From the Grand Knight



Worthy Brothers and Sisters,

Welcome to the Fraternal Year 2025-2026. I want to express my gratitude to all the returning council officers for their commitment to another fraternal year, and to our newly elected members – Deputy Grand Knight John Pechar and Advocate PGK Mike Marzec. A special thanks goes to PGK Jose Montes as he embarks on his first year as Council Trustee; I truly appreciate him for always being available to take my calls and messages whenever I need assistance to handle Grand Knight stuff. Additionally, I would like to thank PGK, PFN Eddy Merlet for completing his three-year term as Council Trustee and transitioning into his new role as District (30) Deputy. Congratulations, Worthy DD! To say the least, July has been quite hectic: we have had the Council Activities and Budget Planning meeting, the Council Officers meeting, the Parish Round Table, my inaugural Council Meeting, and my first District Grand Knights meeting.

I would like to thank Worthy Financial Secretary Richard Becker, Worthy Treasurer Randy Lascody, Worthy Trustee PGK Dave AmRhein, Worthy DGK John Pechar, and Worthy Trustee PGK Jose Montes for dedicating numerous hours to develop the new activities plan and budget during the Council Activities and Budget Planning meeting. The activities and budget primarily align with last year's plan and budget, which was shared at the officers meeting. We convened the Council Officers meeting on the second Thursday of the month, where the officers evaluated and approved the activities plan and budget.

Alongside DGK John Pechar, Faithful Navigator Rob Light, and Lady Christie Marzec, who represented Ladies Auxiliary President Lady Becky Richard, I participated in the Parish Round Table with Worthy Chaplain and Pastor SK Father John Bosco Maison. We reviewed the council's activities from the last quarter, discussed the activities for July, and presented the 25-26 Council's activities scheduled to take place in the church and on the parish campus. Father John granted us the approval to proceed with this quarter's activities. The primary activities that Father John Bosco endorsed are those related to our founder Blessed Father McGivney: a Membership Drive, Novena, Corporate Communion and his feast day. Membership Drive is set for the weekend of August 9th and 10th, following all the masses. Additionally, we will hold the Blessed Father McGivney Corporate Communion mass on Sunday, August 10th, during the 11:30 Mass. These events will align with the Blessed Fr. McGivney Novena, scheduled from Monday, August 4th, to Tuesday, August 12th, after the morning masses, and will conclude with the morning mass at Ascension to honor his feast day on Wednesday, August 13th.

The Pastor has also approved the Knights to organize the Parish Picnic on Sunday, September 21st. Also present was Worthy Region 3 Administrator, Rob Rasch, who supervises Districts 18-32. He provided valuable insights to the Grand Knights regarding membership, programs, and particularly faith programs. DD meetings are held quarterly. Also, the Florida State Council has reintroduced the Florida State Council Charity Raffle to raise funds for local councils as well as for Florida KofC Charities Inc. Council Notes

- **Round Table** with Father John Bosco on July 15. This was the first roundtable with Father John by our newly elected Grand Knight. The opening ceremony for Flags for Heroes was discussed and Father John asked that we have the opening ceremony on Saturday instead of Sunday since Sunday is such a busy day with the normal Mass schedule. The opening ceremony could be held after 4:30 Mass on Saturday.
- **Membership.** As in years past, we will hold a membership drive during August something very appropriate for the anniversary of the birth of our founder Blessed Fr. Michael McGiveny. The membership drive will be held on August 9 and 10 with Knights available for every Mass that weekend to answer questions from prospective members. We will be soliciting

History of the Fourth Degree - Part I (excerpt from The Knights of Columbus: An Illustrated History, pg. 40, by Andrew T. and Maureen H. Walther, SquareOne, 2020):

The embrace of patriotism was the natural outgrowth of the Knights' foundational conviction that Catholics could be good citizens. Adding the virtue of patriotism to charity, unity, and fraternity as a Fourth Degree had been proposed by Supreme Knight James T. Mullen in the 1880s. The Fourth Degree was formally added under newly elected Supreme Knight Edward L. Hern. On February 22, 1900, nearly 1,100 knights participated in the first exemplification of the Fourth Degree in New York City. Three months later, another 750 members took the degree in Boston.

