ-like love in every sphere of life.

Importantly, Dilexi Te is not just a critique of society; it is a pastoral exhortation filled with hope. Pope Leo speaks of the Church as a "field hospital," echoing Pope Francis, and invites all believers to be healers and bridge-builders. He calls for a renewal of prayer, community life, and Eucharistic devotion, reminding us that true love is nourished by intimacy with Christ.







The Holy Father also highlights the role of fraternity among men. He encourages Catholic men to support one another in living out the Gospel, to form communities of accountability and encouragement, and to resist the isolation that often afflicts modern life. In a world that prizes individualism, Dilexi Te calls for communion—a brotherhood rooted in faith, service, and shared mission.

One of the most striking aspects of the exhortation is its tone: firm yet tender, prophetic yet pastoral. Pope Leo does not shy away from naming the challenges we face—economic inequality, ecological degradation, political polarization—but he always returns to the hope found in Christ. He reminds us that love is stronger than death, and that even in the darkest moments, God is at work.

For Knights, Dilexi Te is both a mirror and a map. It reflects the Gospel values we strive to live and offers a path forward in a world that desperately needs witnesses to Christ's love. It invites us to deepen our prayer lives, strengthen our families, serve our communities, and advocate for justice—not as political activists, but as disciples of the Crucified and Risen Lord.

As we reflect on Dilexi Te, let us ask ourselves: Where is Christ calling me to love more deeply? Whose cry have I ignored? How can I, in my own vocation, become a man of mercy, justice, and hope?

May this apostolic exhortation stir our hearts, renew our commitment, and inspire us to live as men who have truly been loved—and who, in turn, love boldly.

#### **Reflection questions**

Where in my life have I grown comfortable or complacent in the face of injustice or suffering? Pope Leo XIV challenges us to confront indifference. Reflect on areas—at home, work, or in society—where you may have tuned out the cries of the poor or marginalized. What would it look like to respond with Christ-like love?

How do I understand "poverty of spirit," and where is God inviting me to grow in humility? The exhortation calls us to a deeper interior poverty—a humble dependence on God. Consider how pride, self-reliance, or fear may be blocking your spiritual growth. What practices could you adopt which help you cultivate humility?

In what ways am I living out the Church's social teaching in my daily decisions? Dilexi Te affirms the principles of human dignity, solidarity, and the preferential option for the poor. How do these values shape your choices as a father, husband, worker, or leader? Where might God be calling you to greater alignment?

Who are the "poor" in my immediate community, and how am I being called to serve them? Think locally: the lonely neighbor, the struggling coworker, the overwhelmed single parent. What concrete steps can you take this week to embody the love that hears their cry?

How can I strengthen fraternity and spiritual accountability among the men in my life? Pope Leo emphasizes the importance of brotherhood. How can you foster deeper connection, prayer, and mission with other Catholic men through such organizations as the Knights of Columbus?

Pope Leo XIV received the Knights of Columbus Board of Directors in private audience at the Vatican on Oct. 6.

Addressing the board members, who are currently on pilgrimage to Rome for the Jubilee Year of Hope, the Holy Father praised the Order's charitable works, including its "efforts to uphold the sanctity of human life in all of its stages, to assist victims of war and natural disasters, and also to support priestly vocations."




According to the StThereseUSA2025 website, her relics will go to California; Washington, D.C.; Texas; Wisconsin; and various Carmelite convents through December.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.



# Merchant Marine Academy restores historic 'Christ on the Water' painting removed under Biden

A painting of Jesus Christ has been restored to a place of prominence at the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy in Kings Point, New York, prompting celebration from the Trump administration and outcry from a secular advocacy group.

The U.S. Department of Transportation <u>announced</u> on Monday that the "Christ on the Water" painting, which hung at Wiley Hall at the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy for nearly 80 years before being relocated to a flood-prone basement in 2023, has been restored to its former location.

An unveiling ceremony was held on Monday to celebrate the restoration of the painting.

"Burying this historic painting in the basement wasn't just a mistake — it was an insult to the faith and legacy of service that built this Academy and our nation," said U.S. Secretary of Transportation Sean Duffy. "By restoring 'Christ on the Water' to its rightful place, we sent a clear message to our midshipmen: their Christian faith is a virtue to be proud of, not something to be censored."

USMMA Acting Superintendent Tony Ceraolo, who took over after USMMA Superintendent Vice Admiral Joanna Nunan <u>stepped down</u> in June, thanked Duffy for "his continued support of our Academy and the midshipmen who call this place home."

He described the painting, which depicts Jesus Christ guiding sailors through stormy seas, as "a piece of the Academy's cultural and historical legacy" that honors "the past and the resilience of those who came before us."

"This painting is about history, remembrance, and hope ensuring that the story of our midshipmen and their wartime experiences remain part of our shared institutional memory," he added. Duffy first called for the artwork to be returned to its former location at the institution's annual <u>Battle Standard Dinner</u> in April.

The painting was moved from Wiley Hall during Nunan's tenure as head of the institution in response to pressure from Mikey Weinstein of the Military Religious Freedom Foundation, which advocates for a strict separation of church and state.


Following Nunan's resignation, the painting was brought up from the basement last month. Duffy continued efforts to restore the artwork to its former location, culminating in Monday's ceremony. While the Trump administration and leadership of the USMMA cheered the relocation of the painting, Weinstein issued a <u>scathing statement</u> Monday condemning the development, alleging it is a mark of "Christian nationalism."

"Transportation Secretary and lickspittle Christian nationalist tRump [sic] sycophant Sean Duffy's effectuating of the illicit, unethical, and iniquitous return of the giant Jesus painting at the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy to its original unconstitutional place of disgusting Christian supremacist exhibitionism in an ornate, mandatory Academy meeting room is completely cowardly, atrocious, and vindictive," he proclaimed.

"Duffy is making sure to brand the Academy as conquered Christian nationalist territory. All others are not wanted and need not apply. He has disgracefully clothed the all-too-willing U.S. Merchant Marine Academy with his fundamentalist Christian extremist thuggery, stinking nonsecular creed, and unbridled sectarian fundamentalist Christian conceit."

Weinstein indicated that the Military Religious Freedom Foundation is considering "aggressive federal litigation."






