Navigator's Log

Sir Knights, Brothers, Sisters and families, Praise God for His bountiful blessings upon our Country!

Our Men's retreat: **"Listening For God's Voice in Our Life"** is scheduled for Saturday May 21st and will be open to all men of the Parish. Father Martin, Father Tony and Deacons Gary and Joe will be our prominent Teachers. Be sure to mark your calendars. See the Retreat Flyer in this newsletter with times and Sessions.

"Freedom – God's Greatest Gift". The most sacred gift man has received from God, other than the gift of God Himself in Christ Jesus, is Individual **freedom**. (CCC) **1730** God created man a rational being, conferring on him the dignity of a person who can initiate and control his own actions. "God willed that man should be 'left in the hand of his own counsel,' so that he might of his own accord seek his Creator and freely attain his full and blessed perfection by cleaving to him."²⁶

"Man is rational and therefore like God; he is created with free will and is master over his acts."²⁷

1741 Liberation and salvation. By his glorious Cross Christ has won salvation for all men. He redeemed them from the sin that held them in bondage. **"For freedom Christ has set us free."**³⁴ In him we have communion with the "truth that makes us free."³⁵ The Holy Spirit has been given to us and, as the Apostle teaches, "Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom."³⁶ Already we glory in the "liberty of the children of God."³⁷

Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) **#387** *"... sin is an abuse of the freedom that God gives to created persons so that they are capable of loving him and loving one another."* The reality of sin (CCC) **#386** *"Sin is present in human history; any attempt to ignore it or to give this dark reality other names would be futile."*

Freedom of mankind is at the pinnacle of the war between heaven and hell. Individual Freedom is what every Despot wants to do away with by any means, especially by usurping The Chair of Peter or "hacking" the human genome to kill God in Man and render freedom and Mankind non-existent! Be on Guard. Have eyes that see and ears that hear. Pray unceasingly as Our Lady has asked and as taught to us by the Angel of Portugal to the children of Fatima: ***My God, I believe, I adore, I hope, and I love Thee! I ask pardon for those who do not believe, do not adore, do not hope and do not love Thee.***

Most Holy Trinity—Father, Son and Holy Spirit—I adore Thee profoundly. I offer Thee the most precious Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, present in all the tabernacles of the world, in reparation for the outrages, sacrileges, and indifferences whereby He is offended. Since establishment of the Illuminati in 1776 there has been an organized attack on America and its Constitution. **Communism** is the organized evil set against God's gifts to man.

"... that sect of men who, under various and almost barbarous names, are called socialists, communists, or nihilists, and who, spread over all the world, and bound together by the closest ties in a wicked confederacy, no longer seek the shelter of secret meetings, but, openly and boldly marching forth in the light of day, strive to bring to a head what they have long been planning—the overthrow of all civil society whatsoever."* [Sound familiar – Open Society Foundations, Freemasonry, Skull and Bones, World Economic Forum, World Health Organization/World Health Bureau, Bohemian Grove Society, Bilderberg, World Federalist Association (NWO), Central Banks, ...]

Pope Pius XI: (May 13, 1931) *Religious socialism, Christian socialism, are contradictory terms; no one can be at the same time a good Catholic and a true socialist."*

Pope Pius XII: (July 1, 1949) **Apostolic Decree Against Communism.** 1. whether it is licit to join the Communist Party or to support it; **Negative.** 2. whether it is licit to print, distribute, or read books, magazines, newspapers or leaflets which support the Communist doctrine, or to write on them; **Negative.** 3. whether it is possible, for the Christians who have done what is written in number 1 and 2, to participate to the sacraments; **Negative.** 4. whether the Christians who believe in the Communist, materialistic and anti-Christian doctrine; and especially those who defend and spread it, should be excommunicated as apostates from the Christian faith."
Positive.

From a Homily of **Pope Paul VI**, Thursday, June 29, 1972, Post Vatican II "St. Peter took up this quite uplifting and grand phrase, and he applied it to the new people of God, the heir and continuance of Biblical Israel, to form a new Israel, the Israel of Christ. St. Peter says: "This people will be a priestly and royal people that will glorify the God of mercy, the God of salvation."

"Then there is the interesting picture of the dramatic history of mankind, leading to the history of the Redemption and of Christ; the history of our salvation, with its stupendous treasures of revelation, prophecy and holiness, of life elevated to a supernatural level, of eternal promises."

The Christian vision of the universe and of life is therefore triumphantly optimistic; and this vision fully justifies our joy and gratitude for being alive, so that we sing forth our happiness in celebrating God's glory."