Any Third Degree Knight in good standing who had been a member of the Order for at least six months was eligible for this optional degree. Fourth Degree Knights earn the title of "Sir" and become members of special groups called assemblies while remaining members of their local councils. The main purpose of the Fourth Degree is to "foster the spirit of patriotism by promoting responsible citizenship and a love of loyalty to the Knights' respective countries..."

Again, a huge shout out and thank you to SK John Pechar, SK Dave AmRhein, SK Phil Mathey and all who participated in the Flags for Heroes program! A resounding success, with a net profit of \$5,542.77 and \$1,385.69 going to the Assembly, next year's event is expected to be even grander from the standpoint that July 4th, 2026, will also be our nation's 250th anniversary. Thank you to the Assembly officers who were able to help with the annual plan of activities and initial annual budget for this fraternal year. The Color Corps, led by SK Eddy Merlet, and all Council and Ladies Auxiliary members who were able to support Jacob Grillo's funeral as well as Father William Hanley of Holy Name of Jesus – you are greatly appreciated! It's support like this to those in need that makes our faith and the Knights of Columbus truly good and great. Also, a big thanks, again, to the Color Corps and all Council and Lady Auxiliary members who were able to support the Independence Day parade in Melbourne – The Knights of Columbus is one of the most visible arms of the Catholic Church ... especially the Color Corps. Coats for Kids 2025



Barnardsville Elementary School

Barnardsville, North Carolina

SK Bobby Sullivan made a presentation at he July Council meeting on the Coats for Kids program for this year. He nominated Barnardsville Elementary School located in Barnardsville, North Carolina to be this year's recipient for our Coats for Kids program - 2025.

On September 27, of 2024 Hurricane Helene devastated North Carolina, primarily in its western Appalachian region, causing at least 107 reported deaths and major destruction of infrastructure and residential areas across several regions.

Forty Three people were killed in Buncombe County alone and nearly all of the county was left without electricity and water. Media reports indicate that more than 560 structures were destroyed and at least 901 structures sustained major damage in Buncombe County, with an additional 8,920 homes/buildings incurring minor or moderate damage.

Barvardsville was one of the hardest hit areas in Buncombe County. Barnardsville has a population of approximately 525 residents.

When I contacted the Buncombe County School District regarding our Coats for Kids program, Barnardsville Elementary School was recommended to be a recipient. The school has approximately 150 students ranging from Kindergarten to Fourth Grade. In this area, the high to low average weather temperature in the fall months is approximately 55 degrees and in the winter months that average falls to approximately 38 degrees.

Our Council will order 4 cases of light winter coats to be delivered to the school children. It is important that we order these coats as soon as possible, as multiple Council's will be doing the same. One year the coat order ended early then expected and we were unable to order the coats through the Knight's of Columbus.

If any Council member wishes to make a donation to support this program, additional coats will be sent to the school as well. Donations should be given as soon as you are able to do so, to our Council's Financial Secretary Richard Becker.



"Go and Do Likewise"

Deacon Chris wanted all of us to reflect on the readings from July 13, the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Deuteronomy 30:10-14 and the Gospel Luke 10:25-37. First Moses talks about the law as something that is not way out there that you can't get to. We all know what needs to be done and we just need to do it. Then in the Gospel we hear Jesus talk about the scholar of law where as in Jewish tradition there are 613 laws they have to figure out. So the scholar asks Jesus which of the laws is more important. Jesus throws it back to him and asks him how does he read the law? The scholar summarizes this by saying to love God and neighbor. But he adds "And who is my neighbor?" Then Jesus gives him the parable of the Good Samaritan. At the end Jesus says "do this and you will live." Basically, you know what needs to be done so just do it. You all have probably heard Father Mike Schmitz speak and maybe have already heard his homily from July 13 — listen to it carefully because it really speaks to us as Knights.





