



Tuesday evening on February 25 at 6PM, Ascension observed a special Holy Hour centered around The Icon of Sacred Heart. The Sacred Heart Holy Hour included readings from Sacred Scripture and reflections on the Sacred Heart of Jesus, prayers to the Sacred Heart, and time for silent prayer and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. About 60 Knights, Ladies Auxiliary and parishioners attended. The music and songs in the program were led by Director Doug Duca with Ascension's Gregorian schola was amazing.

The holy hour, flowing from the jubilee for the 350th anniversary of the apparitions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (Dec. 27, 2023 – Jun. 27, 2025) and inspired by Pope Francis' encyclical letter Dilexit Nos (He Loved Us). An icon depicting the most famous image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, painted in 1767 by Pompeo Batoni and now venerated in the Church of the Gesù in Rome, was on displayed. This reproduction of the original image bears the blessing of Pope Francis and is one of more than 300 icons traveling across the world as part of the Knights of Columbus Pilgrim Icon Program. *(From SK Rich Passarella)*











Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus Presentation by SK Deacon Chris Meehan

Introduction

Soon we will receive the icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to host in our parish. Some of you are probably not familiar with this tradition in the Church so I am pleased to present to you now some information that should encourage you to avail yourselves of this opportunity to worship Jesus.

What is the Sacred Heart devotion? [1]

"it will be well to remember the meaning and use of the word heart in current language." "The word heart awakens, first of all, the idea of a material heart ... this heart of flesh is currently accepted as the emblem of the emotion and moral life ... as also the use of the same word to designate those things symbolized by the heart. Note, for instance, the expressions 'to open one's heart', 'to give one's heart' ... and, by a perfectly natural figure of speech, we use the word heart to designate a person."



"Devotion to the Heart of Jesus alone, as to a noble part of His Divine Body, would not be devotion to the Sacred Heart as understood and approved by the Church ... in the devotion, there are two elements: a sensible element, the Heart of flesh, and a spiritual element, that which this Heart of flesh recalls and represents.

"Consequently, devotion to the Sacred Heart may be defined as devotion to the adorable Heart of Jesus Christ in so far as this Heart represents and recalls His love; or, what amounts to the same thing, devotion to the love of Jesus Christ in so far as this love is recalled and symbolically represented to us by His Heart of flesh.

"Hence the devotion is based entirely upon the symbolism of the heart. It is this symbolism that imparts to its meaning and its unity, and this symbolism is admirably completed by the representation of the Heart as wounded.

"The heart is, above all, the emblem of love, and by this characteristic, the devotion to the Sacred Heart is naturally defined.

"On the other hand, the devotion to the Sacred Heart, being directed to the living Heart of Jesus, thus becomes familiar with the whole inner life of the Master, with all His virtues and sentiments, finally, with Jesus infinitely loving and lovable. Hence, a first extension of the devotion is from the loving Heart to the intimate knowledge of Jesus, to His sentiments and virtues, to His whole emotional and moral life; from the loving Heart to all the manifestations of Its love.

"In thus devoting oneself to Jesus all loving and lovable, one cannot fail to observe that His love is rejected.

"This love is everywhere manifest in Jesus and in His life, and it alone can explain Him together with His words and His acts.

Why is it special?

What is truly amazing about this devotion is that through it we realize that God Himself, Creator of the universe, infinitely wise and powerful, has opened up His Heart to us! This is the very basis of devotion to the Sacred Heart. While we were still sinners, still rebelling against God's plan for our lives, He took on human nature through the incarnation of the Eternal Word in Jesus Christ and He revealed His Heart, the very centre of His Divine Person, the very core of His identity. This means that God wants to be known by us. He wants to enter into relationship with us. Devotion to the Sacred Heart then, is devotion to the very essence of God, to the deepest core of His divine nature. Devotion to the Sacred Heart is simply devotion to God as He has chosen to reveal himself to us.

Why practice this devotion ?

