



### Spiritual Notes - Deacon Frank



We have all seen the disaster that has occurred on Maui the past few weeks. It was a hard thing for me as I lived on Maui for 8 years. It was our home. It was the church I was deacon at for 8 years the one I helped design and build. It has stood the trials of nature and succeeded. Living on an island at the base of an inactive volcano sort of makes one feel that will be the way it will happen like Pompeii in Italy. Not to a fire that swept across the island so fast people had to jump into the ocean to get away from being burnt alive. I have many friends on the island and many are still not accounted for. I did get to contact a few. I wrote a note to the new pastor in the parish I spent all those years at. He said we need money to buy food to cook for the homeless. At St. Theresa's in Kihei they have a large kitchen and a large dining room and now they are cooking for the shelters and delivering food to them. They give 100% without charging as some non-profits do to pay salaries and such. I would ask all the Knights, deacons and whomever to consider sending a check to: St. Theresa's Catholic Church 25 Lipoa Street Kihei, Maui Hawaii 96753 attention in the subject box. Maui Relief fund food service..

I made my living there as a sailboat charter captain and owner of a charter company. 80 to 90 % of Maui people depend on tourists for their livelihood, home gone everything of memories of families gone, no food, no livelihood, and maybe family members still unaccounted for or dead! What to do where to go for help? Life in a sense ended for many no place to sit and cry. But only to turn to God and the Church is God St. Theresa's is where God is to many. Don't let these people down. God is in us and we need to show the world that we can be there for our sisters and brothers that we have the Spirit of God in us. The beatitudes were given to us the 10 commandments just a few things to think about. We are missionaries from our homes. We can send help from our homes our offices all one needs to do is be there, to ask everyone we see to be generous. As we live in an area that is prone to hurricanes, another force of nature, will we need assistance one day? Did the folks on Maui ever think that paradise would become an inferno from hell? Did the people of Pompeii? When we first got to Maui, I was the first and only deacon on Maui. I was asked many questions, what is a deacon, how can you have a wife and daughter as a priest on the altar? After the local folks got to know me and my family we were accepted as one of them. I built a house on the side Haliakalaa, a 12,200-foot volcano and owned a business there. When we left to help my wife's mom and pop as they were getting on in age and needed help and as always family comes first a lot of folks on Maui are still my family and we write back and forth. When we left to come to Florida to help them there was six more deacons on the island. I guess my call to the missionary fields paid off. And now it's your turn to be missionaries and help these folks out.






