This bill also allocates \$25 million to Florida Pregnancy Care Network, Inc., a network of Florida pregnancy resource centers that assist more than 76,000 women, men, children, and families each year.

Spiritual Notes - Deacon Frank



I have written many homilies and articles for the Knights Newsletter over the years. Did many things in the name of Jesus over the years. This month will mark a few milestones in my life, and I would like to share a few with you that seem to stick out in my mind. One is I'll be 87 in a few days. And I'll be ordained 43 years also in May. I would not change anything in my life! I followed Gods Calling and I assure you it was the best move aside from marrying my wife Marcia who passed away 3 1/2 years ago! Life is lonely I assure you, but He has been good to me, yes, 3 months short of 60 years married. I asked God that many years ago and I assure I heard Him say she

is the girl for you forever. How true was His reply to me. We built three houses together, we had 3 children together and then 5 grandchildren. No great grandkids yet I'm waiting! The gift God gave me was to marry my three children as a deacon. To Baptize my 5 grandchildren, gave them first communion and assisted the Bishop in their confirmation in to the Catholic faith.

After visiting the Hawaiian Islands some 3 or 4 times we decided to move there to the Island of Maui. We bought a piece property on the side of Mt. Haliakala, a 10,100-foot volcano (dormant). After we built our pole house helped by our daughter Dawn, son Frank and his wife Barbara overlooking the Ocean. There was no work for a worker in the construction/ inspection/engineering field. We sat on the beach at a little restaurant having Hamburgers and a beer watching the boats go by. She said to me, "What do we do now the house is done"? I said you see that boat going by she said "yes", well were going in the sailing, snorkeling, scuba diving business! And we did, for near 8 years we had a 43-foot sloop named the "Alihilani" in Hawaiian means on the edge of heaven. I was also the first deacon on the Island of Maui. The locals did not know what a deacon was, I had to slip in what a deacon was in a few homilies and also at local restaurants as most people attended St. Theresa's Church on the beach where I was deacon at with Fr. Jack a retired Lt. Col. Air Force. Chaplain. It wasn't too long after that Fr, Jack had a heart attack and was transported to Tripler Hospital on Oahu for quite a while. I then seemed to be in charge for at least a few months till he returned to Maui. We started to rebuild a beautiful church then that's were my expertise in construction came in handy. Maui was a Paradise and sailing with the whales and sailing into a crescent shaped tip of a vent from the volcano was our office for those many years I could go on and on with stories of Hawaii and sailing and the marine life but all good things must come to an end as this story does also! But before I quit When we left the Island it was because My Wife's Mom and Pop were getting on in age and needed help here in Palm Bay with Doctors, shopping and the such. But when we left Maui there was 6 more deacons so whatever I did or said just might have made a difference in their lives and the calling that God gave to them. They can take you out of Hawaii but they can NEVER TAKE HAWAII OUT OF YOU..... GODS LOVE AND BLESSINGS BE YOURS.



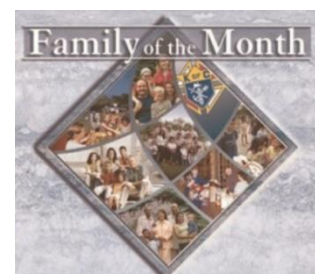

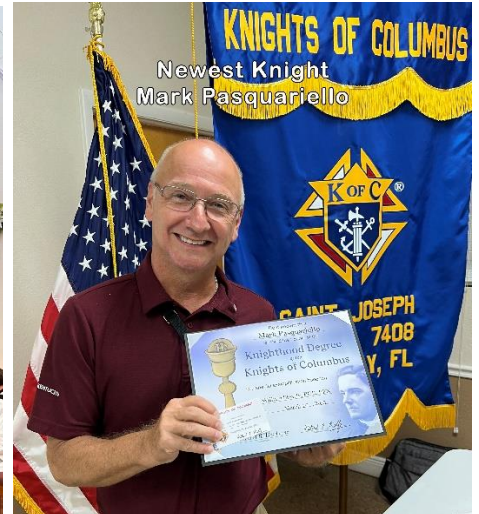
