Hope to see some new faces this year.



## Spiritual Notes - Deacon Frank



Last night I went to the TV and watched a movie called "Molokai". It was about Fr. Damien. It brought back memories of my 8 years on Maui at St. Theresa's Church in Kihei which is on the southern part of Maui on the west side of the volcano which is dormant at this time. We received a call that Fr. Damien was to be made a Saint. There was a special celebration on the island of Molokai for this special occasion. At the time our pastor was in the hospital in Honolulu as he had a heart attack. That left me in charge as the first and only deacon on the island. We left for Molokai and as you know every occasion has to have a flower lei the Nuns that were

station there ran out of flowers so sort of improvised and made the leis out of the Styrofoam packing peanuts. Actually, anything that is put together like flowers is called a lei. Yes there were still people with leprosy! You did not see them as they sort of hid so they would not get stared at. That was in the mid 1980's. I would recommend the movie and what a man called by God would do, give up his own life for others. His homily to the lepers was one that described to them that he was one of them when he said, "We Lepers"! This was the second leper colony I was at the first when I was a young Marine stationed in Japan. I delivered wooden orange fruit crates to them so they could make birdhouses and wooden things. As in the Movie, I was told to dump off the crates and don't touch anything, rest assured I didn't touch anything. People in those days were very cruel to the lepers. As you will see in the movie. There was an Island south of the big Island called Christmas Island. It is about 1200 miles but yet part of the diocese of Honolulu. There was no Church or priest there or deacon. So, our parish priest would go down once a year to bestow the sacraments needed. I am sure the island has developed quite a bit since then as we collected money at our church to build a small church on the island. Fr. Jack went down and asked me if I wanted to go with him. I couldn't as I had the charter business to run and Captain the boat. He told me it was like going back to the early days of Hawaii and the islands. All the people met under one large roof for meals. There was a large bowl of rice, and all were issued a few scoops as the leader was picking at his toes as they sat on the woven carpet of bamboo he picked out a piece of chicken from the bowl and put it on Fr. Jack's bowl of rice as he was the guest of honor. Fr. Jack told me he really did not want to eat the chicken but did not want to insult the chief, of course there was water from the rain barrels and fr. Jack got a dose of dysentery from the water. That's a true story as related to me by Fr. Jack. My friends in the Lord's service enjoy the Hawaiian Night, I lived and loved it. We had hula dancers in church at the end of Mass. We were Hawaiian from vestments to our new church we built.



## FLORIDA'S PRO-ABORTION AMENDMENT EXPLAINED

## Why Floridians Should Vote NO on Amendment 4

Titled "Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion," Amendment 4 would enshrine **UNREGULATED ABORTION** in our state constitution, making Florida one of the **MOST PRO-ABORTION** states in the nation. The amendment language is **MISLEADING**, and its proposed outcomes are **DANGEROUS**.

#### WHAT IT SAYS

# No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion

before viability

or when necessary to protect the patient's health,

as determined by the patient's healthcare provider.

This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.

#### WHAT IT DOES

#### **PUTS WOMEN AT RISK**

Amendment 4 would jeopardize existing laws and prohibit new ones that voters on both sides of the abortion issue support, including health and safety laws that protect women.

#### ALLOWS SECOND AND THIRD TRIMESTER ABORTIONS

Though not defined in the amendment, "viability" is defined in Florida law as the stage of development when the life of a fetus is sustainable outside the womb (Ch. 390.011(15)), generally accepted to be 22-24 weeks of pregnancy, or about 6 months.

#### CREATES A BROAD "HEALTH" LOOPHOLE

"Patient's health" is not defined in the amendment, allowing post-viability, extremely late-term abortions for treatable, temporary health concerns. Emotional health would justify an abortion when a child could survive outside the womb.

#### WEAKENS MEDICAL DOCTOR REQUIREMENT

"Healthcare providers" – not just physicians – could determine if an abortion is "necessary" to protect the mother's "health." Even some employees of abortion clinics, such as nurses and counselors, could approve late-term abortions.

#### **ELIMINATES PARENTAL CONSENT**

While preserving parental *notification* in our state constitution (Article X, Section 22), the amendment would invalidate the current law that requires parental *consent* for a minor to have an abortion (Ch. 390.01114(5)), making abortion the only medical decision for which parents have no say.
