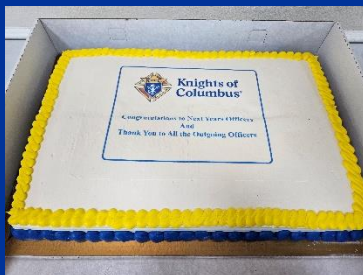

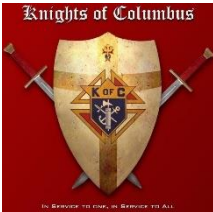

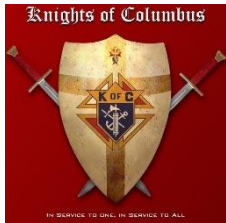

"DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME"

Acts of the Apostles 7 Chapter 6. THE NEED FOR ASSISTANCE. At that time as the number of disciples began to grow. The Hellenistic began to complain against the Hebrews, because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution. So, the twelve called together the community of disciples and said, "It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table; Brothers select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the spirit of wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task.

And so, this was the start of the diaconate. The deacons from that day on served at table (the altar of God now) Deaconos means servant in Greek.

Since the days of Jesus, He has held up the cup and said drink from this as this is my blood, then holding up the bread He said eat this as is my body do this in memory of Me! So many times, Jesus has asked us to Remember Him.
