it has affected me to where I guess my artistic ability was aroused to the point of designing and near completion of a simple memorial for both Fr. Bob and Sally. I was busy working on the stations of the cross in bronze at the time and felt I needed to concentrate on a memorial. Over 50 years of giving to all that he could, to end this way, they needed to be remembered.

The price of the bronze plaques and the porcelain photos from Italy should not rest in the hands costs as Fr. Bob shared himself with so many as Sally did also. The project will cost \$2,000. I have put up that much so far and would gladly appreciate any assistance cost-wise from all who knew and loved them. Be it placed in, on or around the church on a 14" x 18" bronze for Fr. Bob and 4" x 8" bronze for Sally, both with their pictures in ceramic.

If I don't get any help, it was my honor in life to remember all that they gave to others asking nothing in return. But the care and love for others in return for what gifts God has given me. I'll attached Fr. Bob's photo of his plaque; Sally's is being cast as we read about! I have never known, or experienced people called Martyr's for the Faith. I hope you will help me convince our new Pastor that our beloved Pastor and his helper, Sally have their memorial plaques placed in an area that all can remember and offer a prayer for their souls left in the hands of the Lord. Send me whatever you can to offset the price of this memorial. God's will not ours be done.
