Wonderful Wednesday. We resumed Wonderful Wednesday on January 10. We had really poor attendance during the fall 2023 dinners so we really needed to increase attendance to make Wonderful Wednesday a viable fundraiser. We got off to a pretty good start on January 10 with 78 diners and on January 17 we had a few less with 71 diners. Not exceptional numbers but enough to make a profit — \$643 for the two dinners. 
Renewal of Obligations








Mass and Rosary for Life

Beginning Well: 7 Spiritual Practices for the First Year of Almost Anything Presented by SK Deacon Chris Meehan

We have entered a new year — 2024. What about New Year's Resolutions? Do you have any? If so, how are you doing with keeping them? But even if you don't have resolutions for 2024, many people still like to have lists — top 10 lists, bottom 10 lists, historical lists, news worthy lists — the top 10 things for 2024 — new beginnings, new expectations, new joy etc. Well there is an author — Joel Stepanek — and he has a book — Beginning Well: 7 Spiritual Practices for the First Year of Almost Anything. (Amazon).

Some thoughts from the Book

All of us can remember something insightful in our lives — first day of school, first car, first girlfriend, first breakup with that girl — everyone has at least one significant memory that really sticks in their mind. The author points out that these things happen other than just firsts — like your first child, well then there is the second child — sure you've already had your first child but this second child still starts a new beginning — a totally different child with a unique personality. New beginnings happen throughout our lives — new job, new home, new location — all new beginnings. Many of these new beginnings are by choice. Job not working out? Maybe a change is in order. Not happy with the town you live in? You can change that. Or even a new major in school. These are all new beginnings we choose. But what about those we do not choose? Events that get thrust upon us be it a death, a breakup or whatever it happens to be. So we have these two new beginnings — some by choice, some not. Regardless of the reason or circumstance, they all give us an opportunity to change — to be transformed — for better or worse. What you do — how you intend to embrace that change — how you let that change affect you; these are all choices you need to make. Beginning



something new can be unsettling — there are a lot of unknowns. A new job, a new location — it can be scary not knowing what to expect, how you are received, how they will evaluate your performance and worthiness. Being unsettled can cause that new beginning to feel like a negative to you. But there are things we can do to make every new beginning a positive one. Usually what is missing is the spiritual experience. How we call upon that spiritual experience during that change can affect everything about it. We need to recognize how God is present in that new beginning. Have God provide for us spiritually, emotionally, and physically. Call on God for the grace we need to make this new beginning successful. Most of us don't do that — we get so caught up in the practical aspects of the transition that we forget the spiritual side. So simplicity allows us to call on God and the Spiritual aspect of any transition. Call on God to be present and don't get wrapped up in all the practical steps.

So how does any of this help me? You may think "I'm not in the middle of any new beginnings" — no new transitions. "I am in the middle stage." But there are still transitions. Retirement, downsizing your home — you can still make a fresh start in the middle of any change. During each change you can ask God for Spiritual help. Here is a scripture that really points out how God can give us the Spiritual guidance we need to make a positive transition:

The Call of Simon the Fisherman (Luke 5:1-11)

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret.

He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets.

Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch."

Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets."

When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing.

They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that they were in danger of sinking.

When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man."

For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him,

and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men."

When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything* and followed him.

In this new year, maybe God is calling you to step into a new beginning. A new ministry, a new job after retirement or some other new volunteer experience. Or even a move to a new city or a change in your health. Whatever it is, Jesus is there during any new beginnings provided that we follow him. And as we follow Him, we acknowledge his command — "Do not be afraid." But we can refuse to accept grace that is given to us — so do not be afraid but take hold of that grace and let it change you. The author also reminds us that "You are infinite." Of all the beginnings experienced during your life you really only had one beginning — when God brought life to you — that was your first beginning of many beginnings. You are infinite — you have no end, you go on forever because your soul is eternal — God desires to bring you back to him for all eternity. The choice to enter into that light is yours. Trust in God — don't look back to what was. But look forward to what God wants to do with you.

'40 CANS FOR LENT'

A component of the Food for Families Program

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat..." - Matthew 25:35

The goal of Food for Families is to ensure that as few as possible go to bed hungry each night. Our Council supports this program in various ways — collecting food at Trunk or Treat and the Parish Picnic, and by having the 40 Cans for Lent program. Last year the 40 Cans for Lent program alone brought in about 6700 cans of food. Our goal this year is 10,000 cans.

How does this work? Simply stated, 40 Cans for Lent is donating one can of food per day during Lent which will be given to our social concerns food bank.
