Worthy Brothers and Sisters,

We have started the year strong with the usual monthly activities, the Council Free Throw Championship chaired by Mike Marzec and Bob Richmond, the American Wheelchair Mission fundraiser weekend, and the support to our Assembly with the Appreciation Dinner for Families of Deployed personnel. One of the administrative tasks that we have to take care of in January is the submission to the Supreme council of a survey of activity for the previous year. After tallying up the amount of volunteer hours and donations, I was amazed at finding out that in all of 2024 the council contributed over 13,000 volunteer hours and directly or indirectly contributed close to \$60,000 to causes related to charity, faith, family, and community.

Just a few days ago, due to the amazing generosity of Ascension parishioners, the American Wheelchair Mission fundraiser resulted in over \$5800 in donations, which is enough to fund about 39 wheelchairs! Thank you also to those who helped man the donation table during that weekend.

February will be busy with the Polar Plunge for Special Olympics chaired by Paul Kuracz. We thank Fr. John Bosco and Fr. Zach for offering to take the plunge for this great cause. Also, in February we will continue planning the 40 Days for Lent Pledges, the Friday Fish Dinners, and the St. Patrick's Day Party. Those events will be in March, but planning will be in February, as well as the start of ticket sales for the St Patrick's Day Party and the signups to help in all those activities. Also our Council will be hosting the Sacred Heart of Jesus Icon from Tuesday February 25th through Monday March 3rd, and we will have a Holy Hour service with the Icon on Tuesday February 25th at 6PM. Then, Saturday March 1st at 4:30 PM we will have our Corporate Communion Mass.

It is an opportunity to share the Eucharist together and it brings forth the principles of unity and fraternity. During this Mass, several liturgical roles are filled by Council and Ladies Auxiliary members. It is also an opportunity for the parish to learn about the Knights of Columbus and the Ladies Auxiliary.

Sacred Heart of Jesus Icon and Holy Hour—Tuesday February 25th, 6:00 PM During

the holy hour, an icon depicting the most famous image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, painted in 1767 by Pompeo Batoni and now venerated in the Church of the Gesù in Rome, will be displayed. This reproduction of the original image bears the blessing of Pope Francis and is one of more than 300 icons traveling across the world as part of the Knights of Columbus Pilgrim Icon Program. Our Council will host the Sacred Heart of Jesus Pilgrim Icon at Ascension on display in the church from February 25th to March 3rd. The Sacred Heart of Jesus Icon will be the centerpiece of a special prayer service on Tuesday, February 25th at 6 PM in the church. The Prayer to the Sacred Heart will be included in the Church bulletin and parishioners are encouraged to pray it during the week. The Icon will also be included in the March 1st 4:30 PM Mass processional.

This company is owned and operated by a brother Knight and has proven to be very reliable in the past. The only downside is that the shirts are more expensive from Bartman but the quality and service is excellent. 

Spiritual Corner from SK Deacon Chris Meehan

The Church has instituted a new day in the church calendar. January 3 will mark the Holy Name of Jesus. The Most Holy Name of Jesus is now an optional memorial day in the church calendar. A day when the church officially honors and recognizes the Holy Name of Jesus. There is now a document in English that can be used and is available from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops — you can download it here).

There are also some interesting Biblical verses that can be read about what is celebrated on this memorial day.



Philippians — Chapter 2: I-II Plea for Unity and Humility

If there is any encouragement in Christ, any solace in love, any participation in the Spirit, any compassion and mercy, complete my joy by being of the same mind, with the same love, united in heart, thinking one thing. Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves, each looking out not for his own interests, but [also] everyone for those of others. Have among yourselves the same attitude that is also yours in Christ Jesus, Who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross. Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

That reading reminds us how important it is for us to never use his name as a swear. Yet many of us, even among the clergy, fall victim to using His name inappropriately and we all need to strive to do

better. We are all good men, good Knights, and we all care who Jesus is. But do we sometimes find ourselves using the name of Jesus as a way of swearing? If so, this is a new year and a great resolution would be to find a way not to use His name inappropriately.


Deacon Chris received this booklet recently and it offers yet another way for us to honor the Holy Name of Jesus.


Acathist Hymn Office of Praise to the Name of Jesus

The Acathist hymn to the Name of Jesus, prayed standing, was first composed in the ninth century. In this presentation in English by Archbishop Raya, he seeks to calm the inner motions of [the] body and free [the] soul to rise and soar and find what [the] heart sighs for. This prayer can be recited in a parish, or individually by those who seek a most intimate relation with the Lord Jesus. The Archbishop introduces the prayer with

instructions for how to pray it.

One final way to honor the name of Jesus is if you hear someone around you use His name as a swear, kindly and gently let the person know that it hurts you to hear His name used that way. If they don't care, at least you tried and then the sin is on them as you made an effort to bring it to their attention. One more thing to do is to say to yourself or out loud— Blessed is the Name of Jesus.


Martyrs of La Florida

We Go to God as Christians

The Story of the Martyrs of La Florida

Did you know that in the American Southeast between the sixteenth and eighteenth centuries, numerous Catholics, both Spanish and Native American, gave up their lives in witness to their faith in Christ? Most likely, this is new and surprising information. For various historical reasons, these martyrs' stories have been largely forgotten. But at the beginning of the twenty-first century, a group of laypeople resumed efforts to gather the history of those we now know as "the Martyrs of La Florida." 


Saint Patrick's Day Party


