Navigator's Log

“We believe these Truths to be Self-evident...”

Nuremberg, Monday, August 22, 2022 - Seventy-fifth Anniversary of the Nuremberg Trial. Vera Sharav spoke at the 75th anniversary commemoration of the Nuremberg Trial in Nuremberg Germany where the motto “Never again” was coined. A Holocaust Survivor, Vera reminded us of how the Holocaust did not take place overnight. And she warns us: **“Never Again Is Now!**




