It is a pleasure to write my thoughts and feelings to my brother Knights for so many years. But I have something very personal and dear to my heart to share with you this month. Do you remember the two Nuns that were murdered in Mississippi in 2018? I'm sure not many do. But family does. But I keep them in prayers every day. When a person or persons are murdered for their faith, they become Martyrs of the Church of their faith. Many become Saints. I really don't know why I was called to spend over \$2,000 of my own money to remember Fr. Bob and His sister Sally. I could have used it for my retirement. But like I was called by God to become a

Deacon some near 50 years ago. Actually ordained 44+ years.

To remember them both, I think back and say to myself, why did you call me to spend all this money to remember them and knowing that they touched so many lives as a Priest and Sally as his assistant over the years??? Why? I'll never know except through the way the Lord operates on people and causes them to be called to do things they might just feel comfortable not doing!

So listening to the directions I received from above, as one that prays one must also listen. I did and I really don't care if I get any help on this memorial project or not, as I did what I felt God called me to do. I asked the Parish about placing the bronze plaques some place on church property. No response. I wrote to the Diocese and the reply was a tombstone with dates and names is sufficient. But that is not what I was called to do.

I have made up special prayer cards with their pictures and story. With pictures of each I had made up in Italy on Porcelain. Both these together will last a long time. If I need to purchase a plot and tombstone in St. Joseph's Cemetery I'll do that so they will be remembered. Maybe one day if they answer enough prayers they may become saints of the Church. I could use your help in writing letters, talking and delivering the prayer cards. The prayers on the back are the ones that saint Padre Pio said every day. Prayers for families, Loved ones, those sick or in need of spiritual direction. I say them every day. I keep the card in my Bible so myself and those that get my Bible in years to come will also remember our Pastor emeritus, murdered for his faith, a true Martyr.

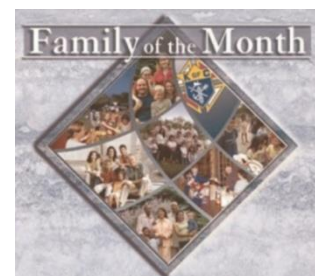

FLORIDA'S PRO-ABORTION AMENDMENT EXPLAINED

Why Floridians Should Vote NO on Amendment 4

Titled "Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion," Amendment 4 would enshrine **UNREGULATED ABORTION** in our state constitution, making Florida one of the **MOST PRO-ABORTION** states in the nation. The amendment language is **MISLEADING**, and its proposed outcomes are **DANGEROUS**.

WHAT IT SAYS

BALLOT SUMMARY

No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion

before viability

or when necessary to protect the patient's health,

as determined by the patient's healthcare provider.

This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.

WHAT IT DOES

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Amendment 4 would jeopardize existing laws and prohibit new ones that voters on both sides of the abortion issue support, including health and safety laws that protect women.

ALLOWS SECOND AND THIRD TRIMESTER ABORTIONS

Though not defined in the amendment, "viability" is defined in Florida law as the stage of development when the life of a fetus is sustainable outside the womb (Ch. 390.011(15)), generally accepted to be 22-24 weeks of pregnancy, or about 6 months.

CREATES A BROAD "HEALTH" LOOPHOLE

"Patient's health" is not defined in the amendment, allowing post-viability, extremely late-term abortions for treatable, temporary health concerns. Emotional health would justify an abortion when a child could survive outside the womb.

WEAKENS MEDICAL DOCTOR REQUIREMENT

"Healthcare providers" – not just physicians – could determine if an abortion is "necessary" to protect the mother's "health." Even some employees of abortion clinics, such as nurses and counselors, could approve late-term abortions.

ELIMINATES PARENTAL CONSENT

While preserving parental *notification* in our state constitution (Article X, Section 22), the amendment would invalidate the current law that requires parental *consent* for a minor to have an abortion (Ch. 390.01114(5)), making abortion the only medical decision for which parents have no say.

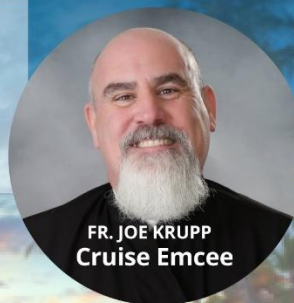