Quote from Pope BenedictXVI

On the 50th anniversary of Pope Pius XII's encyclical Haurietis Aquas on devotion to the Sacred Heart, Pope Benedict wrote, "This devotion (to the Sacred Heart) is "the contemplation of the 'side pierced by the spear,' in which shines the limitless will of salvation on the part of God." For this reason, "it cannot be considered as a passing form of worship or devotion. Adoration of the love of God, which has found in the symbol of the 'pierced heart' its historical-devotional expression, continues to be vital for a living relationship with God" [4]. The Divine Mercy devotion has become an extension of this devotion.

Special graces and indulgences are available to those who properly and faithfully carry out devotion.

How we can continue to practice it.

One popular devotion is the First Friday Devotion, where Catholics receive Holy Communion on the first Friday of nine consecutive months, as Jesus requested to St. Margaret Mary. This practice makes reparations for the sins committed against the Heart of Christ and enables us to grow closer to him. Jesus promised St. Margaret Mary that he will grant twelve special and powerful graces to the devout soul who completes the nine first Fridays.

The Twelve Promises of the Sacred Heart

- I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
- I will give peace in their families.
- I will console them in all their troubles.
- I will be their refuge in life and especially in death.
- I will abundantly bless all their undertakings.
- Sinners shall find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- Tepid souls shall become fervent.
- Fervent souls shall rise speedily to great perfection.
- I will bless those places wherein the image of My Sacred Heart shall be exposed and venerated.
- I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.
- Persons who propagate this devotion shall have their names eternally written in my Heart.

Prayer to the Sacred Heart

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, living and quickening source of eternal life, infinite treasure of the Divinity, and burning furnace of divine love, You are my refuge and my sanctuary. O my amiable Savior, consume my heart with that burning fire with which Your Heart is ever inflamed; pour down on my soul those graces which flow from Your love; and let my heart be so united with Yours that our wills may be one, and that mine may be entirely conformed to Yours. May Your divine will be equally the standard and rule of all my desires and of all my actions. Amen.



 In the excess of the mercy of my Heart, I promise you that my all powerful love will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and my Heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour.



Pope Leo XIII approved the following indulgences for the devotion:

- For performing the devotion publicly or privately, seven years and seven quarantines (the remission of temporal punishment equivalent to what would be granted for forty days of penance) each day;
- If the devotion is practiced daily in private, or if a person assists at least ten times at a public function, a
 plenary indulgence (remission of all temporal punishment for sins) on any day in June or between July 1-8
 (Decree urbis et orbis, May 30, 1992);
- The indulgence *toties quoties* (for the souls in Purgatory) on the thirtieth of June or the last Sunday of June (January 28, 1908) in those churches where the month of June is celebrated solemnly. Pius X (August 8, 1906) urged a daily sermon, or at least for eight days in the form of a mission (January 26, 1908);
- To those priests who preach the sermons at the solemn functions in June in honor of the Sacred Heart, and to the rectors of the churches where these ceremonies are held, the privilege of the Gregorian Altar on June 30 (Pius X, August 8, 1906).
- A plenary indulgence for each communion in June, and to those who promote the solemn celebration of the month of June ("Acta Pontificia", IV, 388, August 8, 1906)

One can pray a Novena to the Sacred Heart. EWTN and Catholic Answers both offer novena prayers.

One can start simply by coming to morning Mass on the First Friday of the month; we pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart at the end of 7:30AM Mass. Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is celebrated on the Friday (27 June 2025) following the Solemnity of Corpus Christi.

Or just regularly pray to the Sacred Heart. Prayer to the Sacred Heart can be prayed anytime but especially during adoration time in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

Prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

O most holy heart of Jesus, fountain of every blessing, I adore you, I love you, and with lively sorrow for my sins I offer you this poor heart of mine. Make me humble, patient, pure and wholly obedient to your will. Grant, Good Jesus, that I may live in you and for you. Protect me in the midst of danger. Comfort me in my afflictions. Give me health of body, assistance in my temporal needs, your blessing on all that I do, and the grace of a holy death. Amen.






