## **Chaplain's Message**

Dear Brother Knights,

Every Sunday and Holy Day we pray the Nicene Creed. This creed was begun at the Council of Nicaea in 325AD, and then added to at the Councils of Constantinople (381) and Ephesus (431). Nicaea was called by the Emperor to resolve a conflict in the realm. The Bishops gathered and clarified who Jesus was because the teaching of Arius, the priest of Constantinople, while intellectually easy to understand was denying the full divinity of Christ. The Council used a non-biblical, Greek word to describe Christ as being of one substance or homousious of the Father.



Sadly, this Council didn't end the disputes as to how to understand the humanity and divinity of Jesus in one person. Athanasius and Apollinaris taught that Jesus could have unity with God if He didn't have a human soul. Instead, the Logos or Word replaced his soul. The Council of Constantinople in 381 said that could not be so. Jesus won salvation for us by taking on **all** of our humanity. Therefore if He didn't have a soul, that principle that makes a person unique, how could we really be saved body and soul? The Council declared that Jesus had a human and divine soul but that one did not destroy the other.

In the school of Antioch there was a Patriarch called Nestorius who taught that the union of Jesus' divinity and humanity was more like the unity that husbands and wives have with each other. Yet, you and I know that no matter how united husband and wife are they still retain their separate identities and can work against each other. The Church at Ephesus in 431 AD declared that the union of humanity and divinity in Christ had to be more substantial than a moral union. Instead, it declared that whatever you say about Jesus you should be able to say about God and what you say about God you should be able to say about Christ. That being so, since Mary gave birth to Jesus who is God you can rightly call her "Mother of God."

Chalcedon in 451 AD, using the letter or Tome of Pope Leo, declared, "Thus the properties of each nature and substance were preserved entire, and came together to form one person. Humility was assumed by majesty, weakness by strength, mortality by eternity; and to pay the debt that we incurred, an inviolable nature was united to a nature that can suffer. And so, to fulfill the conditions of our healing, the man Jesus Christ, one and the same mediator between God and man, was able to die in respect of the one, unable to die in respect of the other."

Issues that we have in the Church are different today than those of the 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> centuries, but the Holy Spirit has guided our church through rough storms then and I know that He will continue to do so in our time. Jesus guaranteed it.

### Raising Awareness about Life Insurance

Each September since 2003 has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month. Like most awareness-raising campaigns, Life Insurance Awareness Month was created because there is an overwhelming lack of understanding of life insurance, its uses, its benefits, and its variations among the general public. Each year, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) puts out the results from a recent survey, and unfortunately, the numbers they report continue to be discouraging.

A recent survey found that only 59% of Americans own life insurance and about half of those are underinsured. So that means that 70% of the population either has no life insurance or has too little life insurance.

If you fall into this category, please remember that as a member of the Knights of Columbus, you have a full-time, professional agent you can call your own.
