
Our Lord and the Holy Mass

St. John in His Gospel quotes Our Lord 17 times speaking about His Hour, so it is important.

When Our Lord speaks of His hour, it has two dimensions. One rooted in the historical life of Christ and another in liturgical life of the Church. The historic hour dimension is easy to understand.

The hour is the time when Christ passes through the agonies of betrayal and bodily torment, finally mounting the Cross out of love for the Father and as a sacrifice for our salvation. This hour is His exaltation that becomes the source of everlasting life in the world. It is this hour for which He was born.

The liturgical hour comes from our Lord's public life and passion. At the wedding feast, Our Lord tells His Mother Mary that "My hour has not come." Our Lord is hinting that when His hour comes, He will provide an abundance of the finest wine. This underscores the Holy Mass where believers all over the world gather to worship Christ as He pours Himself into the Eucharistic Cup under the visible sign of wine. Our Lord tells the Samaritan woman at the well, "That the hour is coming when true worshipers will worship the



Finally, Christ's hour will bring in a harvest of believers from every nation, because Jesus, like a grain of wheat that dies and is buried, enables Israel and every nation to sprout into new life.

The blessing comes not only through Christ's death, but by his risen and glorified humanity, which is the wheat that becomes for us the bread of life in the Holy Eucharist.

These two dimensions of the hour are part of the one Paschal Mystery of Christ. We see in the Gospel of St. John the "hour" of Our Lord that unfolds during his public life also unfolds throughout the centuries and throughout the world as Catholics commemorate the sacred mysteries of this "hour" in the sacramental liturgy of the New Covenant, the Holy Mass. Only the Catholic Church provides the proper liturgy that was given to us by Our Lord. None of the other 40,000 Christian denominations have this wonderful gift, although Our Lord gave it to everyone. Every time we attend Holy Mass, Our Lord's ' hour has come," where the holy and divine liturgy will make present His suffering, death and resurrection, and feed us with His Holy Body and Blood. How blessed we are to be Catholics!
