### Into the Breach – Be not afraid!

### October, the month of the Most Holy rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary – Mother of God. Let us storm heaven with rosaries this month!

**We are all in this together.** One of the Final texts I received from PGK Robert Burgess just before his passing was "See you soon!"

#### **Fatima - 3rd Secret**

Sister Lucia's own words in a 1957 interview: "She told me that the devil is about to wage a decisive battle against the Blessed Virgin, ... where one side will be victorious and the other side will suffer defeat. Also, from now on we must choose sides. Either we are for God or we are for the devil; there is no in-between."

Fr Malachi Martin interview in 1996: Sister Lucia's single-page letter of the "Third Secret" covers three topics— 1. A Physical chastisement of nations 2. A spiritual chastisement 3. ***The central function of Russia in the two which in fact, the physical and spiritual chastisements are to be girded on a fateful timetable in which Russia is the ratchet. The Third Secret involves Russia and Ukraine, among other things.***

From the First Letter of Paul to the Thessalonians

Chapter 5: The Day of The Lord verse 1-4

*"Now about the times and seasons, brothers, we do not need to write to you. For you are fully aware that the Day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. While people are saying, "Peace and security," destruction will come upon them suddenly, like labor pains on a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. But you, brothers, are not in the darkness so that this day should overtake you like a thief. But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love, and the helmet of our hope of salvation.*

**9-11** *For God has not appointed us to suffer wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ. He died for us so that, whether we are awake or asleep, we may live together with Him. Therefore encourage and build one another up, just as you are already doing.*
