Exiled by Sin

For centuries, Almighty God sent prophets to warn the Chosen People to stop sinning and return to His Covenant. The Chosen People neglected the prophets' warnings, continued to sin against Almighty God, and suffered the consequences.

The people "practiced all the abominations of the nations and polluted the Lord's temple," choosing to live outside God's covenant.

Almighty God permitted the Babylonians to invaded Israel, destroyed the Temple, and the Israelites were exiled to Babylon. Demonstrating that the consequences of living a sinful life

is chaos, exile, death and destruction. Yet in spite of their sins, God did not forget His people.

After 70 years of exile, God rose up King Cyrus who defeated the Babylonians and allowed those exiled to return to the Promised Land.

Over 50,000 returned to the Promise Land. But about 80,000 chose not to return and stayed in Babylon, rejecting God's mercy.

Why?

Some probably did not want to have the hardships of reclaiming their old land, rebuilding Jerusalem, and rebuilding the Temple. Our Lord came into our world that everyone who believes in Him might not perish, but might
