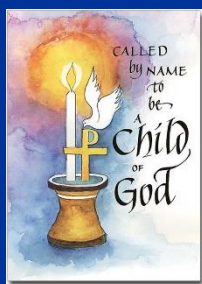

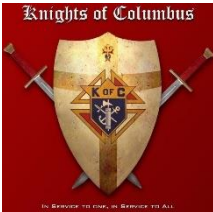

The Via Dolorosa

Which means, The way of suffering. It also represents the path Jesus took forced by Roman Soldiers on the way to His crucifixion. To feel the suffering of Jesus we must follow the road he was forced to travel. Not just in church but outside available when ever one needs to feel Jesus' suffering and maybe compared to what we are suffering. We can handle it better knowing the way to the cross, where death was eminent.

As an artist and sculptor and deacon, I have heard the calling many times. I have officiated as deacon in the past 45 years doing the Stations of the Cross in the church and there were times I wanted to say them more often. There came a whisper, unlike the wind that said, "Churches and Catholic schools need outside stations". One that can relate the feelings of myself and that of Jesus, mother Mary on that dreadful day, that will live forever.

The Stations would be sponsored by folks that want to remember a loved one. And there would be a smaller bronze plaque with their names or family names. To be always remembered.

The path that follows the stations would be lined with bricks with names and or dates of sponsors of each brick. There will be 14 or 15 concrete benches along the path of bricks, hopefully a church committee would oversee the sale of bricks and benches. I would suggest a few companies that sell the bricks, also the benches. If need be.

As of this date the approximate cost including delivery to the parish along with the porcelain painting of the Stations and the smaller plaques, would be \$2,900.00. I need to state, I receive no payment or compensation for my art, it is dedicated to the Lord. Anything over will be donated to the church or school. There will also be needed concrete castings to mount the bronze plaques on. I will supply a drawing for these. For any other information please contact me. In the Lord's service I remain.

Nobody Left Behind

When Father McGivney founded our Order, a key part of his mission was to help Catholic families attain a secure financial future. In keeping with that mission, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly recently announced updates to our member benefits.

Whether or not you are an insured Knight of Columbus, you are entitled to the Member/Spouse Fraternal Benefit. This is an accidental death benefit varies from \$1,500-\$5,000, depending on your age, whether you are insured and how long you've been a member.

The other updates I'd like to call out apply to insured members.

Family Fraternal Benefit: It's guaranteed-issue insurance up to \$10,000 to any child under age 18, regardless of physical or intellectual disabilities. This also includes an automatic \$5,000 death benefit for children who die before age 61 days, including stillbirths from at least 20 weeks after conception.

Orphan Fraternal Benefit: provides \$500 monthly to a member's child who has lost both parents, up to age 19. This benefit also includes up to \$5,000 per year in college scholarships, with a maximum total of \$20,000, per eligible orphan.

Widow Benefit: offers surviving spouses of insured Knights the opportunity to purchase Knights of Columbus products, and she and her children are eligible for scholarships.

We strive to bring Father McGivney's mission to life by offering you these valuable benefits. I would like to sit down with you to walk you through the benefits available to your family. Thank you, and I pray that Blessed Michael McGivney watches over our families this month.

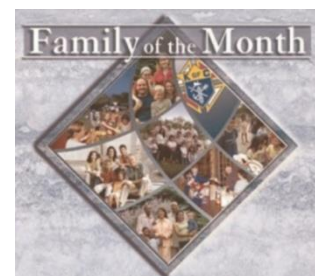

FLORIDA'S PRO-ABORTION AMENDMENT EXPLAINED

Why Floridians Should Vote NO on Amendment 4

Titled "Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion," Amendment 4 would enshrine **UNREGULATED ABORTION** in our state constitution, making Florida one of the **MOST PRO-ABORTION** states in the nation. BALLOT SUMMARY

No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion

before viability

or when necessary to protect the patient's health,

as determined by the patient's healthcare provider.

This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.

WHAT IT DOES

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Amendment 4 would jeopardize existing laws and prohibit new ones that voters on both sides of the abortion issue support, including health and safety laws that protect women.

ALLOWS SECOND AND THIRD TRIMESTER ABORTIONS

Though not defined in the amendment, "viability" is defined in Florida law as the stage of development when the life of a fetus is sustainable outside the womb (Ch. 390.011(15)), generally accepted to be 22-24 weeks of pregnancy, or about 6 months.

CREATES A BROAD "HEALTH" LOOPHOLE

"Patient's health" is not defined in the amendment, allowing post-viability, extremely late-term abortions for treatable, temporary health concerns. Emotional health would justify an abortion when a child could survive outside the womb.

WEAKENS MEDICAL DOCTOR REQUIREMENT

"Healthcare providers" – not just physicians – could determine if an abortion is "necessary" to protect the mother's "health." Even some employees of abortion clinics, such as nurses and counselors, could approve late-term abortions.

ELIMINATES PARENTAL CONSENT

While preserving parental *notification* in our state constitution (Article X, Section 22), the amendment would invalidate the current law that requires parental *consent* for a minor to have an abortion (Ch. 390.011(4)(5)), making abortion the only medical decision for which parents have no say.

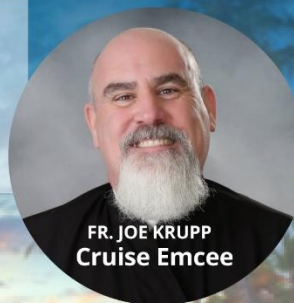