"... Evil is not merely an absence of something but an active force, a living, spiritual being that is perverted and that perverts' others. It is a terrible reality, mysterious and frightening. "... from some fissure the smoke of Satan has entered the temple of God. "... "We believe in something that is preternatural that has come into the world precisely to disturb, to suffocate the fruits of the Ecumenical Council, and to impede the Church from breaking into the hymn of joy at having renewed in fullness its awareness of itself. "

"We know," writes St. John the Evangelist, "that we are of God, and the whole world is in the power of the evil one." ... The Christian must be a militant; he must be vigilant and strong;[28] and he must at times make use of special ascetical practices to escape from certain diabolical

attacks. Jesus teaches us this by pointing to “prayer and fasting” as the remedy.[29] And the Apostle suggests the main line we should follow: “Be not overcome by evil but overcome evil with good.”[30]

With an awareness, therefore, of the opposition that individual souls, the Church and the world must face at the present time, we will try to give both meaning and, effectiveness to the familiar invocation in our principal prayer: “Our Father . . . deliver us from evil!”

Brothers, be mindful that we are already the “owners and masters of the formula of true life”, in the Sacramental Faith of the One Holy Catholic Apostolic Church.

As the Church is being tested in our time pray for perseverance, pray for the Holy Father and our priests, hold fast to the Magisterial Teachings of the “Faith of Our Fathers” lest we should lose our baptismal birthright and our eternal happiness.

Pro-Life Corner



The Pro-Life Movement continues moving forward.

Governor Ron DeSantis recently signed HB 5, a measure banning Florida doctors from performing abortions after 15 weeks of gestation.

In Oklahoma, Governor Kevin Stitt signed 3 Pro-life bills. HB 2441, a Heartbeat Bill which prohibits abortion once a heartbeat is detected (usually around six weeks). The bill stipulates that any doctor found violating the prohibition will be guilty of homicide. HB 1102, which classifies abortion as "unprofessional conduct." Any doctor found committing an abortion that is not medically necessary will have their medical license revoked for at least one year. HB 1904, mandates that only board-certified OBGYNs can commit abortions.

In Kentucky, the House overrode the Governor's veto of a Pro-Life Bill. The new law requires that a pregnant woman must be examined in person by a doctor before being given abortion pills. It also requires physicians performing abortions to maintain hospital admitting privileges close to where the abortion is to be performed.

Arizona Governor Doug Ducey, sign a Pro-Life bill banning abortions after 15 weeks. The bill makes it a felony for physicians to knowingly violate the new statute, doctors face consequences such as having their license to practice medicine in the state suspended or revoked, along with fines if they are found to have given false information on forms related to the abortion.

The Tennessee Legislature passed a Pro-Life bill Ban Mail-Order Abortions. The Tele-Med Abortion Pill Ban, requires the abortion drug to be provided to the woman in person by a licensed medical doctor; it also requires the abortion provider to offer a follow-up visit within two weeks of the abortion. Violators would be charged with a felony and face fines of up to \$50,000. The Biden Dictatorship, began allowing abortion drugs to be sold through the mail without the woman ever seeing or speaking to a doctor.

Here at St. Joseph's we will be holding our annual Diaper Drive. From May 14th through May 22nd we will be collecting **NEW** disposable diapers, pull ups and wipes for Nana's House. 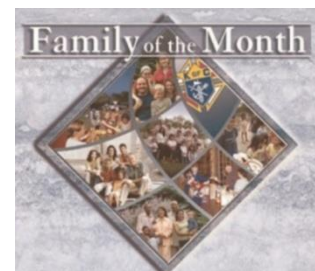

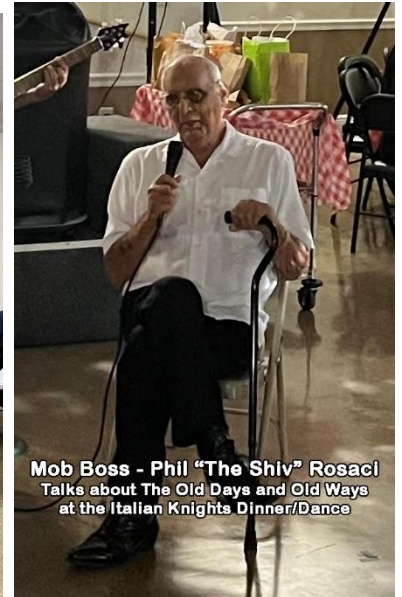

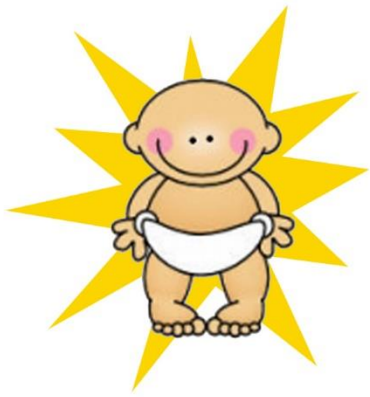
