Most of the flags turned in for disposal are made from polyester or nylon blends which cannot be incinerated in our outdoor retirement area due to the toxic fumes.

Many attending were impressed with how well organized the scouts were, in the respectful manner they demonstrated during the folding process of the flags to be transferred to Beach Funeral Home. The flag retirement ceremony concluded with the folding of the designated flag and placing it in the fire while taps played followed with the singing of our National Anthem. Chaplain's Message From Father Zach Parker

Father Zach started with a reference to his recent Polar Plunge for Special Olympics. May not be Wisconsin but

Father Zach grew up in Florida so the water was indeed cold — and a great way to enter Lent with fortification. He brought up the trait of most Catholics that we often do things that are hard. As Catholics we need to challenge ourselves — not just accept things as they are. No, as men and brother Knights, we are charged to challenge things around us that are not right — to fight against the evils in the world. We have a duty and responsibility to face those challenges. And the best way to do that is through spiritual warfare. And one of the best weapons we have is charity, Almsgiving and fasting. Not just fasting when it comes to food but in what things we are using and how we are using them — are we using resources in the most efficient way? So we can engage in the world and fight the lies that are told around us - especially those lies that define us by how much stuff we possess. But we must fight against those lies and say that we are not slaves to worldly possessions. So this Lent, engage in this battle in a new way or just by doing an assortment of different things. An opportunity to rekindle our desire to know who we are - beloved sons of the Heavenly Father.

And they went into Caper'naum; and immediately on the sabbath he entered the synagogue and taught. And they were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one who had authority, and not as the scribes. And immediately there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit; and he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God." But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying with a loud voice, came out of him. And they were all amazed, so that they questioned among themselves, saying, "What is this? A new teaching! With authority he commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." And at once his fame spread everywhere throughout all the surrounding region of Galilee. (Mk 1:21-28)

This Gospel was kind of a scary story in terms of those of Faith during the time Jesus was alive having to do with possession by demons — possession was a very serious malady back then. Jesus was approached by a man and Jesus sees

that the only way to cure the man is to show that the demons have gone out of him. Jesus wanted to give the man deliverance and that is what He did. And he did this with the death of 2000 pigs. So that gives one pause to think about that a bit — pigs are a renewable resource — sure that is a lot of pigs and that could be a problem from an economic standpoint but the gestation period for a pig is 3 months, 3 weeks and 3 days.. So from that standpoint, pigs are a fairly renewable resource so Jesus sent the 2000 pigs over the hill to release the demons from the man. We don't really need to dwell on that too much and in the end, Jesus sent the man home rather than allowing him to hang out with Him. So why didn't Jesus want to man to stay with Him after he was cured? The man was a witness — a living walking, talking unanswerable demonstration of what Jesus can do for us — unanswerable proof in this recreated man of the power of God.

So how does that apply to us as Knights? We are not generally possessed by demons — and we certainly don't need to kill 2000 pigs on our behalf. So what is the deal for us? It applies to us for the miracles that we see. We see a miracle every time a child is



born. Miracles every time someone is cured from skin cancer. We can be healed and that in itself is a miracle. Simple things can be miracles. Having to deal with difficult people — each other — our clergy and other people we deal with on a daily basis. And we do that and it too is a miracle showing the power of Christ. You may not think it is a miracle but it is as we are all living, walking, talking witnesses to what Jesus can do for us through the power of prayer. So by what we do and the attitude we communicate with people around us, we are all witnesses of the power of Jesus and what he can do for us.



A History Lesson for Black History Month

February marks Black History month. Deacon Chris wanted to share a story about someone whose lifetime efforts were extremely important to Brevard County even though she never lived here. This person was born in 1918 and died at 101 and her name is Katherine Johnson. She was born in West Virginal — a brilliant woman by any standard. Attended High School at the age of 13 and graduated at the age of 14. She graduated college at the age of 19. She became a brilliant mathematician. But how does this relate to us here in Brevard County?

Her work with NASA beginning in 1953 and over the course of her 33 year career was instrumental to the success of our space program.

An example of just how important Katherine Johnson was to the early space program is provided by astronaut John Glenn and the first orbital mission of Friendship 7 on February 20, 1962. Calculations for the orbit were entered into computers at tracking stations around the world. But these early computers were not something John Glenn wanted to completely rely on for the success of his mission. So John Glenn asked his engineers to



"get the girl Johnson to run the equations by hand." And this is what she used — a Monroe mechanical calculator similar to this to make those calculations. John Glenn added that "if she says they are good, than I am ready to go.."

Assembly Supreme Award SK Rich Passarella — Civic Award





A component of the Food for Families Program

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat..." - Matthew 25:35

The goal of Food for Families is to ensure that as few as possible go to bed hungry each night. Our Council supports this program in various ways – collecting food at Trunk or Treat and the Parish Picnic, and by having the 40 Cans for Lent program. Last year the 40 Cans for Lent program alone brought in about 6700 cans of food. Our goal this year is 10,000 cans.

How does this work? Simply stated, 40 Cans for Lent is donating one can of food per day during Lent which will be given to our social concerns food bank. The sooner we get the word out the more pledges we should get. Ask your friends, your small Christian Community group members, your CRHP friends, etc. to participate. My wife Susan and I pledge to give one can each, per day, during Lent for a total of 80 cans of food for the poor. Please help to get the word out!

For every \$500 or 1,000 pounds of food donated, the Supreme Council will refund \$100 back to the council – up to a maximum of \$500 per council per fraternal year.
