Unless you feel you're a Saint and I am sure they were sinful also. BUT GOD forgives sin! All one needs to do are go to confession and ask for forgiveness. Many years ago people in high places like Kings and Dukes would sin all their lives until the day they were on their deathbed, then they asked for forgiveness! Our God is a forgiving God, yes true these people played with the roll of the dice, hoping they would have time to ask for forgiveness.

But that's not what I was starting to talk about. God calls us in many ways and you have the option of saying yes lord or don't say anything and let it slip by unnoticed! It was one day I got home from work and I said to my wife (wives are Pretty smart!) Its been a rough day I'll skip the Hospital today I'm beat! She said you better go there is someone waiting for you I'm sure she said. Well tired or not I went. Checked in at the desk and started my rounds, I entered a room and introduced my self as Deacon Frank from St. Thomas Parish, the man in the bed had his dinner before him he said in a low voice I have been waiting for you and then he died. What an experience.

Another time same hospital in Old Bridge New Jersey it was two weeks before Easter and I had the Easter services to assist at. We took a vacation to Florida and would be back Good Friday. I was bringing communion to a man that every day before vacation was getting weaker and weaker until the day we left for vacation I said to myself he'll be gone when we get back that's how bad he was getting. We got back the day before Good Friday and good Friday I was bring the blessed sacrament to the hospital and as I checked in at the desk his name said "DES" after it. I asked the nurse if he passed and she said yes she believed so! Holy Saturday I was at the hospital and his name was off the list! Easter Sunday I returned to the Hospital right after mass and checked in, Low and behold his name was on the list with a room number, I asked the nurse on duty and she did not know why it was there! I said to myself-maybe he just needs a prayer so I'll stop into the room before I leave the hospital. As I entered the room believe it or not he was sitting up in bed and was drinking coffee! I almost said I thought you were dead! But did not. I asked him what happened and he said" I was discharged (Get it DIS!) not DES! We talked and I gave him communion. As I walked out of the hospital I stopped and a tear ran down my cheek, I just felt like the people in the Easter story a resurrection. What a feeling. And that my friends is what one might experience in taking on a hospital ministry or a ministry to the home bound or to the nursing home! 



