Navigator's Log



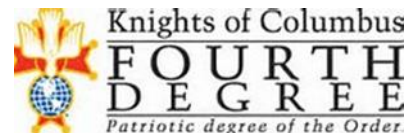
Worthy Sir Knights,

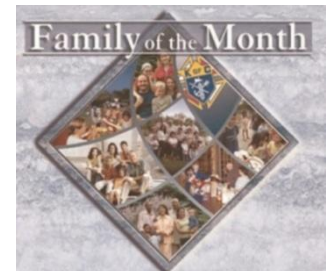