Luke 10:25-37

There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test Jesus and said.

"Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law?

How do you read it?"
He said in reply,

"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." He replied to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live."

But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" lesus replied,

Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses said to the people: "If only you would heed the voice of the LORD, your God, and keep his commandments and statutes that are written in this book of the law, when you return to the LORD, your God, with all your heart and all your soul.

"For this command that I enjoin on you today is not too mysterious and remote for you. It is not up in the sky, that you should say, 'Who will go up in the sky to get it for us and tell us of it, that we may carry it out?' 



Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney Novena


(From Grand Knight Rich Passarella)

At closing of our council meetings, we pray for the canonization of our founder Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney. whose feast day is August 13th. In addition to that prayer, another way to honor him, or to seek his intercession, is to pray a novena.

What is a Novena?

"The word novena is taken from "novem," the Latin word for nine. A novena is made up of nine days of prayer and meditation usually to ask God for special prayer requests or petitions. Novenas are often used to ask specific saints to pray for us.

Novenas are an ancient tradition that goes back to the days of the Apostles. Jesus told His disciples to pray together after His ascension into heaven, so they went to an upper room along with the Blessed Virgin Mary, (Acts 1:14) and joined constantly in prayer for nine days. These nine days of constant prayer by the Apostles at the direction of Jesus led up to Pentecost. This is when the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples as "tongues of fire" (Acts 2:1-4). This pattern of 9 days of prayer is the basis the novenas we pray today."



Why pray a novena to Fr McGivney?

One reason to seek Blessed Michael J. McGivney's intercession is if you are suffering emotionally and financially from the loss of a family member, since his family's sufferings after his father's death had a great impact on him." However, keep in mind that you can pray the Blessed Michael J. McGivney Novena for any intention!

Where to find a novena

This new fraternal year brothers and sisters, let us come together in prayer by praying the Blessed Fr. Michael McGivney Novena starting Monday August 4th to August 12th and then on Tuesday, August 13th attend 7:30am morning mass at Ascension to celebrate his feast day.

You might have seen on this past weekend's bulletin an announcement that in anticipation of Blessed Michael McGivney's Feast Day this August 13th, our Council is planning to pray the Blessed Michael McGivney Novena, starting on Monday August 4th and completing the Novena on Tuesday August 12th. We are inviting all parishioners to join us after the 7:30 AM Mass each day (after the 9AM Mass on Saturday) to pray the novena, and we would like to have as many Council and Ladies Auxiliary members join us during those days.

Pope Leo Meets with Supreme Knight, Supreme Chaplain

Fourth of July audience was K of C leaders' first with new pontiff

As the United States celebrated Independence Day last week, Pope Leo XIV received Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly and Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori of Baltimore in a private audience at the Vatican. The July 4 audience was the first meeting of the U.S.-born pope with the leader of the Knights of Columbus and the chief shepherd of the Archdiocese of Baltimore, which in 1789 became the first diocese in the United States.

During their visit, the supreme knight and supreme chaplain pledged the Order's loyalty to Pope Leo and promised ongoing prayers and support for his pontificate. They also provided the Holy Father with an overview of the Knights of Columbus, highlighting the Order's

Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart. Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The month of August is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (and not adored as the Sacred Heart of Jesus is) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life. Such devotion is an incentive to a similar love and virtue.

This devotion has received new emphasis in this century from the visions given to Lucy Dos Santos, oldest of the visionaries of Fatima, in her convent in Tuy, in Spain, in 1925 and 1926. In the visions Our Lady asked for the practice of the Five First Saturdays to



O Mary Immaculate, inflame our hearts with one ray of the burning love of thy pure heart.

help make amends for the offenses committed against her heart by the blasphemies and ingratitude of men. The practice parallels the devotion of the Nine First Fridays in honor of the Sacred Heart.

On October 31, 1942, Pope Pius XII made a solemn Act of Consecration of the Church and the whole world to the Immaculate Heart. Let us remember this devotion year-round, but particularly through the month of August.
